On June 18, 2020, the North Sumter County Utility Dependent District (NSCUDD) unanimously approved the Agreement with Covanta Lake II, Inc. for waste disposal in Districts 1-11. Beginning October 1, 2020 all waste collected by CH2M/Jacobs will be taken to the Covanta Energy-From-Waste facility in Okahumpka, FL. In 2019, in addition to reducing the waste volume by 90%, saving over 225,000 cubic yards of landfill space, Covanta produced 77,292 megawatt hours of energy, which would provide enough electricity for over 7,000 households in the community annually. Fiscal Year 2020-21 Proposed Budgets

Florida State Statutes require that a Proposed Budget and Proposed Maintenance Assessments be approved no later than June 15th of each year. The Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-21 Budgets have been reviewed and discussed over many hours during public May Budget Workshops and Board meetings. The Numbered Districts, VCCDD, SLCDD, and BCDD Board Supervisors have approved their FY2020-21 Proposed Budgets and maintenance assessments rates at their June Board meetings.

The NSCUDD Board of Supervisors will meet July 7, 2020 to approve their FY2020-21 Proposed Budget. They recently held a public Budget Workshop on May 28, 2020. In accordance with Ordinance 2010-10, the North Sumter County Utility Dependent District must approve a Proposed Budget to be submitted to the Sumter County Board of County Commissioners no later than July 15th of each year.

Most of the Districts' proposed maintenance assessment rates had no change and remain at the same level as current year. For District 9 homeowners, the proposed FY20-21 assessment rates will decrease due to the addition of the Lofts – Phase V. In District 12, there are only two units, Unit 31V and Unit 40V, that will have an increase in their assessment rate due to additional acreage recorded in the final plat of the units. All other units in District 12 will receive a decrease or no change to their maintenance assessments.

It is important to note that the proposed maintenance assessment rates that are approved in June cannot increase when the final rates are adopted in September; however, the rates can stay at the same level or decrease from the proposed rates.

FREE COVID-19 VIRAL TESTING IN THE VILLAGES

Bushnell, FLA — The Sumter County Health Department will be hosting a COVID-19 virus testing event at the New Covenant United Methodist Church in The Villages from Monday, June 29th through Thursday, July 2nd from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM. This will be drive-up testing with the entrance off SR-101 (please see map below). The test requires a nasal swab to be inserted by a trained medical professional and placed far into the nose. **REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED.**

“Testing community members for COVID-19, regardless if they have symptoms or not, provides the health department the ability to identify the extent of any community spread of the virus. The health department conducts contact tracing for each individual that tests positive in an effort to halt further spread. In this sense, community residents who volunteer for this testing perform a valuable community service to stop the spread of COVID-19.”

