Know how it spreads



- There is currently no vaccine to prevent coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).
- The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus.
- The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person.
 - » Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet).
 - » Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs, sneezes or talks.
 - » These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs.
 - » Some recent studies have suggested that COVID-19 may be spread by people who are not showing symptoms.

Everyone should

Clean your hands often



- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.

Avoid close contact



- Limit contact with others as much as possible.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Put distance between yourself and other people.
 - » Remember that some people without symptoms may be able to spread virus.

Cover your mouth and nose with a mask when around others



- You could spread COVID-19 to others even if you do not feel sick.
- Everyone should wear a mask in public settings and when around people not living in their household, especially when social distancing is difficult to maintain.
 - » Masks should not be placed on young children under age 2, anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.
- The mask is meant to protect other people in case you are infected.
- Do **NOT** use a facemask meant for a healthcare worker.
- Continue to **keep about 6 feet between yourself and others.** The mask is not a substitute for social distancing.

Cover coughs and sneezes ——



- Always cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or use the inside of your elbow.
- Throw used tissues in the trash.
- Immediately **wash your hands** with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not readily available, clean your hands with a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.

Clean and disinfect -





Appreciate all the great outdoors has to offer while wandering through trails that feature wildlife and breathtaking scenic views. Be sure to explore the natural beauty at:

Hogeye Preserve Pathway •

The Hogeve Preserve Pathway winds through the neighborhoods and amenities near the Cattail Recreation Area and Pitch & Putt. This pathway was created for Villagers to take a walk, wander over to a local recreation center, jog through their favorite park or go for a bike ride. Golf cars are not allowed on the pathway, as it was not designed for this purpose.

Fenney Springs Nature Trail

Fenney Spring is a 2nd order magnitude spring with an average daily flow of 9 million gallons and a temperature of 73.6 F. Water from Fenney Spring flows southwest to Lake Panasoffkee.

Sharon Rose Weichens Preserve

The Sharon Rose Wiechens Preserve opened on Moyer Loop in September 2015 as The Villages' first publicly accessible nature preserve. The 625-acre wetland is home to dozens of animals and amphibians, such as rabbits, cranes, squirrels and frogs. A 400-square-foot observation deck provides plenty of space for nature enthusiasts to take in their surroundings.

During the Spring of 2020, District Property Management was busy updating the softballs fields in The Villages.

Knudson and Saddlebrook Fields received updated scoreboards with enhanced LED lighting and screening was put in front of the new scoreboards to provide protection.

Soaring Eagle and Saddlebrook Fields had chilled water fountains installed. Knudson Field is in the process of receiving a chilled water fountain.

In the coming months, Saddlebrook will have new flooring installed in the scoring booths and the counter surfaces will be refinished.

Soaring Eagle will have the clay reworked for the improvement of the field.

First Responder Recreation Center Area

The District is proceeding with the design for the new First Responder Recreation Center and is currently on schedule for the project to commence construction in early 2021. Currently, the open areas of the property are unimproved and not intended for public use.

At the scheduled August 2020 Amenity Authority Committee meeting there was a discussion, including resident input, which described current unintended and unauthorized use of the property. The unauthorized use not only impacts neighboring residents, but also exposes the District to additional liability. Examples of unauthorized uses described include using the property as a dog park while allowing pets to run off leash, a practice golf area and after hours gathering spot for the public.

At the conclusion of these discussions, the Amenity Authority Committee requested that the District investigate the posting of signage, to eliminate any unauthorized use of the property. The District will be presenting options for the proposed signage at the scheduled September 2020 AAC meeting.

Beginning October 1, 2020, all solid waste and yard waste in the Village Community Development Districts 1-11, located in Sumter County, Marion County and The Villages of Fruitland Park, will be collected and transported by Jacobs to the Covanta Lake II, Inc.

During the month of September, an informational handout will be inserted in your monthly utility bill explaining the guidelines for single stream sanitation collection. Information will also be posted to the District website, sent via e-Notification, posted on all mail station bulletin boards and media outlets will be notified.

The District's waste hauler, Jacobs, has optimized their routes so a small percentage of residents will have a change in pick up days. For those with changes, Community Watch will be placing a door knob hanger on your door advising you of the change during the month of September. Each household will have pick up twice per week, Monday & Thursday or Tuesday & Friday. There will not be a separate day for yard waste collection, both household and yard waste will be collected on each of your designated days. All household waste should be placed in a sealed 20-30 gallon trash bag of any color and placed at the end of your driveway before 6:00 a.m. on your collection day, or the night before no earlier than 5:00 p.m.

Sumter County Schools Supply Drive a Success

The Sumter County School Board, Teachers and Students are very grateful for the generosity of The Villages residents.

At the Aug. 18th Sumter County School Board Meeting, Sally Moss, School Board Member, shared that residents of The Villages had donated over \$5,000 worth of School Supplies and \$2,543 in monetary donations during the First Annual Sumter County Public Schools Supply Drive. This supply drive was held Aug. 12-14th at three Regional Recreation Centers in The Villages. School Board Members, District Staff and others who were present at the board meeting were overwhelmed with the generosity of The Villages Residents.

