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Are you prepared for a hurricane... ASK YOURSELF:

- ✓ Is your family prepared to be on its own for 3 days or more?
- ✓ Do you have enough food, water and other critical supplies for your entire family to last at least 3 days? A case of bottled water (24 16.9oz bottles) is just over 3 gallons of water. Enough for 1 person for 3 days!
- ✓ Do any or your family members have medical or other Special Needs?
- ✓ Do you have a plan for your pets?

IS YOUR FAMILY READY?

The first step toward protecting your family is to make sure you have a Family Disaster Plan.

Creating your own plan is simple and it only takes a few minutes. Just visit www.FloridaDisaster.org and click "Get a Family Plan." Completing the plan is as easy as doing an Internet search or downloading music. And having a plan for your family will help ensure their safety and comfort before, during and after a storm.

Once at www.FloridaDisaster.org, you will be asked to provide information about your home, your family, and pets. Using this information, the website will create a personalized Family Disaster Plan that you can print and save for future emergencies.

Included in your plan will be:

- ✓ Recommended amounts of food and water based on the size of your family...
- ✓ Checklists of important steps to take before, during, and after a disaster.

Your Family Disaster Plan will also include detailed instructions on creating a disaster supply kit for your family.

This kit should include:

- ✓ At least 3 days' worth of drinking water and non-perishable food for your entire family.
- ✓ At least 3 days' worth of batteries for flashlights and radios.
- ✓ At least 3 days' worth of vital prescription drugs.
- ✓ At least 3 days'worth of diapers and essential baby supplies if you have small children.
- An outdoor grill and fuel.
- ✓ A generator with fuel. DO NOT USE generator in garage or on porch. You can die!

Don't have Internet access at home? You can still get a plan.

Visit your local library and ask for assistance logging onto www.FloridaDisaster.org. You can create and print your plan from the library's public computer. You may also use the computer labs in the Savannah Center and Paradise Recreation Center.

Did You Know??



To ensure adequate capacity of the storm water management system throughout the community, the District will be lowering certain water retention areas that are above recommended levels. The water level is being lowered to ensure there is sufficient capacity in the water retention area to capture water run-off from streets, yards and golf courses in preparation of future rain events.

Beginning today, June 28th, the District will be lowering the level of the water retention area located behind Freedom Pointe, along Morse Boulevard (Basin 14-1). This will be accomplished by irrigating the Duke Power Corridor area inside the De La Vista Golf Course. Please be advised that water being utilized though the irrigation system is storm-water resulting from rain events.

If Tuesday is your normal collection day, you will have collection on Wednesday, July 5th. Yard waste will be collected on Saturday, July 1st. Please place your bags out no later than 6:00 a.m.

If your sanitation collection is serviced by Waste Management in the Village of Fenney, you will not have sanitation collection service on Tuesday, July 4, 2017. Just a Reminder

Due to the lack of rain fall, Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD), the state water management agency for our area, declared a Phase III Water Shortage effective June 5, 2017. The declaration includes all of The Villages in Marion County, Sumter County, and District 11 (Villages of Fruitland Park) in Lake County along with numerous other counties in SWFWMD.

Under the new water shortage order, lawn watering is reduced to once-per-week and allowable watering hours are reduced to before 8 am or after 6 pm. Irrigation schedule information can be found in the Fact Sheet on the following page. Microirrigation and hand watering of non-lawn areas are still allowed any day, if needed. The restrictions will remain in effect through at least August 1, 2017. Additional details regarding the watering of new lawns and plants, reclaimed water and other water uses can be found at WaterMatters.org/restrictions.

SWFWMD considerers both natural water resource conditions and the viability of public supply when deciding to declare a water shortage order. For the past 20 years, SWFWMD has worked diligently with its partners to develop alternative water supplies. Even though the region is experiencing drought conditions, there is adequate public water supply available.

The approved rate structures for the Village Center Service Area (VCSA), Little Sumter Service Area (LSSA), the North Sumter County Utility Dependent District (NSCUDD), Sumter Water Conservation Authority (SWCA), and Fenney Water Conservation Authority (FWCA) include an Environmental Protection Rate Surcharge in the event a water shortage is declared by SWFWMD. In accordance with the rate structure, a 10% surcharge will be added to water usage beginning June 5, 2017 as a result of SWFWMD's declaration of a Phase III Water Shortage. The incorporation of these rates promotes water conservation in the event of a water shortage, and they were also critical during the development and approval of the rate schedules and water use permits with SWFWMD.





FACT SHEET SWFWMD MODIFIED PHASE 3 WATER SHORTAGE ORDER

The Southwest Florida Water Management District's Governing Board issued a Modified Phase III Water Shortage Order scheduled to begin on June 5, 2017. The order restricts residential and commercial irrigation of lawns and landscaping to one-day-per-week along with other restrictions described herein.

Residential and general commercial customers in The Villages do not receive reclaimed water. Non-potable irrigation water is not exempt from the restrictions, therefore the restrictions are applicable to The Villages in:

- Sumter County, Districts 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 12
- Marion County, District 4
- Lake County, District 11

The following is a summary of the restrictions.

- Residential and commercial lawn and landscape irrigation may only occur before 8 a.m. or after 6 p.m. on the designated once-per-week watering schedule.
- Handwatering or microirrigation of plants (other than lawns) can be done any day at any time, if needed.
- Certain exemptions are available, such as allowances for new plant material. Refer to www.watermatters.oro/restrictions.
- Car washing is limited to once per week on the designated watering days as shown below.
- Commercial car washes may operate on any day.
- Fountains and other aesthetic-only water features may only operate 8 hours per day.
- Pressure washing is allowed once per year and for necessary purposes, such as prior to painting or sealing, to address a health or safety hazard, or to comply with health laws. Aesthetic concerns do not constitute a "necessary" purpose.

Addresses with "house numbers"	May only irrigate on
Ending in 0 or 1	Monday
Ending in 2 or 3	Tuesday
Ending in 4 or 5	Wednesday
Ending in 6 or 7	Thursday
Ending in 8 or 9	Friday

All commercial and residential customers must modify their irrigation timer to only irrigate once per week in accordance with the above table.

Deed restrictions and community standards enforcement must suspend any requirement to replace lawns, pressure wash, or engage in other activity which increases water use during this water shortage declaration.