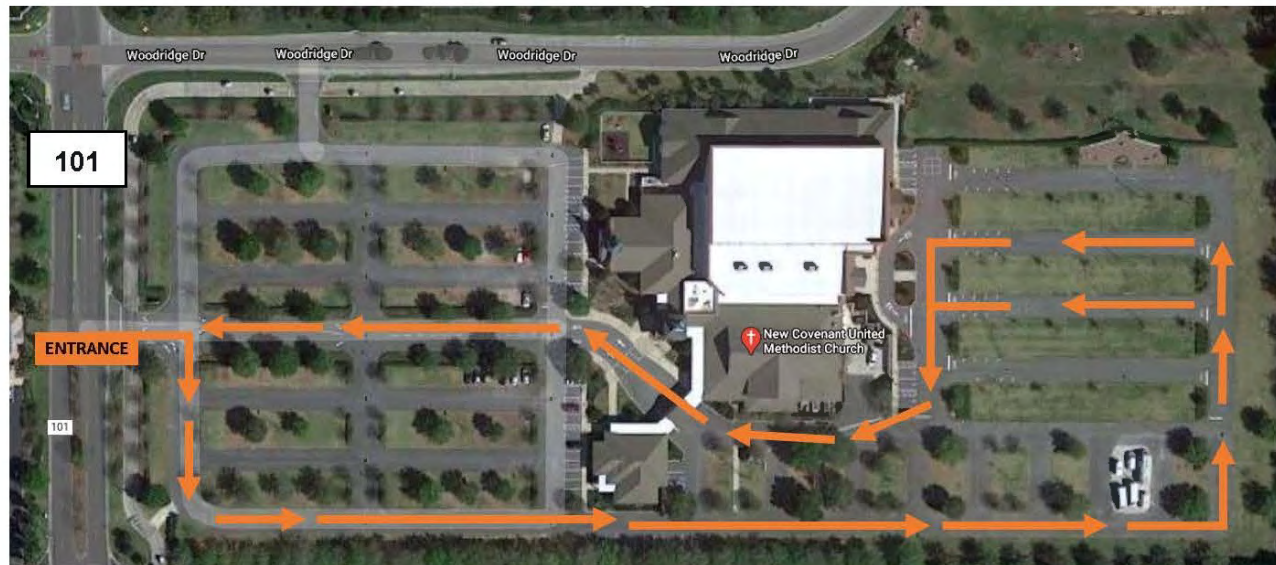

Swimming Pools

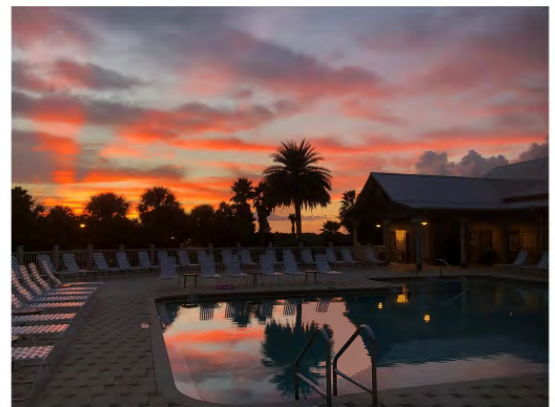

There are specific color palettes and guidelines for each numbered District 1 - 10 and Village Center Community Development District for the Lady Lake / Lake County portion of The Villages.

1, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, & Lady Lake/Lake County portion of The Villages

- Architectural approval is not required **IF** the chosen color is the color at time of construction, a color included on the current District approved color palette or is a color within the hue range of the palette.
- Architectural approval is required **IF** the chosen color is not the original color at time of construction, or is not on the current District approved color palette or within the approved hue range.

VILLAGE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT NO. 2

- Architectural approval is not required **IF** the chosen color is the color at time of construction.
- Architectural approval is required **IF** the chosen color is not the original color at time of construction.

- ARC shall only approve those colors on the District's approved color palette or color palette hue range.
- If the chosen color is not the original color at time of construction or not on the District approved color palette or within the approved hue range, the homeowner must seek and received Board approval to utilize the chosen colors.

VILLAGE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT NO. 10

- Architectural approval is not required **IF** the chosen color is the color at time of construction.
- Architectural approval is required **IF** the chosen color is not the original color at time of construction or on the approved color palette or within the hue range.
- Photographs of the homes in the surrounding neighborhood shall be submitted with the application.

COURTYARD VILLAS – STUCCO

- Architectural approval is required whenever an owner repaints the exterior of their stucco residence using the original color at the time of construction or a color that has been approved through a petition process.

Myth: If it is not raining, then there is no danger from lightning.

NO! Lightning can strike as far as 10 to 15 miles away from any rainfall.

Myth: Rubber tires on a car will protect you from being struck by lightning.

NO! The steel frame of a hard-topped vehicle provides increased protection if you are not touching metal.

Myth: People struck by lightning should not be touched because they carry an electrical charge.

NO! Victims carry no charge and should be given first-aid immediately.

Myth: If outside during a storm, you should seek shelter under a tree.

NO! Seek shelter indoors! Being underneath a tree is the 2nd leading cause of lightning casualties.

Myth: Lightning never strikes the same place twice.

NO! Lightning often strikes the same place repeatedly, especially if it's a tall, pointy object.

Myth: If you are in a house, you are 100% safe from lightning.

NO! A house is safe as long as you avoid anything that conducts electricity.

Lightning Safety Awareness Week 2020

Outdoors is the most dangerous place to be during a thunderstorm. Each year, nearly all people in the United States who are injured or killed by lightning were involved in an outdoor activity. They were struck while working outside, were at or participating at an outdoor sporting event, or were boating or fishing. Other examples include people struck while they were hiking, mowing the lawn or simply going to or from their car. Quite a few were on their own property when they were struck.

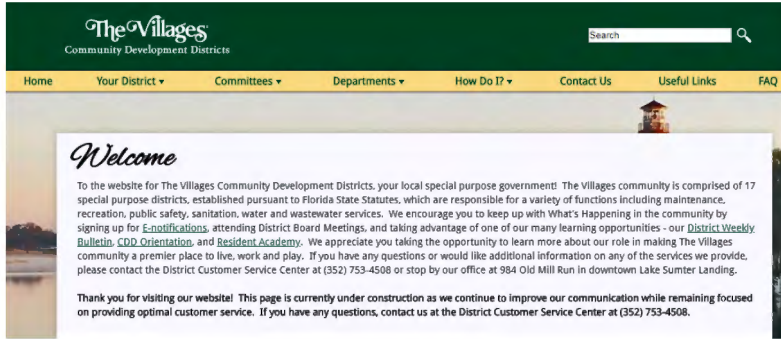
Check for updated forecasts. Check if storms are near you by checking the latest radar imagery on your cell phone. There are now several smart phone apps you can purchase that show you real-time lightning activity in your area. Do not forget to simply look around you to make sure storms are not developing in your vicinity.

