Fishing Information

Florida is conducive to year-round fishing which makes The Villages a perfect community to offer ample fishing opportunities for those who wish to wet a hook and line. To ensure your fishing experience is enjoyable, it is important to know the rules and regulations for fishing these water bodies. The Village Community Development Districts and the State's Water Management Districts oversee and manage many of the water bodies located throughout The Villages community. These water bodies serve several purposes for the community and also provide anglers fishable areas for their recreational enjoyment. Age Requirements

Visiting children, with valid Guest ID Cards, must be 13 years of age and accompanied by an adult, at all times, to use the air gun, archery, billiards, croquet, lawn bowling and dog park facilities. Valid guests must be 19 years of age to use the Fitness Clubs.

Smoke & Vape Free Zone Policy

The Smoke & Vape Free Zone policy establishes a Smoke & Vape Free Zone that prohibits smoking within a minimum of 25 feet from any entrance to recreation center buildings. Smoking refers to the use of traditional tobacco products. Vaping refers to the use of electronic nicotine delivery systems or electronic smoking devices. These are commonly called e-cigarettes, e-pipes, e-hookahs and e-cigars. *Smoking will be permitted only in designated areas where ash cans are located.

District Field Ops Facility for District Property Management, Community Watch and South Sumter Utilities located at 4890 Morse Boulevard:


The masonry portions of the complex are complete and the roof framing system is underway. The interior framing has begun.

Did You Know??

The Villages Community Development Districts Community Standards

Did you know that the Declaration of Restrictions prohibits lawn ornaments in many units? Lawn ornaments or yard art generally refers to man-made items located anywhere outside the home. Pots and planters designed and constructed for plant use are permitted, as long as they are used for their intended purpose. The inclusion or attachment of flowers or plants to a man-made ornament, not originally constructed for plant use, does not change the item from a lawn ornament to landscaping. In addition, dressing up a lawn ornament does not change the item from a lawn ornament to a seasonal display.





The following is intended as a partial reference list of lawn ornaments: any man made concrete, ceramic statue or figure (including religious symbols), windmill, pinwheels, train sets, deer, geese, flamingos or any other animal or human figure. Owners may check with the Community Standards Department prior to the purchase of lawn ornamentation / landscape objects to verify if the item would be permitted.

Preventative maintenance is occurring on the potable water system field valves throughout many areas of The Villages. Those customers serviced by Village Center Service Area (VCSA), Little Sumter Service Area (LSSA) and North Sumter Utilities (NSU) that will be impacted will be notified 24 hours in advance of a temporary interruption in service and will receive the following notification:

THE PUBLIC DRINKING WATER MAINS IN YOUR AREA WILL BE SHUT DOWN TEMPORARILY FOR NEEDED MAINTENANCE.

AS A PRECAUTION, UPON RETURN OF WATER SERVICE, WE ADVISE THAT ALL WATER USED FOR **DRINKING, MAKING ICE, AND COOKING BE BOILED, FOR ALL OTHER HOUSE HOLD USES THE WATER IS ACCEPTABLE**. A ROLLING BOIL OF ONE MINUTE IS SUFFICIENT. AS AN ALTERNATIVE, BOTTLED WATER MAY BE USED.

THIS "PRECAUTIONARY BOIL WATER NOTICE" WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL THE MAINTENANCE TASK HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND A BACTERIOLOGICAL SURVEY SHOWS THAT THE WATER IS SAFE TO DRINK.

What is a Precautionary Boil Water Notice?

A major component of service provided by the District's Utilities Department is the risk assessment involving

waterborne contaminants through natural or man-made means. It is our responsibility to provide guidance and assistance to prevent exposure to drinking water contaminants that could present a threat to our resident's health.

Water suppliers are required by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) to notify customers to boil water when conditions exist that may cause the water supply to be vulnerable to the potential for contamination. A Precautionary Boil Water Notice (PBWN) is a form of notification that advises customers to boil tap water used for drinking, cooking and ice-making until tests verify the water is safe. The determination that the water is safe is a process through which the Utility Operations and Maintenance Contractor sends water samples to a State Certified Water Testing Lab and receives a report back, usually after 48 hours, stating that the water samples meets all federal and state regulations. The precautionary boil water notice would then be rescinded by notifying all affected residents. An incident that requires a PBWN may include a water, wastewater, or irrigation incident that could develop as a result of, but not limited to, a water line break, a problem at a water plant, a new connection to an existing line, a sewer back up, a Wastewater Treatment Plant incident, or shutting off the water and turning it back on. If an incident occurs, the District will send an e-notification to residential and commercial customers that have signed up to receive the e-notifications. To sign up for e-notifications, simply go to www.districtgov.org click on "sign up for enotifications" beneath the Quick Links on the left side of the home page. After inserting your name and email information, check the appropriate utility that your property is serviced by beneath the Precautionary Boil Water Notification category. If an incident occurs within your utility, you will be notified of the situation and the property addresses affected by the incident. In the event you do not have access to an email system, depending on the number of homes and businesses within the PBWN area all local media are notified and an alert will be posted on the District's website.

