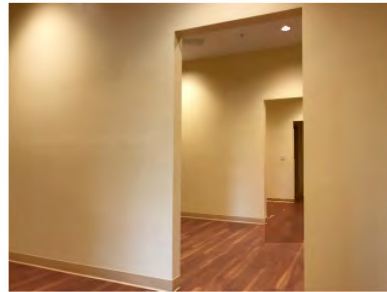

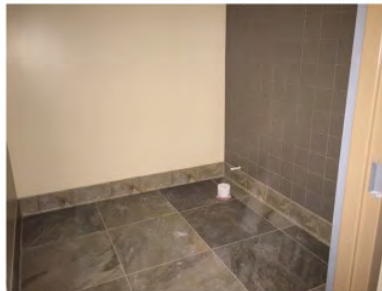
The Villages Public Safety Department Fire Station #40 located at 2455 Parr Drive:

Phase 1 is substantially completed. The staff will be moved to temporary housing on or about October 18, 2019 and the renovation of the existing structure will begin.



District Field Ops Facility for District Property Management (DPM), Community Watch and South Sumter Utilities (SSU) located at 4890 Morse Boulevard:

The building's interior is being installed and occupancy should take place late November or early December.



Del Mar Gate

The project to improve the Del Mar gate access is completed. The new sidewalk and truncated domes at the new ADA ramp are completed as is the construction of the new vehicle access lane, gate operators, key card scanners, CCTV cameras, landscaping, irrigation, paving and related pavement marking work. The District will be refreshing the landscape work around the gatehouse building this week as part of ongoing maintenance to maintain the quality of District facilities.

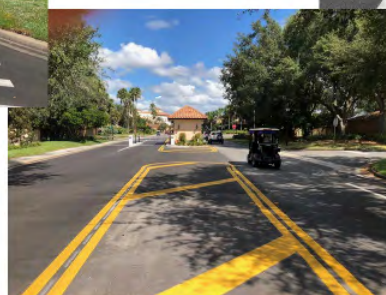


President Donald Trump's visit to Spanish Springs Town Square in The Villages on Thursday, October 3, 2019 put our re-designed Del Mar Gate operations to the test.

With The Sharon L. Morse Performing Arts Center and other regularly scheduled daily events in Town Square, it became apparent that Del Mar gate's single entry lane design had a difficult time keeping up with the traffic flow before and after events. After completing a traffic count of vehicles entering Del Mar gate for a period of days, it was determined that traffic flow increased not only due to The Sharon's performances, but at other times throughout the day.

On September 9, 2019, Del Mar began its transformation from a single lane entry to one that is consistent with all the other heavily used gates in The Villages. Del Mar is now operating as all other locations using two entry lanes; one for visitors and one for residents. The gate attendant on duty opens the visitor lane and residents enter using either the gate card or pressing the red button to activate the gate. Pedestrians leaving the Chula Vista Villas are crossing behind the gate house using Del Mar Drive over to the sidewalk. The road improvement project was scheduled to be completed on September 30, 2019, but opened 10 days ahead of schedule.

When President Trump took the stage at The Sharon L. Morse Performing Arts Center, attendance was estimated to be in the thousands at both The Sharon and watching from Town Square. Once the event concluded, the influx of people departing the area would have put a strain on the old one-lane Del Mar Gate set up. The re-designed two lane traffic pattern passed the test with flying colors!