If you are outside, such as a park, a lake, or an outdoor sporting event, know where the nearest safe location can be accessed. A safe location is any substantial building (a substantial building is a structure which is fully enclosed and has electrical wiring and plumbing). In addition, any enclosed hard-topped car or truck also offers excellent protection from a lightning strike. Once you hear thunder or see lightning, immediately stop what you are doing and quickly get to the safe shelter.

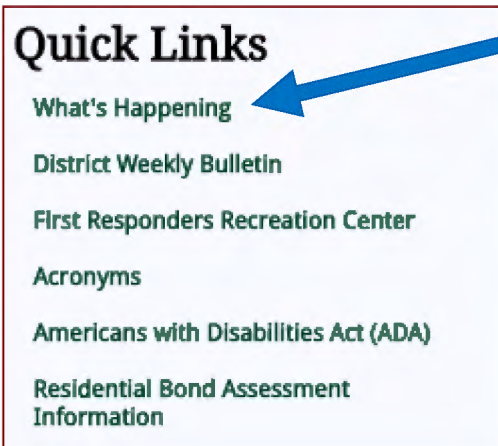

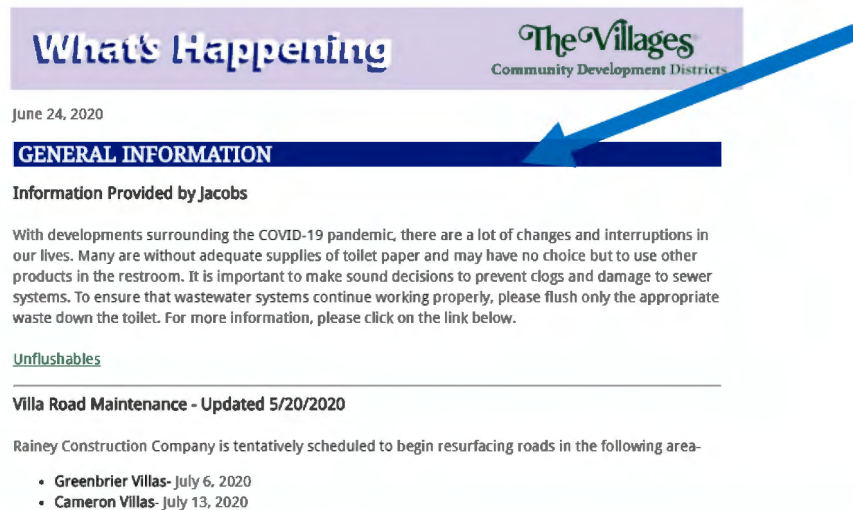

Please be advised that newly paved roadways will take approximately one hour to cure and should not be driven on while hot! Driving before this time could result in tracking asphalt onto your driveway and damaging the new roadway.

If you must travel through the construction, PLEASE drive slowly and watch for and listen to directions provided by the contract workers.

