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Types of Pools

- **Sports Pools (7:00am-Dusk)**

- For residents only 30 years of age and older. These pools have a specific schedule of activities: lap swim, water walk, water exercise programs, water volleyball etc. Be sure to check the sport pool activity schedule before you go. Schedules are available in the Recreation News. If you are interested in starting a water exercise program please call 674-1800.

- **Neighborhood (Adult) Pools (7:30am-Dusk)**

- For residents and their guests 30 years of age and older
- Intended for refreshing socialization & non-organized/scheduled activities. Regularly scheduled water exercise groups are encouraged to use the sports pools for this purpose.

- **Family Pools (7:30am-Dusk)**

- For residents who have young family members visiting under the age of 30. Noodles, unbreakable masks, goggles & small buckets are the only items allowed in these pools.

All pools are heated during the cooler months. We strive for water temperatures between 81-84 degrees. Temperatures will fluctuate depending on the weather.

The *ins* and *outs* of AERATION



Aeration: An essential practice that improves the long-term health and playability of golf courses

Size, Spacing & Depth

Tine Size
0.25- to 0.50-inch diameter typical for greens, can be up to 0.875-inch diameter

Tine Spacing
Usually 1-by-1-inch, 1-by-2-inch or 2-by-2-inch spacing

Depth
0.5-10 inches deep

Hollow Tines
Extract soil and remove thatch

Solid Tines
Penetrate ground, remove nothing

Healthy Putting Greens

Aeration:

- Improves water infiltration (internal drainage)
- Oxygenates the soil
- Removes thatch (*core aeration only)
- Encourages root growth
- Stimulates microbial activity (soil health)
- Alleviates compaction
- Facilitates root zone improvement
- Promotes recovery from stress

Ideal Timing

- Creeping bentgrass and annual bluegrass (Poa annua): Spring, late summer, early fall (April-May and August-September)
- Warm-season turfgrass (e.g., bermudagrass): Summer (June to August)

A single aeration event typically affects less than 10 percent of the putting surface.

Did You Know?

MAY IS NATIONAL ELECTRICAL SAFETY MONTH (PART 2) –

Each May the Electrical Safety Foundation International (ESFI) commemorates National Electrical Safety Month to raise awareness and educate organizations on critical electrical safety topics.

EHS Today reported in 2015 that, “Workplace electrical incidents result in another nearly 300 deaths and more than 3,500 injuries every year. Although not the leading cause of workplace fatalities, electrical incidents are disproportionately fatal. For every 13 electrical injuries, a worker dies.”

National Electrical Safety Month is a good time to remind public entities to check their electrical safety awareness efforts in the workplace. Addressing electrical safety can save lives, reduce injuries and cut economic loss. By taking simple precautions, everyone can avoid electrically related fires, fatalities, injuries and property loss by following some simple safety tips as follows:

- Never touch downed power lines.
- Always call your local utility or 911 if you see downed power lines.
- Watch for overhead power lines every time you use a ladder, work on roofs or trim trees.
- Know what’s below before you dig. At least two full business days before starting any excavation, call Sunshine811 to have the underground power lines, piping and telecommunication cables located and marked appropriately.

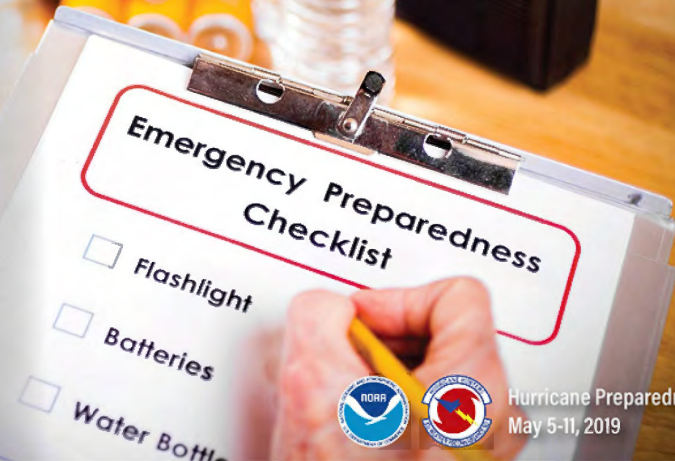

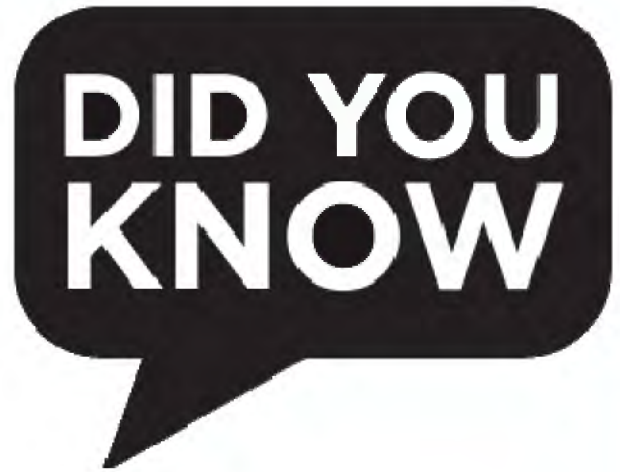

Sanitation & Recycling Information



....External Deed Restriction Standards **prohibit** household waste or recycling to be placed at the end of your driveway before 5:00 pm on the day preceding your scheduled collection.

....that bags must be placed for collection before 6:00 am on the day of your scheduled collection.

....that household waste should be placed in sealed white or black standard 20-30 gallon trash bags, and must not weigh over 40 pounds.

