### **Storm Water Management**

To ensure adequate capacity of the storm water management system throughout the community, the District will be lowering certain water retention areas that are above recommended levels. The water level is being lowered to ensure there is sufficient capacity in the water retention area to capture water run-off from streets, yards and golf courses in preparation of future rain events. To lower the water level in water retention basins, irrigation systems will run along common areas and roadways throughout the community. # 2017 MILL AND OVERLAY SCHEDULE Updated 7/31/17

The District Property Management Department is coordinating with Rainey Construction to mill and overlay several roadway areas.

The District will deliver notices to each home that will be impacted by the work approximately 7-10 days in advance, in addition to placing informational signs at the entry and exit of each villa which will include the anticipated start and end date of the project.

The timeline may be adjusted due to unforeseen circumstances, including weather. If the timeline is adjusted, the informational signs at the villa entry and exits will be updated.

Please use caution and follow all flagman directions and signage. Newly paved roadways will take approximately one hour to cure and should NOT be driven on while hot.

The District thanks you in advance for your cooperation to ensure this is a successful project, and encourages you to adhere to the instructions that you will receive in the future.

# **Updates Provided By...**



In our efforts to keep your playing surfaces sustainable and healthy, our Executive golf contractors use a myriad of tools and methods. One of the best and most common methods in the golf industry is the use of simple cart directional signage, rope and stakes to control traffic and reduce wear.

Our Executive courses experience a tremendous amount of daily play. The posted signage, ropes and stakes are recognizable by golfers and are set as an industry standard. Adhering to these markings can assist in controlling compaction, allow areas to heal naturally, protect new grass installation, allow wet areas to dry and protect golfers from unforeseen issues

As new grass is installed during the summer renovation period, please adhere to all of these markings and keep cart traffic out of areas that are roped off. Access points will be located throughout the area for golfers to enter and exit from. Please refrain from short cutting or crossing the ropes by stepping over a particular section. You may pull out rope stakes if they interfere with your shot and reset after you complete the shot. This protects all courses from the possibility of additional damage or added repair costs. Office of Management and Budget

The Districts will be adopting their FY17-18 Final Budgets and maintenance assessments rates at their September Board meetings. Florida State Statutes require that a Final Budget and Final Maintenance Assessments be approved no later than September 15<sup>th</sup> of each year.

The notification letters and newspaper ads, as required by Florida State Statutes, to notify property owners of first-time levy of bond/maintenance assessments or proposed increases over prior approved assessment rates has been completed for the following Districts:

**District 1:** Proposed 10% increase in maintenance assessments.

**District 4:** Phillips Villa unit ONLY— new levy of bond and maintenance

assessments.

Soulliere Villa unit ONLY-new levy of bond assessment.

**District 9:** Clifford Villa unit ONLY- new levy of bond and maintenance

assessments.

**District 12:** New levy of bond and maintenance assessments.

**District 1** - In order to maintain the existing level of service and ensure the long-term integrity of the infrastructure necessary for the sustainability of its District, the District 1 Board is proposing a 10% increase to the maintenance assessment rates. This is an estimated average of \$20.87 annual increase for villa owners and an average of \$35.56 annual increase to other unit owners. The current District 1 maintenance assessment rates are actually <u>LOWER</u> than the rates that were paid in FY2001-02.

During the September Board meetings, the District Board of Supervisors will conduct public hearings to accept public input and then adopt the Final FY17-18 Budget and maintenance assessment rates. The public hearing will take place during the District Board meetings as listed on the following page:

### **Phase III Water Shortage Order Extended**

On July 25, 2017, The Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD), the state water management agency for our area, extended the Phase III Water Shortage order for the Northern Region, which includes The Villages until October 1, 2017. The Environmental Protection Rate Surcharge as outlined in the water and sewer rates of 10% for water use only will remain in effect for the duration of the water shortage order.

Please keep in mind that this continues to restrict residential and commercial irrigation of lawns and landscaping to one day per week following the schedule printed below before 8:00 AM or after 6:00 PM.

SWFWMD considers both natural water resource conditions and the viability of public supply when deciding to declare a water shortage order. For the past 20 years SWFWMD has worked diligently with its partners to develop alternative water supplies. Even though the region is experiencing drought conditions, there is adequate public water supply available.