The School District Transportation Department transported the school supplies daily to Student Services Director, Eileen Goodson, at the School District Office in Bushnell. Ms. Goodson and her staff organized the supplies by type and had them ready for School Principals to select what they need for their students. These supplies will be given to the students who can not afford to purchase the necessary supplies for their personal use in the classroom. The Sumter County Public Schools are all Federal Title One Schools where the rate of being economically disadvantaged ranges from 55% to 90%.

The monetary donations received will be divided up between the eight public schools based on the number of students enrolled. These schools will use the funds to purchase supplies according to their individual needs.



Little Sumter Service Area Water Tower

The Little Sumter Service Area (LSSA) Water Tower located at 1245 Augustine Drive will undergo scheduled maintenance and repair that began Monday, August 17, 2020. This project is expected to take approximately two weeks to complete and the work will not impact any pedestrian, golf cart or vehicular traffic.

Information Provided by...

Waterlily Bridge

The Waterlily Bridge that will be placed over Florida's Turnpike near the Waterlily Recreation Center is scheduled to be placed on August 26th and August 27th, weather permitting. For the safety of all residents, guests and workers, the Waterlily Recreation Center, parking lot and surrounding area, including Marsh Bend Trail, will be closed beginning at 5:00 p.m. on August 26th. The roadway and recreation facilities are anticipated to be reopened by 6:00 a.m. on August 27th. Please use caution in this area and pay attention to all directional signage. The Sumter County Sheriff's Office and Wildwood Police Department will also be present to assist in ensuring the safety of The Villages community. In addition, information provided by The Florida Department of Transportation regarding additional road closures is included for your convenience.

Information Provided By The Florida Department of Transportation

As part of the Multi-Modal Bridge project over Florida's Turnpike at milepost 303, in Sumter County, we will be performing a full closure of northbound and southbound Florida's Turnpike between CR 470 (Exit 296) and US 301 (Exit 304) to allow crews to set the bridge.

To perform this work, traffic will be detoured during the following dates and times:

Northbound and southbound Florida's Turnpike/SR 91 between CR 470 (Exit 296) and US 301 (Exit 304)

Overnight full road closure, <u>11 p.m. Wednesday, August 26</u>, to <u>5 a.m. Thursday, August 27</u>.

If necessary, this closure may also occur <u>from 11 p.m. Thursday, August 27</u>, to <u>5 a.m.</u> <u>Friday, August 28.</u>

Detour information:

- Northbound Florida's Turnpike/SR 91 traffic wishing to continue north will be directed to exit at County Road (CR) 470 (Exit 296), travel east on CR 470 to US 27, travel north on US 27 to SR 44, travel west on SR <u>44 to W. Main Street</u>/SR 44, continue west on SR 44 to US 301 and travel south on US 301 to access northbound Florida's Turnpike.
- Southbound Florida's Turnpike/SR 91 traffic wishing to continue south will be directed to exit at US 301 (Exit 304), travel south on US <u>301 to Commercial</u> <u>Street</u>/US 301, continue south on US 301 to CR 470 and travel east on CR 470 to access southbound Florida's Turnpike.
- Okahumpka Service Plaza traffic wishing to access northbound Florida's Turnpike/SR 91 will be directed to travel south on Florida's Turnpike and exit at County Road (CR) 470 (Exit 296), travel east on CR 470 to US 27, travel north on US 27 to SR 44, travel west on SR <u>44 to W. Main Street</u>/SR 44, continue west on SR 44 to US 301 and travel south on US 301 to access northbound Florida's Turnpike.

During the closure, motorists will not have access to the Okahumpka Service Plaza. The Turkey Lake Service Plaza located at milepost 263 will work as an alternate stop for drivers. Please note this schedule may change due to inclement weather or unforeseen conditions.

District Property Management (DPM) has received the necessary permit modification from Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) to complete work within Wetland 88 (District wetland asset identification) under conditions of the Environmental Resources Permit. Regular updates of the District's progress to design, permit and advance the work are presented monthly to the District 10 Board of Supervisors. Now that the design is complete and the permit modification has been approved by SWFWMD, the District is proceeding with the procurement of a contractor to complete the work within the wetland. DPM will present a recommendation to award the contract for this project within Wetland 88 to the Project Wide Advisory Committee (PWAC) and the Sumter Landing Community Development District (SLCDD) for approval to proceed with the award of the contract.

The engineering review process of all existing conditions potentially impacting the pavement life span was necessary to develop the best solution to provide improved pavement conditions. It was determined from the review of the geotechnical borings performed that the pavement condition was being impacted by the seasonal groundwater intrusion into the pavement subgrade. Once the project within the wetlands is completed, DPM will monitor the groundwater elevations beneath the road surface for a few months to verify the intended results are achieved. Once the intended results are verified, the District will be able to move forward with the planned pavement restoration project. Based on current schedules the paving project is most likely to occur late in 2020 as part of the fiscal year 20-21 budget (beginning October 2020). The District will continue to provide regular updates to the District 10 Board, PWAC and Villa residents regarding project milestones and related project progress. Thank you for your patience and be assured the District is working diligently to provide a long-term and cost-effective pavement restoration solution.
