
The Moyer Recreation Center Family Pool will be closed for cleaning on October 3rd.

The annual landscape beds through the community are changed on a quarterly basis. Due to the duration of above average temperatures, some annual plants such as the Coleus have not lasted as long as they normally would.

Annual bed change outs are scheduled to take place in the next 2-4 weeks. When you see landscape workers in the area, please use caution and pay attention to all warning signs and safety cones.

Water Retention Areas – Lake Inversions

It is not abnormal this time of year to experience "Lake Inversions" in the Florida aquatic systems throughout the state. These inversions occur when warm water sits on top of colder, denser water. If the water on the surface cools, the density becomes greater than that of the deeper water and the inversion takes place. There are over 100 to 150 occurrences reported annually to the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

The water retention areas within The Villages Community are not immune to this type of natural occurring experience. Such occurrences happen throughout the year and are mainly based on weather patterns, water temperatures, oxygen levels, fish susceptibility and depth of basins.

Drive Safely Work Week

The Network of Employers for Traffic Safety (NETS) designated October 1-5 as their annual Drive Safely Work Week[™]. They are focusing on Parking and Backing basics this year. According to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS) parking lot incidents account for 20% of all reported vehicle crashes and many go unreported. Parking lot crashes are one of the most commonly occurring types of incidents for fleets and this is true for the vehicles of The Village Center Community Development District (VCCDD). Please take a moment to review the following suggestions from NETS on safe parking.

Tips for safe parking:

- <u>Back in, not out</u>. Where legal and where parking spaces are not angled, fleet safety experts agree it is safest to back into or pull through a parking space so your vehicle is facing out when it's time to exit.
- <u>Get the full picture</u>. Having your mirrors properly adjusted for the best possible view is important for all driving maneuvers, but it is particularly so for safely backing into a parking space.
- <u>Get it straight</u>. Once you've backed in, before exiting the vehicle, turn the wheel to straighten your tires so they are ready for you to drive out safely.
- <u>Embrace the walk</u>. Pull-through spaces are more common in the outer areas of a parking lot. When possible and practical, take advantage of the ease of parking in a pull-through spot and walk the extra distance. Not only will your body benefit from the bonus physical activity, you'll be less likely to get a door ding.
- <u>Exit with caution</u>—when exiting from a parking space, go slowly and be aware of pedestrians and other vehicles. Moving slowly will also give others more time to see you.

If you MUST back out:

- Check vehicle perimeter as you approach, make your exit promptly and cautiously as conditions may change.
- Some fleet programs recommend tapping the horn twice before backing to alert others of your intention.

Pedestrians in Parking lots:

Remember, the moment you exit your vehicle, you become a pedestrian-keep your head up and alert to your surroundings.

Architectural Review Committee

As the volume of applications processed by the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) continues to increase, staff requested both the primary and alternate ARC members provide suggestions and feedback as to any suggested improvement to the existing ARC meetings to assist the work flow and enhance customer service.

Staff received suggestions and feedback from 15 ARC members and they were extremely helpful. The suggestions and feedback were utilized to enact a meaningful change in the way applications are processed and reviewed.

- Over the next few months, some of the improvements you can expect include: **Architectural Review Application** – an updated application that includes a checklist of required items to ensure residents understand what information is needed.
 - **Educational Materials** Helpful guidelines on filling out applications, Frequently Asked Questions and examples of supplemental materials (site plan, landscape plan, elevation drawings, etc.) are just some of the new materials you can expect to see on <u>www.DistrictGov.org</u> over the next few months.
 - **Enhanced Training** Enhanced training will be offered to both committee members and staff to supplement existing training programs. Training regarding application completion and new application checklist. This is ongoing.
 - **Architectural Review Manual** Staff is reviewing and researching what revisions could be made in the Architectural Review Manual to eliminate certain minor modifications.