Rio Grande Air Gun Range

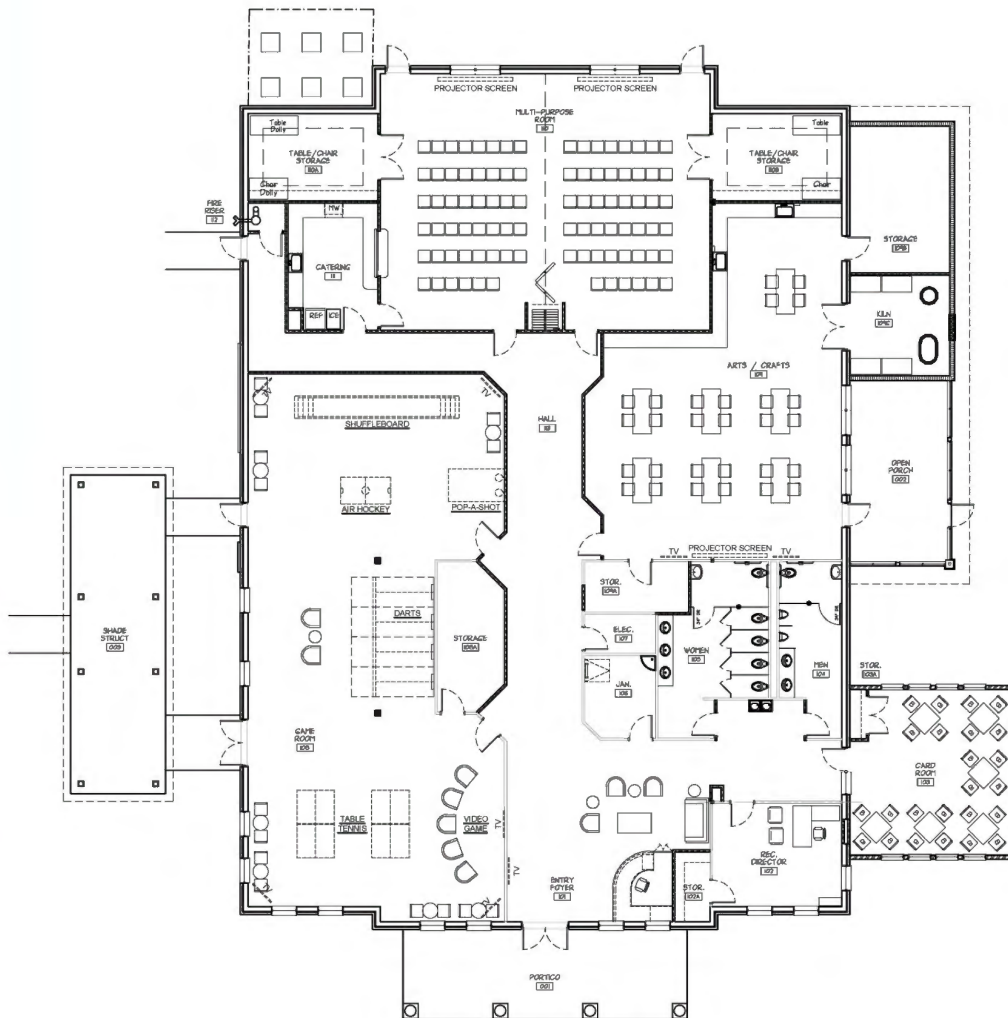

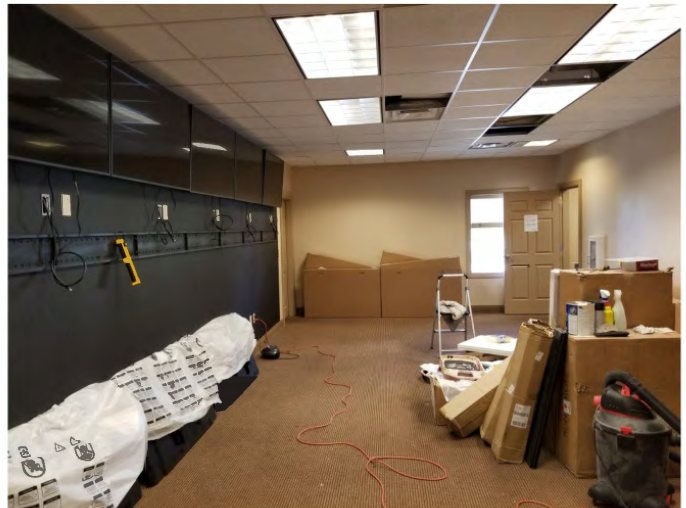
Brownwood Woodshop

My irrigation usage increased and I didn't touch my timer, how can that be?

We have had this question so many times in recent weeks, as we tend to do every summer when it gets hot and dry. This year, the increases are more noticeable as we are over 7 inches deficient in rainfall for the season, as of the end of May, and are getting dangerously close to drought conditions.

Many people have been surprised to learn that the timer that is installed at the time of construction of the home, a Hunter Pro-C, is equipped with a feature called Solar Sync. Self-adjusting is exactly what it is designed to do!

An excerpt from HunterIndustries.com:

“The Solar Sync Sensor is an advanced weather sensor that calculates evapotranspiration (ET) and adjusts Hunter controllers daily based upon onsite weather conditions. Solar Sync measures sunlight and temperature, and uses ET to determine the correct seasonal adjustment percentage value to send to the controller. The controller then uses its programmed run time and adjusts to Solar Sync's seasonal adjustment value to modify the actual irrigation run time for that day.”

Preventative maintenance is occurring on the potable water system field valves throughout many areas of The Villages. Those customers serviced by Village Center Service Area (VCSA), Little Sumter Service Area (LSSA) and North Sumter Utilities (NSU) that will be impacted will be notified 24 hours in advance of a temporary interruption in service and will receive the following notification:

THE PUBLIC DRINKING WATER MAINS IN YOUR AREA WILL BE SHUT DOWN TEMPORARILY FOR NEEDED MAINTENANCE.

