

The Sterling Heights Recreation Center will be closed for maintenance on February 15th.


Golf Course Closure...

Frequently Asked Questions and Answers



Where can I go if I have lost an item?

Depending on where items are found, inexpensive items will be held for one month at La Hacienda, Laurel Manor or Eisenhower Regional Recreation Centers. Valuables will be turned over to local area law enforcement within 72 hours. At the end of each month, unclaimed items will be donated to local charities. The Recreation Department is not responsible for lost items. See the full Lost and Found Policy on the next page.





Lost & Found Guidelines The Villages Recreation & Parks Department

All items estimated to be valued under \$50.00 (non-valuable items) will be sent to the following lost and found locations:

- La Hacienda Regional Recreation Center (north of 466), 753-1716
- Laurel Manor Regional Recreation Center (south of 466), 751-7110
- Eisenhower Regional Recreation Center (south of 466A), 674-8390

All items estimated to be valued over \$50.00 (valuable items) including but not limited to: gold, jewelry, golf clubs, wallets, purses, electronics (including digital cameras, cell phones, tablets/computers) or other expensive items will be turned over to the appropriate law enforcement agency within 72 hours.

When items are found at any of The Villages Recreation Facilities the following steps will take place:

- 1. If an individual claims an item he/she is to fill out the Recreation Department Lost & Found Claim Form. Claim report forms will be kept on file at the facility RSR's desk for a period of 6 months.
- 2. No items are to be released without a photo ID, signature and phone number.
- 3. After the end of each month all remaining items will be donated to a local charitable organization as designated by the District. The Recreation Dept. has partnered with The Villages Auxiliary Hospital; which is a non-profit, charitable organization that serves our community.

Note: The Recreation Department takes no responsibility for items left in the Recreation Centers or turned over to Law Enforcement.

Is there an advantage to paying off my bond during a certain time of the year?

A property owner can prepay their bond assessment in full by check or money order at any time of the year. However, a resident is not required to pay off this assessment in advance.

Here are a few important dates to remember.

- If a resident pays off their bond anytime from now until 5pm on March 16, 2020, the payoff amount will be adjusted to reflect a credit for half of the year's interest paid on the November 2019 tax bill.
- If a resident pays off their bond between March 17, 2020 and 5pm on July 17, 2020, they eliminate the annual assessment on the November 2020 tax bill and avoid future interest payments.
- If a resident decides to pay off the bond between July 18, 2020 and before 5pm on September 16, 2020, the resident will still have one final bond assessment on the county property tax bill in November 2020; however, the payoff amount will be adjusted to reflect a credit for a full year's interest payment.

All amortization schedules are available on the District's website at DistrictGov.org.

Please remember though, even when the bond assessment is paid off, there will continue to be an annual maintenance assessment on your county's tax bill which pays for ongoing costs to maintain the infrastructure of your District.



When enjoying Recreation Department sponsored activities, we ask you to remember the following guidelines:


- •Please, always carry your Villages ID/Guest ID and follow all posted rules and regulations in your activity location - including all posted age requirements at all centers.

Did you know the District has its own Risk
Management Department which performs a multitude of services to enhance the lifestyle in The Villages?

Risk Management Function

The primary function of the department is to identify, evaluate, and control the District's exposure to loss or damage to physical assets.

Risk Management Responsibilities

- Review damages to District property, including gates, by investigating each incident, determining responsible parties, and working to recover losses.
- Review all Third Party Incident Reports occurring on District property.
- Track and monitor pending and litigated claims.
- Act as liaison with outside contractors in coordinating all matters regarding the District's property and liability insurance.
- Review District insurance needs annually and procure packages that fulfill needs while maximizing value.
- Coordinate the District's employee safety program including facilitation of Safety Committee.
- Mitigate risk to employees and public.

Notice of Construction and Partial Road Closure Shay – Silver Lake Gate House Restroom Addition 1000 Shay Blvd, The Villages FL 32159

The referenced project new start date is 2-18-20

On February 18, 2020, the District will begin a construction project at the Shay Gate located at the corner of Shay Boulevard and Griffin Road. The project generally consists of the renovation of the interior and exterior of the existing gate house, as well as constructing a restroom addition to the building. There are site improvements included in the project such as utility upgrades and lane / parking improvements. The project will be completed on or about May 5, 2020.

All of the construction and site improvements will take place in the right-of-way along Shay Boulevard. There should be no interruption in utility services to any of the nearby homes. The westerly outbound or exit lane of Shay Boulevard from the corner of Shay Boulevard and Tarrson Boulevard to Griffin Road will be closed while this work is completed. The easterly entry lane from Griffin Road will remain open. Please proceed with caution. Detour signage and other means of directing traffic will be used to guide the flow of traffic safely through the neighborhood. In addition, the gate house will be closed during the construction.

Town Squares Update

The Villages Community Development Districts Property Management

The Town Squares Division is pleased to announce the much anticipated completion of the Wilkerson Creek Park & Children's Playground Structures located across from Sonny's Restaurant. The pirate ship themed playground structure features an array of colors, ADA accessible features such as play panels at ground level, musical instruments and cognitive play components. It also includes traditional slides and climbing features to encourage physical development and fitness. In addition to these upgrades, the District is excited to also be installing a rubberized play surface and an engineered shade structure to further enhance the play experience. A soft opening is scheduled for this Friday, February 7th, with a grand re-opening being coordinated with Recreation and Parks.

We are also pleased to announce the upcoming completion of the Lake Sumter Landing project to rebuild the Wilkerson Creek Waterwheel, located between the Bass Factory Outlet and Chop House on Wilkerson Creek. The waterwheel structure itself has been replaced by Waterwheel Factory out of Franklin, North Carolina. The new waterwheel will be powered by electric motor to emulate one of the largest waterwheels {at 28 feet in diameter} east of the Mississippi River. In order to facilitate the project completion, a portion of the parking area behind Bass as well as some of the walkway will remain closed to the public until an expected project completion date of Thursday, February 13th.
