National Public Safety Telecommunicator Week: April 10 – 16, 2022

Every year during the second week of April, the telecommunications personnel in the public safety community, are honored. National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week celebrates and thanks those who dedicate their lives to serving the public. It is a week that should be set aside so everyone can be made aware of their hard work and dedication.

Every day and night all across the country, public safety telecommunicators answer emergency and non-emergency calls. They connect callers to emergency care and provide valuable resources to those in need.

An estimated 240 million calls are made to 9-1-1 in the U.S. each year. In many areas, 80% or more are from wireless devices. (<u>https://www.nena.org/page/911Statistics</u>)

How to observe Public Safety Telecommunicator Week:

- Review 911 emergency call advice
- 9-1-1 is for police, fire, and medical emergencies only. Non-emergency calls should be directed to non-emergency phone numbers.
- Details are critical. Stay on the line with the 9-1-1 operator and answer all their questions. Provide an accurate location. If you do not know the exact address, provide the call taker with all the details that you can. Look for landmarks, cross streets, signs, and buildings. First responders need an accurate location to respond as fast as possible.
- Try to stay calm and speak clearly.
- Don't hang up when calling 9-1-1. If you called by mistake, let the operator know.
- DO NOT call 9-1-1 for jokes or prank calls.

National Public Safety Telecommunicator Week History:

Patricia Anderson of Contra Costa County (Calif.) Sheriff's Office conceived the idea for a National Public Safety Telecommunicator Week in 1981. It was quickly adopted in Virginia and North Carolina. By the 1990s, the national association of Public-Safety Communications Officials (APCO) convinced Congress of the need for a formal proclamation.

In 1994, National Public Safety Telecommunicator Week was formally recognized and is celebrated each year during the second full week of April to coincide with National 9-1-1 Education Month.



Annual Plantings

Annual plants or "Seasonal Color" are plants that grow from seed to flower, produce seeds, and die within a single growing season.

On District property within The Villages, landscape contractors install around 2 million (and counting) annuals every year, replanting by hand every quarter to coordinate with Florida weather and seasons for a full color appearance throughout the year.

These annuals are contract grown in nurseries around the state of Florida. Once the plants are ready, it is crucial that they be installed quickly to avoid becoming root bound in the container and shortening their life expectancy.

We do not specify the species as long as they are plants proven to work in our area and adhere to the design intent within The Villages. This provides a change of color as you move through The Villages.

As we enter another busy month here in our beautiful community, please follow all traffic laws and be courteous to residents, visitors, vendors and contractors out on the road with you. Try to avoid crashes on the road whenever possible.


The Top Causes of Crashes nationally:

- Speeding
- Right of Way Violation
- Distracted Driving

Speeding

Tips to avoid Speeding and Aggressive Driving

- Plan ahead for your trip to avoid rushing to your destination.
- Know the speed limit.
- Regularly check your speed or use your cruise control.
- Reduce speed in work zones, school zones, and when road conditions require it.



- When you are in left lane and someone wants to pass, move over and let them go by you.
- Give speeding drivers plenty of space.
- Adjust your driving accordingly.
- Call the police if you feel another driver is harassing or following you.

Right of Way Violation

The Right of Way is a set of rules determining who goes first and who must wait when interacting with other vehicles.

Examples of violating the right of way include:

- Failure to yield.
- Failure to stop at a stop sign.
- Disregarding a traffic signal.
- Merging errors.

The law does not give anyone the right of way on the road - it states who is required to yield the right of way in certain instances. It is the responsibility of the driver to do everything possible to be safe and avoid a collision.

- Never assume what another driver is going to do.
- Never insist on taking the right of way.
- Yield whenever it's needed to be safe.
- Make eye contact with other drivers at intersections when possible.

Visual — anything that takes your eyes off the road

- Electronics GPS, audio player, cellphone, etc.
- Eating, drinking and smoking.
- Focusing on things outside of the vehicle collisions, police activity, billboards, pedestrians, etc.

Physical – anything that takes your hands off the wheel

- Eating/drinking
- Talking on a hand held device.
- Reaching to the back seat, console, or glove box.

Cognitive - anything that takes your mind off of your driving

- Daydreaming, writing.
- "Multitasking".


Avoid the temptation to have multiple distractions at one time!

Can signs be attached to light poles or stop signs?