*AS A PRECAUTION, UPON RETURN OF WATER SERVICE, WE ADVISE THAT ALL WATER USED FOR **DRINKING, MAKING ICE, AND COOKING BE BOILED**, **FOR ALL OTHER HOUSE HOLD USES THE WATER IS ACCEPTABLE**. A ROLLING BOIL OF ONE MINUTE IS SUFFICIENT. AS AN ALTERNATIVE, BOTTLED WATER MAY BE USED.*

THIS "PRECAUTIONARY BOIL WATER NOTICE" WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL THE MAINTENANCE TASK HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND A BACTERIOLOGICAL SURVEY SHOWS THAT THE WATER IS SAFE TO DRINK. THIS USUALLY CONSISTS OF A TWO DAY SAMPLING PERIOD TO INSURE SAFE DRINKING WATER.

Focus on Safe Driving

Did you know that every **seven seconds someone is injured in a car crash**, and every **fifteen minutes someone is killed in one**?

Three types of driver distractions are:

- ⇒ **Visual**-Eyes on the road
- ⇒ **Manual**-Hands on the wheel
- ⇒ **Cognitive or Mental**-Mind on driving



Cell phones are unique from other forms of driver distractions because they usually involve all three forms of distractions.

Risks of Driving While Talking on a Cell Phone:

- More likely to commit driver errors and traffic violations.
- Slower reaction time than drivers impaired at the 0.08 alcohol concentration level.
- Looking but failing to see up to 50 percent of the driving environment.
- More than one-third of the brain's processing resources are drawn away from driving tasks.

Drivers using handheld or hands-free cell phones are 4x as likely to crash. Motor vehicle crashes are among the top two causes of injury deaths. To reduce this toll, prevention must focus on the top factors associated with crashes. Driver distractions have joined alcohol and speeding as leading factors in fatal and serious injury crashes. The National Safety Council estimates 21 percent of all crashes in 2010 involved talking on cell phones – accounting for 1.1 million crashes that year. A minimum of three percent of crashes are estimated to involve texting.

Just like driver distractions, alcohol is a leading factor associated with crashes. Drivers with alcohol concentration at or above 0.08 were involved in 29% of traffic crash fatalities in 2017. **Over 10,000 lives are lost every year to something that is preventable.** The total toll is even greater when the fatality count includes traffic crash deaths where drivers had alcohol concentrations below the legal limit, from 0.01 to 0.079; about 1,800 more people are killed in crashes involving low alcohol concentrations. Drivers can be dangerously impaired at these lower levels, because impairment begins with the first drink. Research shows that for the majority of drivers, performance has already deteriorated significantly by the time a person's alcohol concentration reaches 0.08.

There are certain groups were more likely to drive impaired than others:

- 21-34 year-olds were overrepresented in fatal crashes involving alcohol
- 35-44 year-olds were also overrepresented, but less so than those age 21 to 34
- 79% of all drivers involved in alcohol-impaired fatal crashes were male
- People with substance use problems and alcohol addiction

Drowsy driving is often compared to driving under the influence of alcohol because of similar performance effects. A person who is drowsy or fatigued may experience decreased vigilance and response time, putting them at increased risk for crashes. Drowsy driving, or fatigued driving, occurs when a person is driving while feeling tired, drowsy, fatigued, or less than fully alert. In one study, **41% of Americans reported falling asleep behind the wheel at least once**, and one in ten admitted they had within the last year . But impairment due to drowsy driving occurs far before you doze off.

These tips will help you avoid drowsy driving:

- **Get at least seven hours of sleep a day, especially if you will be driving.**
- **Avoid driving if you've been awake for 16 hours or more.**
- **Take breaks at least every 2 hours of driving.**
- **Do not drive after consuming alcohol or medications that may cause drowsiness.**

If you find yourself on the road and feeling tired, pull over to a safe location and park. Take a 20-minute nap or make other arrangements to get to your destination.

After practicing all these safe driving techniques, do not forget the most effective way to protect yourself during a crash. The safety benefits of seat belts are clear.

Wearing a seat belt is the single most effective way to prevent death and serious injury in a car crash. Drivers and passengers who buckle up are 45% less likely to die and 50% less likely to be moderately injured in a crash.

When seat belts are used correctly, they:

- Keep occupants from being ejected in a crash, a frequent cause of death when people aren't properly secured.
- Hold the driver in place so he or she can better control the vehicle.
- Prevent passengers from becoming unsecured missiles and harming others in the car.
- Protect drivers and passengers by helping absorb the force of a crash.
