


Double notification will be used for all signs placed on 4 lane roads in accordance with MUTCD and FL Index 600.


Driveway (NE 42 Blvd) will be accessible, or resident will be notified if it needs to be blocked off on CR 466 end.


Sign placement will ensure driver visibility from all intersections at all times.





The Villages created Paradise Park to provide its residents with additional green space and park area to enjoy. The Villages' Amenity Authority Committee, Community Development District Board, resident lifestyle volunteer groups and residents all worked together on the park's design and construction.

The new Paradise Park offers many amenities for The Villages' residents and their guests. They can enjoy strolling or jogging among the large live oak trees as they travel along a rubberized walking trail that surrounds and cuts through the park. Along the way, people intent on staying in shape can take advantage of one of the nine outdoor fitness stations for additional exercising opportunities. Those in the mood for a game of chess or checkers can sit on a stone bench as they take on a challenger at one of the park's concrete game boards. Residents' canine companions were not been forgotten during planning for the park. They can now play in the newly renovated dog park shaded by the large live oaks.

Project funding came from The Villages Recreation Amenity Capital Fund.

The Villages built the Soaring Eagle Softball Complex & Air Gun Range as part of its community master plan. The Villages, The Village Community Development District, the Recreation Department, resident lifestyle volunteer groups and residents all collaborated on its design and construction. The lifestyle volunteer groups and resident focus groups provided design, programming and equipment suggestions for

The new softball complex offers two fields, picnic benches, bleachers, electronic scoreboards and a scoring tower equipped with WiFi for the scorekeepers. Bulletin boards provide information about upcoming events and help residents keep track of recreation and neighborhood league play schedules and team standings.

The air gun range has five stations for residents and their guest to enjoy target practice. They can assemble their air gun rifles at a convenient counter, wait their turn on one of the benches under the shaded structure or check the bulletin boards for information about upcoming events and shooting times during the week.

In response to residents' desire for more recreational space, The Villages' Community Development District Board and Amenity Authority Committee allowed the creation of a new center that would better serve them. Resident lifestyle volunteer groups, residents, the Recreation Department staff and district staff all collaborated with them on the design of the new project.

Contractors demolished the old center and built a new, larger one in its place. The layout of the Tierra Del Sol Recreation Center gives residents more programming opportunities. It offers additional meeting rooms, a card room, a kitchen and a lobby area where residents and quests can gather to talk and enjoy the center's amenities. Outside they can play games of bocce, shuffleboard, tennis and horseshoes or share a picnic lunch in the pavilion.

Safety Reminders for the Holidays

Community Watch will be working around the clock throughout the holidays. We will be at full staffing levels in all phases of our operation: patrol, gate attendants, dispatch and gate ops.

A couple of safety reminders:

- If you will be away for the holidays, CW offers a house check program for your consideration. For a small fee, a CW patrol driver will walk the perimeter of your home 3 times per week. If something appears unusual, we will contact you, your neighbor, or law enforcement if necessary. At the very least, have a neighbor keep an eye on your home while you are away.
- Indoor lights on timers are a great way to give the impression that someone is home.
- Cancel paper deliveries or have your neighbor pick up your papers from the driveway.
- Track the delivery of your packages to be delivered to your home. Do not leave your packages sitting on your front doorstep for very long.

If you are having guests for the holidays that may be unfamiliar with The Villages, let them know that they can get assistance in the form of "word maps directions," from any of the 21 manned gates. The attendants at the manned gates also have word map directions to neighborhoods behind unmanned gates. Please help us create a safe and happy environment for everyone this holiday season!
