The contractor will do everything possible to minimize your inconvenience. For the SAFETY of our crews and all residents, we ask that you reschedule any work or deliveries to your Villa until the paving is complete as they may be denied access. Only residents and emergency vehicles will have immediate access during the construction.

PLEASE DO NOT run your irrigation, wash your vehicle or empty your pool during the week as it will make the work take longer.

ALL vehicles and trailers must be parked OFF of the roads and overflow parking areas as this will impede the work. If you know anyone that parks in the overflow area, please remind them to move their vehicle.

Please be advised that newly paved roadways will take approximately one hour to cure and should not be driven on while hot! Driving before this time could result in tracking asphalt onto your driveway and damaging the new roadway.

If you must travel through the construction, PLEASE drive slowly and watch for and listen to directions provided by the contract workers.

Our goal is to give you a new road that will last a maximum life with the LEAST amount of inconvenience. Your cooperation is GREATLY APPRECIATED. Current Course Condition Update:

Executive Golf Maintenance is receiving several inquiries regarding Executive courses and their conditioning issues pertaining to over seeding compared to not over seeding.

For the best interest of the health, sustainability and longevity of the Executive golf Courses, it was determined to not over seed any of the courses.

This agronomical plan was thoroughly vetted and researched through both studies conducted on courses last year and also through various research studies conducted by universities, the United States Golf Association (USGA), Golf Course Superintendents Association of America (GCSAA) and other water management experts.

With an increasing number of residents playing golf throughout the year, extreme fluctuations in weather patterns and the tremendous difficulties with transition in previous years, over seeding is not in the best overall interest of the courses.

Research found that the courses not over seeded for a second year and that experienced closures every year due to transition recovery had no prolonged or planned closure concerns this year. In fact, the greens not over seeded last year that were closed due to transition issues in previous years are now having some of the best playing conditions we have experienced. Other benefits include less closures, better playing conditions and long term sustainability. When looking at cost, several cost factors such as the cost of over seed, pigmentation, soil amendments, contractor labor and specialty fertilizer are considered.

We recently received feedback on some of the green complexes such as Bogart, Mangrove, Pelican, Heron and Sweetgum. Please rest assured that the greens will recover and will appear smoother without the over seed competition. In some cases they will not have to be closed as long (if at all) prior to summer and outside our normal closure schedule.

Preventative maintenance is occurring on the potable water system field valves throughout many areas of The Villages. Those customers serviced by Village Center Service Area (VCSA), Little Sumter Service Area (LSSA) and North Sumter Utilities (NSU) that will be impacted will be notified 24 hours in advance of a temporary interruption in service and will receive the following notification:

THE PUBLIC DRINKING WATER MAINS IN YOUR AREA WILL BE SHUT DOWN TEMPORARILY FOR NEEDED MAINTENANCE.

AS A PRECAUTION, UPON RETURN OF WATER SERVICE, WE ADVISE THAT ALL WATER USED FOR **DRINKING**, **MAKING ICE**, **AND COOKING BE BOILED, FOR ALL OTHER HOUSE HOLD USES THE WATER IS ACCEPTABLE**. A ROLLING BOIL OF ONE MINUTE IS SUFFICIENT. AS AN ALTERNATIVE, BOTTLED WATER MAY BE USED.

THIS "PRECAUTIONARY BOIL WATER NOTICE" WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL THE MAINTENANCE TASK HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND A BACTERIOLOGICAL SURVEY SHOWS THAT THE WATER IS SAFE TO DRINK.

Responsibilities:

The committee is responsible for making recommendations on safety practices and procedures to management through various functions, including:

- Reviewing and updating workplace safety rules
- Updating workplace safety programs
- Evaluating employee accident and illness prevention programs
- Providing safety training and monitoring of workplace safety education and training

Safety Committee Continued

District policies updates will be recommended by reviewing accident investigations, inspection findings, employee reports of unsafe conditions or work practices, anonymous complaints, and suggestions from employees.

The program will provide recommendations by evaluating employee accident and injury records, establishing trends and patterns, and formulating corrective measures to prevent recurrence.

Committee members participate in safety training and monitor workplace safety education and training to ensure that the program guidelines are being followed and pertinent information is being documented.

Meetings:

Safety committee meetings will be held, at least, every other month. The next scheduled meeting will be May 14th in the District Offices.




Did You Know??

The following information represents response data for the past year for The Villages Fire Rescue Department. This information provides the percentage of incidents that are required by the national fire reporting system.



Shown for the last year, The Villages Fire Rescue responded to a total of 25,451 incidents throughout the district. Of this total, Emergency Medical Calls were over 57.06%. This was followed by Service Calls at 32.57%. Service Calls denote incidents such as changing smoke detector batteries, removing cat's or wildlife from storm drains and lift assistance. The Department of Fire Rescue provides this data each month to District Manager Richard Baier, Board Members, and the State of Florida, as well as the national data base.
