## **AMENITY / WATER / SANITATION BILLS**

 Multi-Modal Path Striping- The residential Village Community Development Districts have recently addressed striping on the multi-modal paths.

To date, the following guidance has been provided to Staff from each respective District:

- o VCDD No. 1- No Striping (will address areas of concern)
- VCDD No. 2- No Striping (will address areas of concern)
- VCDD No. 3- No Striping (will address areas of concern)
- o VCDD No. 4- Center line, yellow skip striping

The Project Wide Advisory Committee (PWAC), comprised of a Board Member from Districts 5-10, discussed striping on the multi-modal paths and indicated that they were not interested in striping the paths maintained by Project Wide, but would address geographical challenges and concerns with striping or roadway pavement markers (RPMs). However, individual Districts addressed the issue with the following guidance to Staff:

- o VCDD No. 5- No Striping (will address areas of concern)
- VCDD No. 6- The Board requested consideration of side striping be discussed at the next PWAC meeting.
- VCDD No. 7- On agenda for February 20, 2015 meeting. The Board requested Staff provide information for the distance and cost to stripe the multi-modal paths.
- VCDD No. 10- No Striping (will address areas of concern)
- Information from Sumter County Sheriff's Office Several residents attending Welcome
  Wednesday requested an update on common scams pertaining to credit cards and ATM
  machines. The Sumter County Sheriff's Office gave an update and provided the following
  information:

#### Credit card scanners


Credit card scanners can be installed on ATM machines, gas station pumps, and even hand held scanners are available.

Most of the time credit card scanners are located on the outside of the machines. Criminals will not be able to get into them to install the equipment.

However, most of the gas pumps are equipped with common type of locks and they could be easily be manipulated. Most of the time the scanners are installed on the inside of the gas pump and cannot be detected by the consumer. Most of the gas stations today place a security tape across the access door on the pump. The security tape is visible and can be easily seen be the consumer. It is not recommend that anyone use a gas pump that does not have this security feature. If the consumer notices the tape is broken please go inside the station and report your findings. If a scanner is located law enforcement should be contacted.


There are hand held scanners available that have the ability to scan your credit card while it is in your wallet. There are ways to prevent this from happening. Stacking your credit cards together lining up the RFID chips will help prevent pocket scanners to obtaining your information. Another way to protect your credit card information is with a RFID protective sleeve. These are available in stores and on the internet.