....that recyclables must be placed in a clear plastic bag and not weigh over 40 pounds.

....that if you reside South of SR 44 all of your waste (including household and recyclables) are co-mingled together and transported to the Covanta Energy from Waste Plant. Household waste is turned into electricity, which powers homes locally.

SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING MATERIALS GUIDELINES

Single Stream refers to a system that takes two recycling “streams” – mixed paper and acceptable containers – and puts them together. No sorting needed! ALL your recyclable items MUST be in a clear plastic bag. This increases the ease and convenience of recycling so more people participate and more resources are saved.

RECYCLING MATERIALS ACCEPTED

Plastic/Glass Bottles & Containers – Plastic and glass containers should be recycled according to shape. Any plastic or glass container that has a neck smaller than the base is acceptable. Remove all lids, tops and caps.

Paper and Cardboard – Newspapers, magazines, catalogs, office paper, junk mail, telephone books and brown paper bags are all acceptable. Flatten all cardboard.

Food and Beverage Cans – Clean aluminum food and beverage containers.

Food & Beverage Cartons – Juice boxes, milk, soup, broth, cream and egg substitute cartons are acceptable. **NO juice pouches, straws or plastic utensils.**

ALWAYS PLACE YOUR RECYCLABLE MATERIALS IN CLEAR BAGS.



RECYCLING MATERIALS NOT ACCEPTED

Clamshell Packaging (*packaging typically found in the produce section containing berries*)

Glass Cookware/Bakeware *including microwave trays*

Loose Plastic Shopping Bags

Paper Cups & Plates *with plastic or waxed coating*

Mirrors

Windows or Auto Glass

Light Bulbs

Ceramics & Porcelain Tile

Peanut Packing

Garden Hoses

Household Items *such as dishes, drinking glasses, cooking pots or small appliances*

Bubble Wrap

Polystyrene – *a.k.a. “Styrofoam”*

Shredded paper – *this should be placed in your regular household garbage*

HOUSEHOLD WASTE

Garbage should not be in cans, but instead put in **white or black** plastic bags at the end of your driveway. Bags should be placed at the end of your driveway, at the edge of the street. Bags must be placed for collection before 6:00 a.m. on your collection day or the night before (no sooner than 9:00 p.m.). All garbage should be placed in sealed, standard 20-30 gallon trash bags, each bag weighing no more than 40 pounds. Refrain from leaving trash out on undesignated collection days. Wrap broken glass or other sharp objects in newspaper and try to place them where they cannot cause injury.

MATERIALS NOT ACCEPTED

DO NOT PLACE HYPODERMIC NEEDLES, PAINT, OIL, LAWN OR POOL CHEMICALS, MOTOR OIL, OR TIRES IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE.

HOMEOWNER YARD WASTE

Wednesday Pick Up Only
Tree limbs or branches may not exceed 4’ in length, 4” in diameter, or exceed 40 pounds. Bundle and tie such materials and place them at the end of your driveway. Lawn clippings and similar yard waste should be placed in biodegradable bags.

ENERGY FROM WASTE

All waste is transported to the Covanta Energy From Waste Plant. Household waste is turned into electricity, which powers homes locally. Sanitation services are provided by cleaner and quieter collection vehicles powered by Compressed National Gas engines. Our collection vehicles provide minimal noise and cleaner emissions enhance and protect our environment. By having more efficient services it reduces carbon footprint, reduces wear and tear on roads, less fuel is used, and minimizes traffic in your quiet neighborhood.

For those Villages residents residing South of State Road 44, sanitation services are provided by Covanta by Tri-County Sanitation.

HOUSEHOLD WASTE & RECYCLING

All household waste and recyclable materials should be placed in a sealed 20-30 gallon trash bag. All materials can be placed in the same bag! Each bag should weigh no more than forty (40) pounds. Bags should be placed at the end of your driveway, at the edge of the street. Bags must be placed for collection before 6:00 a.m. on your collection day or the night before (no sooner than 9:00 p.m.). All collection takes place on Tuesday and Friday each week, excluding holidays. For a listing of holidays, please visit www.DistrictGov.org.

HOMEOWNER YARD WASTE

Tree limbs and yard waste will be collected the same days as normal household trash and recycle collection. Yard waste should be bundled, tied and placed at the end of your driveway. Tree limbs and branches may not exceed four (4) feet in length. Lawn clippings and similar yard waste should be placed in bags.

The following **WILL NOT** be accepted:
Dirt, Rocks, Sod, Concrete, Contractor Waste

MATERIALS NOT ACCEPTED

DO NOT PLACE HYPODERMIC NEEDLES, PAINT, OIL, LAWN OR POOL CHEMICALS, MOTOR OIL, OR TIRES IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE.

Preventative maintenance is occurring on the potable water system field valves throughout many areas of The Villages. Those customers serviced by Village Center Service Area (VCSA), Little Sumter Service Area (LSSA) and North Sumter Utilities (NSU) that will be impacted will be notified 24 hours in advance of a temporary interruption in service and will receive the following notification:

THE PUBLIC DRINKING WATER MAINS IN YOUR AREA WILL BE SHUT DOWN TEMPORARILY FOR NEEDED MAINTENANCE.

*AS A PRECAUTION, UPON RETURN OF WATER SERVICE, WE ADVISE THAT ALL WATER USED FOR **DRINKING, MAKING ICE, AND COOKING BE BOILED, FOR ALL OTHER HOUSE HOLD USES THE WATER IS ACCEPTABLE.** A ROLLING BOIL OF ONE MINUTE IS SUFFICIENT. AS AN ALTERNATIVE, BOTTLED WATER MAY BE USED.*