As a precaution, all water used for handwashing, drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, cooking, and washing dishes should be boiled briskly for one (1) minute prior to use. All ice cubes should be discarded and only boiled water be used for making ice. As an alternative, bottled water can be used.



Guidelines for Recycling in The Villages® Community



Residents can make an impact by participating in recycling programs! Contained in this guide are the acceptable and non-acceptable material lists, along with contact information to learn more about how Villagers can become good recyclers.

SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING MATERIALS GUIDELINES

Single Stream refers to a system that takes two recycling "streams" – mixed paper and acceptable containers – and puts them together. No sorting needed! ALL your recyclable items MUST be in a clear plastic bag. This increases the ease and convenience of recycling so more people participate and more resources are saved.

RECYCLING MATERIALS ACCEPTED

Plastic/Glass Bottles & Containers – Plastic and glass containers should be recycled according to shape. Any plastic or glass container that has a neck smaller than the base is acceptable. Remove all lids, tops and caps.

Paper and Cardboard -

Newspapers, magazines, catalogs, office paper, junk mail, telephone books and brown paper bags are all acceptable. Flatten all cardboard.

Food and Beverage Cans –

Clean aluminum food and beverage containers.

Food & Beverage Cartons -

Juice boxes, milk, soup, broth, cream and egg substitute cartons are acceptable. NO juice pouches, straws or plastic utensils.

ALWAYS PLACE YOUR RECYCLABLE MATERIALS IN CLEAR BAGS.





RECYCLING MATERIALS NOT ACCEPTED

Clamshell Packaging (packaging typically found in the produce section containing berries)

Glass Cookware/Bakeware including microwave trays

Loose Plastic Shopping Bags

Paper Cups & Plates with plastic or waxed coating

Mirrors

Windows or Auto Glass Light Bulbs Ceramics & Porcelain Tile Peanut Packing

Garden Hoses

Household Items such as dishes, drinking glasses, cooking pots or small appliances

Bubble Wrap

Polystyrene – a.k.a. "Styrofoam" Shredded paper – this should be placed in your regular household garbage

HOUSEHOLD WASTE

Garbage should not be in cans, but instead put in white or black plastic bags at the end of your driveway. Bags should be placed at the end of your driveway, at the edge of the street. Bags must be placed for collection before 6:00 a.m. on your collection day or the night before (no sooner than 9:00 p.m.). All garbage should be placed in sealed, standard 20-30 gallon trash bags, each bag weighing no more than 40 pounds. Refrain from leaving trash out on undesignated collection days. Wrap broken glass or other sharp objects in newspaper and try to place them where they cannot cause injury.

MATERIALS NOT ACCEPTED

DO NOT PLACE HYPODERMIC NEEDLES, PAINT, OIL, LAWN OR POOL CHEMICALS, MOTOR OIL, OR TIRES IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE.

HOMEOWNER YARD WASTE

Wednesday Pick Up Only

Tree limbs or branches may not exceed 4' in length, 4" in diameter, or exceed 40 pounds. Bundle and tie such materials and place them at the end of your driveway. Lawn clippings and similar yard waste should be placed in biodegradable bags.

All waste is transported to the Covanta Energy From Waste Plant. Household waste is turned into electricity, which powers homes locally. Sanitation services are provided by cleaner and quieter collection vehicles powered by Compressed National

Gas engines. Our collection vehicles provide minimal noise and cleaner emissions enhance and protect our environment. By having more efficient services it reduces carbon footprint, reduces wear and tear on roads, less fuel is used, and minimizes traffic in your quiet neighborhood.

For those Villages residents residing South of State Road 44, sanitation services are provided by Covanta by Tri-County Sanitation.

