

Obey all traffic laws.
If no sidewalks are
present, walk against
the direction
of traffic so you can
see oncoming vehicles.

Always use the crosswalk.
Push the button to get the walk signal.

Be visible. Wear bright, reflective colors on your clothes, shoes, belts and wristbands.



Avoid distractions while driving. Focus on the road.

Pass bicyclists safely.
Allow at least three feet between your vehicle and the bicyclist.

Slow down! Speed is the cause of 32% of all fatal crashes.



Always wear a helmet.
Ride in the same
direction of traffic on
the street. Obey all
traffic signs, signals,
and lane markings.

Yield to traffic when appropriate. It's better to yield than "be in the right" and risk injury.

Be visible. Position yourself in the lane so others can easily see you. Always use a headlight and taillight at night.

Schwartz Park Renovation


The renovations to Schwartz Park are scheduled to begin on January 18, 2016. These renovations include:

- ⇒ Installation of new landscaping, lighting and irrigation
- **⇒** Utility service upgrades


Please use caution in this area and stay out of all construction areas. This project is anticipated to be complete in March 2016.

Happy New Year and welcome to the 2016 golf season! We are very excited about the course playing conditions and can not wait to see all of you out on the courses for the start of 2016. December yet again, brought some great playing conditions and warm weather to your executive golf courses and many of your friends and family were able to experience what you play on consistently throughout the year.

During the month of January we will be ending the course closure schedule and opening all courses for normal play to accommodate as many golfers as possible and to increase everyone's chance to play on one of these courses.

It is very important that all of you help our maintenance crews by using proper golf etiquette and practicing good golf as there are no course closures this month. The smallest of things make a huge impact for everyone's enjoyment.

Please help by repairing ball marks, raking bunkers, keeping reasonable accommodation passes 15 feet from greens and tee surfaces, filling divots and playing from the tees that commensurate with your ability. These small things impact everyone and this will help ensure quality conditions on your courses and make our courses more enjoyable!

Frost delays have not been implemented so far this past year in any great numbers and we are thankful for this. Please be aware, however when we do have frost delays on courses this is strictly to protect the plants from desiccation and permanent damage.

Remaining off the playing surface is extremely important. Please be patient and wait for your starters to give the all clear before proceeding onto any turf surfaces.

Frost Delay and turf-

This is caused by micro climates at leaf level falling around 32 degrees.

These cold temperatures are enough to cause cell walls in plant tissue to become brittle and break. This kills the leaf by disturbing the natural flow of nutrients and photosynthesis process.

Frost Delays are used to stop traffic from breaking plant leaves until thawing can occur.

What to bring

- Automotive fluids
- Automotive batteries
- Cleaners
- Fertilizers
- Fluorescent lamps and Mercury containing devices
- Fungicides
- Wood preservatives
- Herbicides
- Household batteries rechargeable
- Household electronics (TVs, VCRs, computers, etc.)
- Latex & oil based paints
- Paint removers
- Paint thinners
- Pesticides
- Pool chemicals
- Smoke detectors
- Solvents
- Propane tanks (25lbs)





What not to bring

- Biological/Infectious waste
- Explosives
- Radioactive waste
- Empty paint cans

HOW TO PACKAGE AND TRANSPORT CHEMICALS

- (1) Do NOT mix chemicals together.
- (2) Keep products in original labeled containers if possible.
- Place containers into cardboard boxes to prevent breakage.
- (4) Place leaky container in clear plastic bag and transport in box with newspaper.
- (5) Put boxes in trunk or in back of vehicle away from passengers.