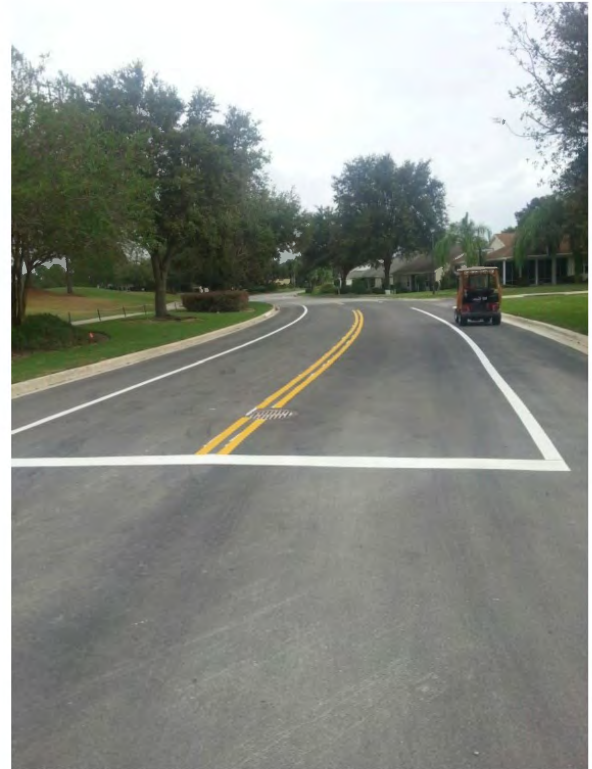

Not Every Hero Wears a Cape. Plan and Practice Your Escape!

Some interesting statistics relating to fire related incidents :

- 3 of every 5 home fire deaths resulted from fires in homes with no working smoke alarms
- Less than 50% of homeowners have an escape plan
- Carbon monoxide (CO) is the #1 cause of accidental death
- 60% of consumers do not test their smoke and CO alarms monthly
- Only 47% of people report having CO alarms in their home



“Not Every Hero Wears a Cape. Plan and Practice Your Escape!”

focuses on home fire escape planning and practice, as well as what a home escape plan entails and the value of practicing it. These messages are more important than ever, particularly because today’s homes burn faster than ever. More specifically, synthetic fibers used in modern home furnishings, along with the fact that newer homes tend to be built with more open spaces and unprotected lightweight construction, are contributing factors to increased burn rates.

A home escape plan includes working smoke alarms on every level of the home and near all sleeping areas. It also includes two ways out of every room, usually a door and a window, with a clear path to an outside predetermined meeting place (like a tree, light pole or mailbox) that’s a safe distance from the home. Home escape plans should be practiced twice a year by all members of the household. National Fire Prevention Month is also the perfect time to talk with your whole family about fire safety – including testing alarms, changing batteries or upgrading to a 10-year sealed battery alarm for hassle-free protection, and escape planning.

Fire Safety Tips



Here are a few tips to keep you and your loved ones safe. Share these tips and be a hero.

Check Your Smoke Alarms

Working smoke alarms reduce the chances of dying in a fire by nearly 50 percent. They are a critical first step for staying safe, but in order to be effective, they have to be working properly.

For the best protection, install smoke alarms on every level of your home, outside every sleeping area and in each bedroom.

Use Daylight Savings Time as a reminder to check your smoke alarms. Replace conventional batteries at least once a year. Consider installing a smoke alarm that has a 10-year battery.

Create and Practice a Fire Escape Plan

Create and practice a home fire escape plan with two ways out of every room and designated place to assemble once outside. As part of your plan, designate one person to get infants and small children out safely. Have a back-up plan for young children just in case the primary person is overcome by smoke.

Smoke is toxic. Teach children to “get low and go” if there is smoke when they are leaving the home.

Practice feeling the door, doorknob and cracks around the door with the back of your hand to see if they are too hot. Choose a place to meet outside that is a safe distance away from your home.

In an Emergency, Leave Home Immediately

In the event of a fire, leave your home immediately. Once you’re out of the house, stay out.

Wait to call 911 until after you are out of the home.

If You Live in an Apartment, Pull the Alarm

If there is a fire and you don’t hear the building’s fire alarm, pull the nearest fire alarm “pull station” on your way out. Know all of your building’s fire escape exits and use the stairs to get out. Don’t use the elevator.

Fire Safety Tips

If You're Stuck Inside, Cover the Areas Where Smoke Might Come In

If you cannot safely escape your home or apartment, keep smoke out of the room by covering vents and cracks around the door, and call 911 or your fire department as quickly as possible.

