⇒ Rohan Recreation Center Shuffleboard Courts


The Rohan Recreation Center Shuffleboard Courts will be closed for resurfacing January 29th through February 12th.

Preventative maintenance is occurring on the potable water system field valves throughout many areas of The Villages. THIS "PRECAUTIONARY BOIL WATER NOTICE" WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL THE MAINTENANCE TASK HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND A BACTERIOLOGICAL SURVEY SHOWS THAT THE WATER IS SAFE TO DRINK.

Gate Operations: ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Utilizes telephone or speaker phone to answer all incoming calls.
- Assists residents and guests with directions.
- Instructs drivers on proper use of gate cards.
- Remotely operates gates via computer or phone as directed by supervisors, drivers and gate repair technicians as needed.
- Remotely opens un-staffed gates for residents and visitors.
- Remotely provides security for the RV lots using a computer database to verify and validate requests for entry.
- Utilizes 2-way radio when assisting drivers and/or supervisors.
- Utilizes a computer to manipulate camera views as needed.

HOW TO PACKAGE AND TRANSPORT CHEMICALS

- (1) Do NOT mix chemicals together.
- (2) Keep products in original labeled containers if possible.
- Place containers into cardboard boxes to prevent breakage.
- (4) Place leaky container in clear plastic bag and transport in box with newspaper.
- (5) Put boxes in trunk or in back of vehicle away from passengers.