HOUSEHOLD WASTE & RECYCLING

All household waste and recyclable materials should be placed in a sealed 20-30 gallon trash bag. All materials can be placed in the same bag! Each bag should weigh no more than forty (40) pounds. Bags should be placed at the end of your driveway, at the edge of the street. Bags must be placed for collection before 6:00 a.m. on your collection day or the night before (no sooner than 9:00 p.m.). All collection takes place on Tuesday and Friday each week, excluding holidays. For a listing of holidays, please visit www.DistrictGov.org.

HOMEOWNER YARD WASTE

Tree limbs and yard waste will be collected the same days as normal household trash and recycle collection. Yard waste should be bundled, tied and placed at the end of your driveway. Tree limbs and branches may not exceed four (4) feet in length. Lawn clippings and similar yard waste should be placed in bags.

FOR YOU AND YOUR FAM

REFORE A THUNDERSTORM

- ✓ Be Weather-Ready: Check the forecast regularly to see if you're at risk for severe thunderstorms. Listen to local news or a NOAA Weather Radio to stay informed about watches and warnings. Preparation is key to staying safe and minimizing impacts.
- ✓ Sign Up for Notifications: Know how your community sends warnings. Alertlake.com, Alertmarion.com, Sumterprepares.com

DURING A THUNDERSTORM

- ✓ Stay Weather-Ready: Continue to listen to local news or a NOAA Weather Radio to stay updated about watches and warnings.
- ✓ At Your House: Go to your secure location if you hear a severe thunderstorm warning and damaging wind or large hail is approaching. Take your pets if time allows.
- ✓ At Your Workplace or School: Stay away from windows if you are in a severe thunderstorm warning. Damaging wind or large hail could blow a heavy object at windows. Do not go to large open rooms such as cafeterias, gymnasiums or auditoriums.
- Outside: Go inside a sturdy building immediately if severe thunderstorms are approaching. Sheds and storage facilities are not safe. Taking shelter under a tree can be deadly. The tree may fall on you and you are at risk of getting struck by lightning.
- ✓ In a Vehicle: Being in a hard-topped vehicle is safer than being outside; however, if you have time, drive to the closest secure shelter.



STOP all activities.

Seek shelter in a substantial building or hard-topped vehicle.

Wait 30 minutes after the storm to resume activities.

HEALTH OFFICIALS ISSUE MOSQUITO-BORNE ILLNESS ADVISORY

Bushnell, **Fla**.—The Florida Department of Health in Sumter County (DOH-Sumter) and Sumter County Mosquito Control would like to remind residents that the summer months typically bring an increase in mosquito activity. Taking personal safety measures can help you and your pets avoid irritating mosquito bites and prevent mosquito-borne infectious diseases.

Avoid being bitten by mosquitoes by taking the following precautions:

DRAIN standing water to stop mosquitoes from multiplying.

- <u>Drain</u> water from garbage cans, house gutters, buckets, pool covers, coolers, toys, flower pots or any other containers where sprinkler or rain water has collected.
- <u>Discard</u> old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots and pans, broken appliances and other items that aren't being used.
- Empty and clean birdbaths and pet's water bowls at least once or twice a week.
- Protect boats and vehicles from rain with tarps that don't accumulate water.
- <u>Maintain</u> swimming pools in good condition and appropriately chlorinated. Empty plastic swimming pools when not in use.

COVER skin with clothing or repellent.

- <u>Clothing</u> Wear shoes, socks, and long pants and long-sleeves. This type of protection may be necessary for people who must work in areas where mosquitoes are present.
- Repellent Apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing.
 - Always use repellents in accordance with the label instructions. Repellents with DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, para-methane-diol, and IR3535 are effective.
 - Use mosquito netting to protect children younger than 2 months old.

Tips on Repellent Use

- Always read label directions carefully for the approved usage before you apply a repellent. Some repellents are not suitable for children.
- Products with concentrations of up to 30 percent DEET (N, N-diethyl-m-toluamide) are generally recommended. Other U.S. Environmental Protection Agency-approved repellents contain picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, paramethane-diol, or IR3535. These products are generally available at local pharmacies. Look for active ingredients to be listed on the product label.

Did you know???

- Apply insect repellent to exposed skin, or onto clothing, but not under clothing.
- In protecting children, read label instructions to be sure the repellent is ageappropriate. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), mosquito repellents containing oil of lemon eucalyptus should not be used on children under the age of three years. DEET is not recommended on children younger than two months old.
- Avoid applying repellents to the hands of children. Adults should apply repellent first to their own hands and then transfer it to the child's skin and clothing.
- If additional protection is necessary, apply a permethrin repellent directly to your clothing. Again, always follow the manufacturer's directions.

