Preventative maintenance is occurring on the potable water system field valves throughout many areas of The Villages. Those customers serviced by Village Center Service Area (VCSA), Little Sumter Service Area (LSSA) and North Sumter Utilities (NSU) that will be impacted will be notified 24 hours in advance of a temporary interruption in service and will receive the following notification:

THE PUBLIC DRINKING WATER MAINS IN YOUR AREA WILL BE SHUT DOWN TEMPORARILY FOR NEEDED MAINTENANCE

AS A PRECAUTION, UPON RETURN OF WATER SERVICE, WE ADVISE THAT ALL WATER USED FOR **DRINKING, MAKING ICE, AND COOKING BE BOILED, FOR ALL OTHER HOUSE HOLD USES THE WATER IS ACCEPTABLE**. A ROLLING BOIL OF ONE MINUTE IS SUFFICIENT. AS AN ALTERNATIVE, BOTTLED WATER MAY BE USED.

THIS "PRECAUTIONARY BOIL WATER NOTICE" WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL THE MAINTENANCE TASK HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND A BACTERIOLOGICAL SURVEY SHOWS THAT THE WATER IS SAFE TO DRINK.

Smoke Alarms recalled due to Manufacturer defect





Two models of smoke alarms manufactured by Kiddie are being recalled due to a manufacturing defect which could render them ineffective.

The affected model numbers are P12010 and P19010.

The alarms in question are manufactured by Kiddie and sold under the name Kiddie Dual Sensor (Photoelectric and Ionization Smoke Alarms).

The alarms are being recalled because a yellow cap left on during the manufacturing process could cover one of the alarms sensors, rendering it unable to detect smoke. The company estimates about 452,000 alarms in the U.S. are affected. Consumers who have one of the alarms can go to https://kiddie-smok-alarm-recallusen.expertinquiry.com/ to obtain a replacement.





What to bring

- · Automotive fluids
- Automotive batteries
- Cleaners
 - Fertilizers
 - Fluorescent lamps and Mercury containing devices
 - Fungicides
 - Wood preservatives
 - Herbicides
 - Rechargeable household batteries
 - Household electronics (TVs, VCRs, computers, etc.)
 - · Latex & oil based paints
 - Paint removers
 - Paint thinners
 - Pesticides
 - · Pool chemicals
 - Solvents
 - Smoke detectors
 - Propane tanks (25lbs)





What not to bring

- Biological/Infectious waste
- Explosives
- Radioactive waste
- Empty paint cans

HOW TO PACKAGE AND TRANSPORT CHEMICALS

- (1) Do NOT mix chemicals together.
- (2) Keep products in original labeled containers if possible.
- Place containers into cardboard boxes to prevent breakage.
- (4) Place leaky container in clear plastic bag and transport in box with newspaper.
- (5) Put boxes in trunk or in back of vehicle away from passengers.
