The Sterling Heights Recreation Center will be closed for quarterly cleaning on June 16th.


#### ⇒ Moyer Recreation Center

A portion of Aloha Way between Owen Drive and Teakwood Lane is currently closed. This portion of the roadway is inaccessible as water is pumped out of Lake Paradise and into the retention area on the Hilltop Golf Course. From the retention pond, the water will be used to irrigate the Hilltop, Orange Blossom Gardens and Silver Lake Golf Courses. All homes will still be accessible while this project is completed. #### **Roadway Maintenance**

Legacy Lane, west of Buena Vista Boulevard is scheduled for mill and overlay June 11th through June 16th.



During daylight hours the roadway will be reduced to one lane only, going one way from Buena Vista Boulevard to Calumet Avenue. For your safety, please use caution and pay attention to all directional signage and flagmen.

## Executive Golf Trail

June starts the official summer season kickoff. The last week of May and first week of June have brought our summer afternoon showers earlier than expected. For the month of June, we are hoping to see these showers continue and aid us with our cultural program of aeration. These mechanical processes, along with warmer weather, help us complete our transition from fall over seed to summer Bermuda grass faster.

To help kick off the summer transition, we are very excited to continue our bi-weekly course closures. In addition, we added an additional 3 day aeration rotation twice each summer to each of the Executive Golf Courses. This plan will carry us forward throughout the summer and will be ending in the first week of September.

We expect these closures to bring some much needed relief to the courses by reducing pressure from playing traffic. It also provides the maintenance contractors an unprecedented opportunity to perform maintenance needs that are sometimes restricted due to large amounts of play.

#### **June 2018 Turf Talk**



#### TURF TIP:

#### Mechanical Aeration

This is a mechanical method of removing cores of compacted soil from heavily trafficked compressed areas of your playing surfaces. This is completed at various times of the year to aid in root system development and promote good grass health. A quality top dressing material such as sand is then filled into holes for a new growth medium for roots to spread and develop. This also allows for a smoother putting surface to play from until healed.



#### **Tree Removal and Shrubs**

Did you know that prior to planting or removal of any trees or other shrubs in a home unit, you need architectural approval? The deed restrictions and the District's adopted Rule states: "Permission must be secured prior to the planting or removal of any trees or other shrubs which may affect the rights of adjacent property owners. No tree with a trunk of four (4) inches in diameter should be removed or effectively removed through excessive injury without first obtaining permission."

If there is a canopy tree on your property that you would like to have removed, you would need to submit an Architectural Review Application. Once staff receives your request, the application is forwarded to the District's certified arborist who will examine the tree and provide a report for the Architectural Review Committee (ARC). The ARC will review the documentation and their decision will be determined on a case by case basis. Generally, a tree that matures at over 30 feet and is not a palm or conifer is considered a canopy tree. Per the District's arborist, a few of the most common canopy trees would be a Live Oak, Southern Magnolia, Little Magnolia, Drake Elm, and Winged Elm. For any other tree, architectural approval is still required; however, it does not have to be examined by the arborist.

#### What to do at a Four-Way Stop Sign / Inoperable Traffic Light

- A four-way stop is any intersection with a stop sign in each direction, a flashing red light in each direction, or an inoperable traffic light. <u>Traffic lights that are not working should be treated as a four-way stop sign.</u>
- Four-way stops are usually (but not always) labeled as such, having a rectangular sign below the octagonal shape which reads something to the effect of, "4-Way Stop," "Four-Way Stop," or "All-Way Stop."
- Each driver arriving at a four-way stop must first come to a stop, then one driver proceeds at a time.
- If turning, as you approach a four-way stop, use your turn signal about one hundred feet prior to reaching the stop sign. The four-way stop is one of the most crucial places for using your turn signal compared to almost any other driving situation.
- Four-way stops always operate in a clockwise direction. So, the car furthest to the right always has the right of way, and then cars take their turns in a clockwise direction.
- If multiple cars approach a four-way stop at about the same time, the driver who comes to a complete stop first proceeds first.
- If two or more cars arrive at a four-way stop simultaneously, the driver furthest to the right always proceeds first, and each next driver in the clockwise direction follows.
- If four cars arrive at a four-way stop simultaneously, drivers going straight should proceed first. If all four are turning right, they may all proceed simultaneously. These aside, there is no distinguishable way to see who should go first, so the intersection is at a standstill until one driver gets up the nerve and begins to inch forward, alerting the other drivers of his or her intentions, and proceeds through the intersection (thus starting the clockwise rotation from that driver).

If two cars opposite each other are proceeding straight, both turning right, or one

proceeding straight with the other turning right, they may go at the same time. The turn then goes to the adjacent cars at the stop, who may follow the same rule if applicable.

Follow these tips to avoid adding further miscommunication to the situation.

- <u>Pedestrians always have the right of way.</u> Please do not run anyone over simply because you think it's your turn to go; it may very well be your turn to go, but if a pedestrian is in a crosswalk that interferes with your desired path, do not go.
- You must always stop at a four-way stop.
- Some drivers will ignore all the rules of the four-way stop and mistakenly assume that they have the right of way. Even if it is your legal turn to proceed forward, always do so with caution, being wary of impatient drivers who may be too hasty to wait another ten seconds for you to clear the intersection.
- If any emergency vehicle is approaching from any direction, pull over. Emergency vehicles always get the right of way.

Remember, some distracted drivers will be using a cell phone or texting, so be careful and observant.