Then signal for help at the window with a light-colored cloth or a flashlight.

Keep Flammable Materials in Safe Areas

Remember to keep space heaters at least three feet away from anything that can burn, and always closely supervise children and pets when the heater is turned on.

Make sure you turn space heaters off when you leave the room.

Don't Over Plug To prevent possible fires, avoid plugging several appliance cords into the same electrical socket. **Blow Out Candles and Store Matches Out of Reach**

Keep candles at least 12 inches away from anything that can burn, and always blow them out when you leave the room or before you go to sleep.

Make a habit of placing matches, gasoline and lighters in a safe place, out of children's reach. Teach kids never to play with matches and lighters.

Plan for your transportation future and life beyond the driver's seat by learning how to discover and use transportation options in your community.

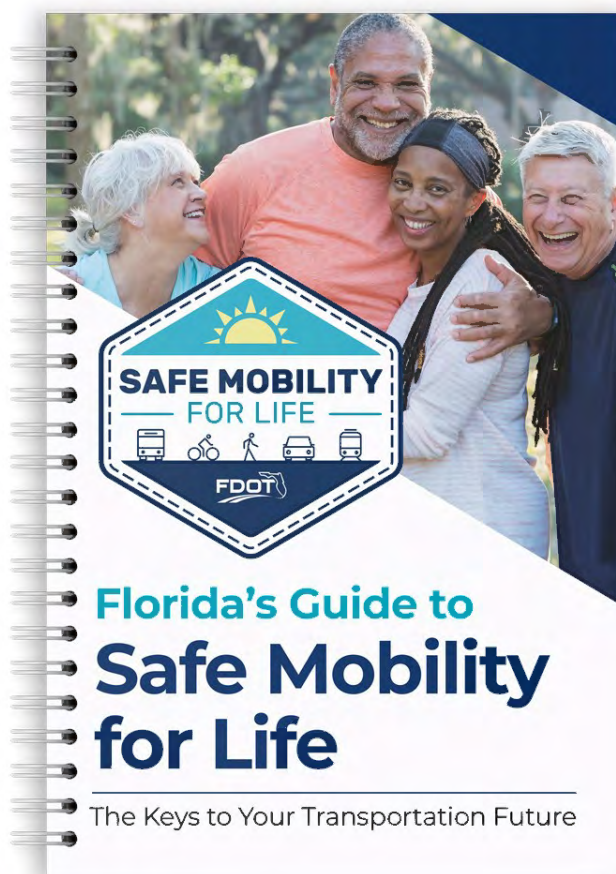

Please join us for the third interactive Solid Waste Workshop presented by the North Sumter County Utility Dependent District (NSCUDD) and Jacobs, formerly CH2M, the waste hauler for Districts 1 – 11 on Wednesday, October 23, 2019 at The Savannah Center from 9:00 to 12:00!

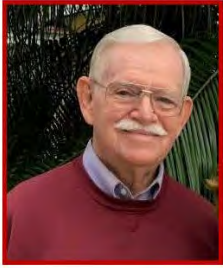
The first workshop provided information on the District's current Solid Waste and Recycling Program, and the need to develop a Solid Waste Management Plan, as well as the state of the industry and the impacts this has on our current program. China and other Asian countries have placed policies and restrictions on the import of recyclables and which is impacting recycling throughout the world.

The second workshop recapped what we learned in the first along with additional information on the methods of solid waste disposal, as well as the rising costs. With the use of electronic survey clickers a series of questions were asked of the attendees and the results stated that the majority feels there is no need to change the solid waste collection process and are very satisfied with the service that is provided. The participants also indicated a willingness to pay slightly more per month to maintain the current solid waste and recycling program.

During the third workshop, alternative waste management options, options for waste disposal, and the associated costs will be presented followed by asking for additional input from the attendees. The District and Jacobs appreciate the participation and suggestions we have received so far and look forward to meeting with you again in October.