Due to recent increases in items attached to street signs, stop signs and light poles, the District would like to remind residents that balloons, ribbons, yard sale signs or any other materials attached to street signs can cause damage and are not permitted. In addition, signs are not permitted on District property, including right of way areas, in cul-de-sacs or in roundabouts to ensure the safety of all motorists, pedestrians and property. Signage can cause distractions to motorists, as well as cause line of sight problems.





If so, these and other hazardous chemicals and items should not be placed in your regular household trash. The following locations will accept these items and more. Please contact the appropriate disposal site for full details.

Marion County

Marion County residents can dispose of the following items at any of the county's 18 recycling centers:

- Used motor oil and oil filters
- Household and automotive batteries
- Latex paint
- Household electronics (accepted at Baseline, Dunnellon, Forest Corners, Fort McCoy, Martel, Newton, and **Weirsdale (13535 SE 164th ST)** recycling centers in the big green compactor boxes labeled "electronics recycling")

Lake County residents can dispose of hazardous waste at the Household Hazardous Waste Center located at **13130 County Landfill Road, County Road 561, Tavares** <u>with proof of residency</u>. There are also Mobile Unit Events held throughout the year in various Lake County locations.

- Automotive fluids (Antifreeze, Gasoline, Motor Oil, etc.)
- Paint Products
- Lawn/Garden (Fertilizers, Insecticides, Pesticides, etc)
- Propane cylinders

HOW TO PACKAGE AND TRANSPORT CHEMICALS

- 1. Do NOT mix chemicals together.
- 2. Keep products in original labeled containers if possible.

- 4. Place leaky container in clear plastic bag and transport in box with newspaper.
- 5. Put boxes in trunk or in back of vehicle away from passengers.

WATER SYSTEM MAINTENANCE

Preventative maintenance is occurring on the potable water system field valves throughout many areas of The Villages. Those customers serviced by Village Center Service Area (VCSA), Little Sumter Service Area (LSSA), North Sumter Utilities (NSU), Central Sumter Utilities (CSU) and South Sumter Utilities (SSU) that will be impacted will be notified 24 hours in advance of a temporary interruption in service and will receive the following notification:

THE PUBLIC DRINKING WATER MAINS IN YOUR AREA WILL BE SHUT DOWN TEMPORARILY FOR NEEDED MAINTENANCE. AS A PRECAUTION, UPON RETURN OF WATER SERVICE, WE ADVISE THAT <u>ALL WATER USED FOR DRINKING, MAKING ICE,</u> <u>AND COOKING BE BOILED, FOR ALL OTHER HOUSE</u> <u>HOLD USES THE WATER IS ACCEPTABLE.</u> A ROLLING BOIL OF ONE MINUTE IS SUFFICIENT. AS AN ALTERNATIVE, BOTTLED WATER MAY BE USED.

THIS "PRECAUTIONARY BOIL WATER NOTICE" WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL THE MAINTENANCE TASK HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND A BACTERIOLOGICAL SURVEY SHOWS THAT THE WATER IS SAFE TO DRINK. THIS USUALLY CONSISTS OF A TWO-DAY SAMPLING PERIOD TO INSURE SAFE DRINKING WATER.

A notice with the addresses of the affected area along with this information will be left at the door of all impacted addresses. 





RULES OF THE **R**OAD

- 1. Be 14 years or older to drive a golf car
- Drive on neighborhood streets, marked roadside lanes, and multi-modal paths
- Obey all traffic laws, signs and signals
- 4. Golf cars are subject to Florida's open alcoholic container laws

- 5. Speed not to exceed 20mph
- 6. Use hand and turn signals
- 7. Yield to automobiles
- 8. Come to a full stop at stop signs
- 9. Never enter a roundabout in a golf car
- Golf cars are prohibited from roadways with posted speeds of 35mph or more

SAFETY TIPS

- 1. Provide a seat for each person/pet
- 2. Secure children and pets
- 3. Keep passengers seated in golf car
- 4. Keep arms and legs inside golf car
- 5. Enter traffic lane safely before turning left
- 6. Be aware of vehicles turning right (across the golf car lane)
- 7. Maintain golf car according to manufacturer's recommendations
- 8. Do not text/phone while driving
- 9. Limit passing slower golf cars
- 10. Pull off the path when you need to stop

BEFORE YOU DRIVE

Make sure the horn, brakes and lights work. Check back-up alarm, tire pressure and applicable gauges. Before backing up, look behind and see that all is clear.