COVER doors and windows with screens to keep mosquitoes out of your house.

Repair broken screening on windows, doors, porches, and patios.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR RESIDENTS RESIDING IN DISTRICT 12

As part of the City of Wildwood's and the privately owned South Sumter Utility Company's (Utility) potable water system maintenance program, the Utility has contracted with Jacobs/CH2M to develop and implement a Unidirectional Flushing (UDF) Program for all areas of The Villages south of SR 44. UDF programs are commonly used across North America to improve operations, enhance the water system and improve service standards. One of the goals of this program is to help alleviate some of the discolored water issues that have been intermittently experienced. An additional goal is to help prepare the potable water system for a change in water source. During the month of July, the water source for The Villages south of SR 44 will transition to the new Water Treatment Plant (WTP) that is being constructed near the intersection of CR 468 and the Turnpike.

The UDF Program began during the week of May 28th and is anticipated to continue for approximately 5 to 6 weeks in order for all areas of the potable water system to be addressed. The duration for each area being flushed is anticipated to be approximately 2 to 4 days and will occur during weekdays between the hours of 7 am and 6 pm. Immediately prior to the beginning of UDF activities in each area, door hanger notices will be placed at each residence or commercial facility.

How can I have the flyer for my neighborhood event posted on the bulletin boards at my postal facility?

The bulletin boards located at the postal facilities provide a communication resource for Villages neighborhood groups and the District Government for neighborhood and community wide events and information.

- All items must be approved by the District before posting
- Items shall not be posted to exceed two (2) weeks or until the post is no longer valid
- Any type of notice posted to the outside of the bulletin board or posted without prior approval will be removed and discarded

The following items will not be approved for posting at any time:

- Commercial services / activities
- Charitable activities / organizations
- Religious material
- Club recruitment / membership notices
- Petitions
- Items or services for sale
- Materials that oppose or support political candidates or ballot measures

Did You Know?

July Is National UV Safety Month

People who get a lot of exposure to ultraviolet (UV) rays are at a greater risk for skin cancer and eye disease. Sunlight is the main source of UV ray exposure and that exposure adds up day after day. It happens every time you are in the sun.

How do I limit my UV Ray exposure?

Simply staying in the shade is one of the best ways to limit your UV exposure. However, when you can't avoid being in the sun, "Slip! Slop! Slap! ® and Wrap" is a catchphrase that can help you remember some of the key steps you can take to protect yourself from UV rays:

- Slip on a shirt.
- Slop on sunscreen.
- Slap on a hat.
- Wrap on sunglasses to protect the eyes and skin around them.

Seeking shade

An obvious but one of the best ways to limit your exposure to UV light is to avoid being outdoors in direct sunlight for long periods--particularly between the hours of 10 am and 4 pm, when UV light is strongest.

- To test how strong the sun's rays are, use the shadow test: if your shadow is shorter than you are, the sun's rays are the strongest, and it's important to protect yourself.
- Be especially careful on the beach because UV rays reflect off of sand and water, increasing the amount of UV radiation you get.
- UV rays also reach below the water's surface, so you can still get a burn even if you're in the water and feeling cool.
- UV rays can also pass through windows. Typical car, home, and office windows block most UVB rays but a smaller portion of UVA rays, so your skin may still get some damage.

Protect children from the sun

Children tend to spend more time outdoors, can burn more easily, and may not be aware of the dangers of UV exposure. It's important to cover your children as fully as is reasonable. You should develop the habit of using sunscreen on exposed skin for yourself and your children whenever you may be exposed to large amounts of sunlight. This will help to teach them about the dangers of too much sun exposure. If your child burns easily, be extra careful to cover up, limit exposure, and apply sunscreen. Children need smaller versions of real, protective adult sunglasses — not toy sunglasses.

• Babies younger than 6 months should not be in direct sunlight and should stay covered by using hats and protective clothing. Sunscreen can be used on exposed skin only when adequate clothing and shade are not available.

Sun exposure and vitamin D

Your skin makes vitamin D naturally when you are in the sun, it is an essential nutrient but doctors aren't sure of the optimal level of vitamin D. At this time, it is felt to be better to get your vitamin D from your diet or vitamin supplements rather than from UV exposure because dietary sources and vitamin supplements do not increase skin cancer risk. Diet and supplements are more reliable ways to get the amount you need, as well.
