## ⇒ Pennecamp Adult Pool


The Pennecamp Adult Pool Restrooms will be closed for maintenance on December 24th and December 25th.


## How long do you need to boil water after a Precautionary Boil Water Notice?

You need to boil water after a Precautionary Boil Water Notice until the notice has been rescinded, which occurs after tests show the water is safe. For additional information pertaining to Precautionary Boil Water Notices, visit www.DistrictGov.org.

## How many water utilities are there in The Villages and how do I know which one applies to me?

There are 5 utilities in The Villages. The utility that provides you service varies based on geographic location:

- Village Center Service Area (Lake County and District 1 in Sumter County) is owned by Village Center Community Development District.
- Little Sumter Service Area (Districts 2 and 3 in Sumter County and District 4 in Marion County) is owned by Village Center Community Development District. EXCLUDES District 4 Phase IV Phillips (M232) / Soulliere (M233) / Chatham Acres (M839)
- North Sumter County Utility Dependent District (Districts 5, 6, 7, 8 and a part of District 9 in Sumter County) is owned by North Sumter County Utility Dependent District.
- Central Sumter Utility (Districts 9, 10 & 11) is a privately owned utility.
- South Sumter Utility (Districts 12 & 13) is a privately owned utility.







No sign-ups or fees are required for this presentation. Sessions are held every Thursday at 10:00 a.m. at the District Office, 984 Old Mill Run.







These light poles are not manufactured to carry additional weight. To avoid injury, never place a ladder against or add weight to a pole or light.









## **Enjoy a Safe Holiday Season!**

**Traveling for the Holidays? Be Prepared.** Many people choose to travel by car during the holidays, which has the highest fatality rate of any major form of transportation based on fatalities per passenger mile. In 2017, 329 people died on New Year's Day, 463 on Thanksgiving Day and 299 on Christmas Day, according to *Injury Facts*. Alcohol impairment was involved in about one third of the fatalities. Stay safe on the roads over the holidays and every day:

- Prepare your car for winter and keep an emergency preparedness kit with you.
- Get a good night's sleep before departing and avoid drowsy driving.
- Leave early, planning ahead for heavy traffic.
- Make sure every person in the vehicle is properly buckled up no matter how long or short the distance traveled.
- Put that cell phone away; many distractions occur while driving, but cell phones are the main culprit.
- · Practice defensive driving.
- Designate a sober driver to ensure guests make it home safely after a holiday party; alcohol or over-the-counter, prescription and illegal drugs can cause impairment.

**Decorate Safely!** Decorating is one of the best ways to get in a holiday mood, but emergency rooms see thousands of injuries involving holiday decorating every season.

When decorating follow these tips from the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission:

- Keep potentially poisonous plants mistletoe, holly berries, Jerusalem cherry and amaryllis – away from children.
- If using an artificial tree, check that it is labeled "fire resistant".
- If using a live tree, cut off about 2 inches of the trunk to expose fresh wood for better water absorption, remember to water it and remove it from your home when it is dry.





- Place your tree at least 3 feet away from fireplaces, radiators and other heat sources, making certain not to block doorways.
- Avoid placing breakable ornaments or ones with small, detachable parts on lower tree branches where small children can reach them.
- Only use indoor lights indoors and outdoor lights outdoors, and choose the right ladder for the task when hanging lights.
- Replace light sets that have broken or cracked sockets, frayed or bare wires, or loose connections.
- Follow the package directions on the number of light sets that can be plugged into one socket.
- Never nail, tack or stress wiring when hanging lights and keep plugs off the ground away from puddles and snow.
- Turn off all lights and decorations when you go to bed or leave the house.

#### **Watch Out for Fire-Starters!**

**Candles and Fireplaces** -Use of candles and fireplaces, combined with an increase in the amount of combustible, seasonal decorations in many homes during the holidays, means more risk for fire. The National Fire Protection Association reports that one-third of home decoration fires are started by candles and that two of every five decoration fires happen because the decorations are placed too close to a heat source.

- Place candles where they cannot be knocked down or blown over and out of reach of children.
- Keep matches and lighters up high and out of reach for children in a locked cabinet.
- Use flameless, rather than lighted, candles near flammable objects.
- Don't burn trees, wreaths or wrapping paper in the fireplace.
- Use a screen on the fireplace at all times when a fire is burning.
- Never leave candles or fireplaces burning unattended or when you are asleep.
- Check and clean the chimney and fireplace area at least once a year.



**Poisoning Is No Joke!** Keep your holidays happy by handling food safely. The foodsafety.gov website from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services provides some valuable holiday food safety tips:

- Wash your hands frequently when handling food.
- Keep raw meat away from fresh produce.
- Use separate cutting boards, plate and utensils for uncooked and cooked meats to avoid cross-contamination.
- Use a food thermometer to make sure meat is cooked to a safe temperature.

**It's Better to Give Safely.** Gifts and toys should inspire joy, not cause injuries. More than a quarter of a million children were seriously injured in toy-related incidents in 2017. Avoid safety hazards while gifting with these tips from the American Academy of Pediatrics and the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission:

- Toys are age-rated for safety, not for children's intellect and physical ability, so be sure to choose toys in the correct age range.
- Choose toys for children under 3 that do not have small parts which could be choking hazards.
- For children under 10, avoid toys that must be plugged into an electrical outlet.
- Be cautious about toys that have button batteries or magnets, which can be harmful or fatal if swallowed.
- When giving scooters and other riding toys, give the gift of appropriate safety gear, too; helmets should be worn at all times and they should be sized to fit.

Asphalt rejuvenation applications began on villa roads in Village Community Development Districts 1 and 4 on December 2, 2019.
