#### **Weather Policy**

For the safety and well-being of participants, staff, volunteers and/or condition of the facility the Recreation & Parks Department abides by the following weather policy.

**Inclement Weather** – Recreation & Parks Dept. recommends patrons at outdoor areas find shelter and wait at least 30 minutes or longer as deemed necessary by Public Safety or National Weather Service Advisory prior to resuming normal activities.

**Temperature** – Recreation & Parks sponsored activities will be cancelled or postponed under the following conditions:

- Outside temperature has index of 104 degrees or higher
- Outside temperature of 35 degrees or lower.

#### **Information Provided by...**



Preventative maintenance is occurring on the potable water system field valves throughout many areas of The Villages. Those customers serviced by Village Center Service Area (VCSA), Little Sumter Service Area (LSSA) and North Sumter Utilities (NSU) that will be impacted will be notified 24 hours in advance of a temporary interruption in service and will receive the following notification:

THE PUBLIC DRINKING WATER MAINS IN YOUR AREA WILL BE SHUT DOWN TEMPORARILY FOR NEEDED MAINTENANCE.

AS A PRECAUTION, UPON RETURN OF WATER SERVICE, WE ADVISE THAT ALL WATER USED FOR **DRINKING, MAKING ICE, AND COOKING BE BOILED, FOR ALL OTHER HOUSE HOLD USES THE WATER IS ACCEPTABLE**. A ROLLING BOIL OF ONE MINUTE IS SUFFICIENT. AS AN ALTERNATIVE, BOTTLED WATER MAY BE USED.

THIS "PRECAUTIONARY BOIL WATER NOTICE" WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL THE MAINTENANCE TASK HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND A BACTERIOLOGICAL SURVEY SHOWS THAT THE WATER IS SAFE TO DRINK. IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS, YOU MAY CONTACT DEANNA SIMMONS, FROM THE WATER DEPARTMENT AT (352) 259-2802 (NSU WWTP).

### Community Development Districts Office of Management and Budget

The Districts will be adopting their FY18-19 Final Budgets and maintenance assessments rates at their September Board meetings. Florida State Statutes require that a Final Budget and Final Maintenance Assessments be approved no later than September 15<sup>th</sup> of each year.

As we have communicated over the last several months, a few Districts have approved proposed increases to their FY18-19 maintenance assessment rates.

After spending hours reviewing and discussing budgets during their May Budget Workshops, three Districts (2, 3, and 4) have requested increases to their maintenance assessment rates in order to maintain the existing level of service and ensure the long-term integrity of the infrastructure necessary for the sustainability of their Districts.

As required by the Florida State Statutes, a notice to homeowners in Districts 2, 3, and 4 were mailed on August 17, 2018 to notify them of the proposed increase and the date/time of the public hearing when the rate increase will be discussed and adopted. On the same date, a large ad was published in the Daily Sun as required. The notice to homeowners consists of a letter that is personalized for each unit/lot that includes the required legal verbiage, purpose of the increase, the current rate, the proposed rate, and proposed annual increase amounts, along with a Frequently Asked Questions information page. This increase <u>DOES NOT</u> pertain to your monthly amenity fees that are billed on your utility bill. The maintenance assessments are paid only once a year on your annual tax bill.

**District 2** is proposing a 12% increase which averages out to a \$19.52 <u>annual</u> increase for villa owners, a \$145.14 annual increase for Harmeswood unit owners and a \$35.90 annual increase for other unit owners. This is only the second time the Board of Supervisors has increased the maintenance assessment in six years. After considering the expenses associated with future road projects, Hurricane Irma expenses, current and possibly future price increases in contracts along with decreasing funding balances the Board Supervisors made the difficult decision to propose a maintenance assessment increase.

### The Villages

### Community Development Districts Office of Management and Budget

**District 3** is proposing a 15% increase, only the second increase in five years, which averages to a \$29.28 <u>annual</u> increase for villa owners, a \$168.04 annual increase for Sunbury Place unit owners and a \$50.01 annual increase for other unit owners. The Board took this step after reviewing the expenses associated with future road projects, Hurricane Irma expenses, current and possibly future price increases in contracts along with decreasing funding balances.

**District 4** is proposing a 20% increase, their first increase since FY15-16, which averages to a \$58.42 <u>annual</u> increase for villa owners and a \$94.89 annual increase for other units. In accordance with Marion County's development requirements when the District was built, District 4 (and any other new development in Marion County) was required to be responsible for the maintenance of their collector, residential and villa roads where the other Districts are responsible for only their villa roads. The increase is due in part to future road projects such as mill and overlay and rejuvenator application, Hurricane Irma expenses, depression repairs, current and possibly future price increases in contracts along with decreasing funding balances.

In addition, homeowners in Soulliere Villas will have a new maintenance assessment of \$392.92 as this is the first year.

**District 12 Phase I** has two units, Unit 7F and Tupelo, which will have an increase in their assessment rate due to additional acreage in the final plat of the specific units.

During the September Board meetings, the District Board of Supervisors will conduct public hearings to accept public input and then adopt the Final FY18-19 Budget and maintenance assessment rates. In order to meet State Statutes, some of the Board meetings are being held on a different day then their regular meeting day. The public hearing followed by adoption of the final FY18-19 Budget and maintenance assessment rates will take place at the board meetings as listed on the next page:

#### What to bring

- Automotive fluids
- Automotive batteries
- Cleaners
  - Fertilizers
  - Fluorescent lamps and Mercury containing devices
  - Fungicides
  - Wood preservatives
  - Herbicides
  - · Rechargeable household batteries
  - Household electronics (TVs, VCRs, computers, etc.)
  - Latex & oil based paints
  - Paint removers
  - Paint thinners
  - Pesticides
  - · Pool chemicals
  - Solvents
  - Smoke detectors
  - Propane tanks (25lbs)





#### What not to bring

- · Biological/Infectious waste
- Explosives
- Radioactive waste

#### HOW TO PACKAGE AND TRANSPORT CHEMICALS

- Place containers into cardboard boxes to prevent breakage.