Obey all traffic laws. If no sidewalks are present, walk against the direction

the direction of traffic so you can see oncoming vehicles. Avoid distractions while driving. Focus on the road. de la companya de la


Always wear a helmet. Ride in the same direction of traffic on the street. Obey all traffic signs, signals, and lane markings.

Always use the crosswalk. Push the button to get the walk signal. Pass bicyclists safely. Allow at least three feet between your vehicle and the bicyclist.

Be visible. Wear bright, reflective clothing and safety accessories. Slow down! Speed is the cause of 32% of all fatal crashes. Yield to traffic when appropriate. It's better to yield than "be in the right" and risk injury.


Be visible. Position yourself in the lane so others can easily see you. Always use a headlight and taillight at night.

Remember:

To avoid conflict, do not use the right-hand lane to make a left turn through the roundabout.



Approaching Roundabouts

- Reduce your speed and prepare to YIELD to all traffic in the roundabout.
- Guide signs provide guidance for approach street locations, not lane use orientation.

Choose your lane:

Approaching a two lane roundabout, make a lane choice according to the following rules:

- If you intend to exit the roundabout more than halfway around, use the LEFT-HAND lane.
- If you intend to exit the roundabout less than halfway around, use the RIGHT-HAND lane.
- If you intend to continue straight through, use either lane unless signs or markings indicate otherwise.

Navigating Roundabouts

- Move up to the entrance line and wait for a gap in traffic. DO NOT ENTER next to a vehicle in the roundabout, as that vehicle may be exiting at the next exit.
- Within the roundabout, do not stop except to avoid a collision; you have the right-of-way over entering traffic. Keep moving in a counterclockwise direction.
- Do not change lanes in a roundabout.
- A striped channelization island is present in several roundabouts, which reduces the circulatory roadway to one lane approaching a single-lane exit.



Best Practices:

PRODUCED BY

- Do not change lanes within the roundabout or as you exit
- Do not overtake other vehicles or bicyclists within the roundabout
- · Be aware of other vehicles in the roundabout
- Follow pavement striping and arrows for guidance exit roundabouts with caution
- YIELD to emergency vehicles before or after the roundabout – DO NOT STOP in the roundabout
- Give oversized vehicles extra room because they may need both lanes to manuever
- · Indicate your exit using your right-turn signal

A Guide to Navigating Roundabouts in Sumter County, Florida




What is a Roundabout?

A roundabout is a circular intersection where vehicles yield at entry to traffic already within the circulatory roadway and all vehicles flow in a counter-clockwise direction around a central island.


Driving Roundabouts



Turning Right

- 1. APPROACHING: Be in the right-hand lane unless otherwise marked on the roadway, and use a right-turn signal.

- CIRCULATING: Keep to the right-hand (outside) lane of the roundabout and continue to use your right-turn signal through your exit. Do not change lanes.
- 3. EXITING: Stay in the right-hand lane as you exit the roundabout.



Going Straight Ahead




 APPROACHING: You can be in either lane, unless otherwise marked on roadway or posted.

2. CIRCULATING: Stay to the inside of the circulatory roadway if you entered from the left-hand approach lane, or stay to the outside if you entered from the right-hand approach lane. Do not change lanes.

- 3. When you have passed the last exit before the one you want, use your right-turn signal and continue to use it through your exit.
- EXITING: As you exit the roundabout, be aware of vehicles traveling on the outside of the circulatory roadway that may continue to circulate around the roundabout.





Turning Left or Making a U-Turn



 APPROACHING: Be in the left-hand lane unless otherwise marked on the roadway, and use a left-turn signal.



- CIRCULATING: Stay in the left-hand lane of the circulatory roadway until you are ready to exit.
- When you have passed the last exit before the one you want, use your right-turn signal and continue to use it through your exit. Do not change lanes.
- 4. EXITING: As you exit the roundabout, be aware of vehicles traveling on the outside of the circulatory roadway that may continue to circulate around the roundabout.
