
All recreation centers, outdoor facilities and swimming pools will remain open for your enjoyment on Independence Day — Monday, July 4, 2022.





#### Why is July 15, 2022 an important date?

This year's Bond cut-off date is July 15, 2022 which is an important date for any resident who would like to pay off their Bond in full. If the Bond is paid off in full by 5:00 PM on July 15, 2022, the bond assessment will no longer appear on your annual County Property tax bill. This option allows residents to save on future interest payments. Payments must be received in our office by 5:00 PM on July 15, 2022 in order for timely processing. Payments can be made in person by scheduling an appointment at the District Customer Service Center or by mail to District Customer Service at 984 Old Mill Run, The Villages, FL.

# If mailing in your payment, please mail it early to allow extra time for your payment to reach our office. I

If you opt not to pay off your Bond in full, you will continue to pay in annual installments. If you have any questions, please contact the Bond Team by email at bonds@districtgov.org or by phone at 352-751-3900.

#### **Recreation Center Emergency Address Information**

Our dedicated staff is here to help you get the most out of your unique Villages lifestyle. When enjoying your choice of activities, we ask that you remember participating in recreational activities always involves some degree of risk. Participants assume full responsibility for and risk of bodily injury arising out of or in any way connected with participation or involvement in or presence at the activity or program. To assist you in emergency situations, the Recreation Department has provided all outside recreation areas with a bulletin board that has important 911 information including the address, county and phone number you are calling from.

Emergency 911 phones are located at all equipment buildings and pools with pertinent emergency information. We encourage all residents to become familiar with their recreation centers and 911 information. When visiting any recreation center or swimming pool, please take a moment to locate these helpful areas.



#### **Family Pools**

The Villages Recreation & Parks Department Family Pools are designated with an 'FP' next to their name on maps, signs, etc. and are associated with the Village recreation centers. These pools are for all residents and their guests, regardless of age. When visiting these pools with young guests, please follow all posted pool hours, guidelines and regulations. Additional rules for Family Pools are:

- Have children 36 months of age or younger wear protective swim products.
- Running, horseplay and throwing of any objects in the pool or deck area is prohibited.
- Noodles, unbreakable masks, goggles, and small plastic buckets are the only items allowed in the pool.
- Please encourage small guests to take bathroom breaks.
- Approved life vests are permitted. Infant and toddler flotation devices are allowed with adult supervision.
- No pets are allowed in the pool area.
- In the event of an emergency, dial 911.
- Pools and outdoor facilities close at dusk (30 minutes after sunset).
- If a staff member is on-site, please check in with them. Please have your Villages ID or Guest ID and photo ID with you at all times.

#### **Smoke & Vape Free Zone Policy**

The Smoke & Vape Free Zone policy establishes a Smoke & Vape Free Zone that prohibits smoking within a minimum of 25 feet from any entrance to recreation center buildings. Smoking refers to the use of traditional tobacco products. Vaping refers to the use of electronic nicotine delivery systems or electronic smoking devices. These are commonly called e-cigarettes, e-pipes, e-hookahs and e-cigars.

Smoking will be permitted only in designated areas where ash cans are located.



#### **Smoke Detector Program**

Did you know that The Villages Public Safety Department offers smoke detector assistance to residents of The Villages as part of the Fall Prevention Program?



- This program is designed for residents who are disabled or unable to climb ladders.
- The Villages Public Safety Department recommends batteries be changed once per year.
- Residents are required to purchase the brand new nine-volt batteries or detectors before they call for assistance.
- Smoke alarms are designed to signal with a single beep which repeats every few minutes to alert you that the battery needs to be changed. Three to five beeps at a single time is a signal that the detector needs to be replaced.
- On average, a smoke detector lasts roughly ten years, and the combination smoke/carbon monoxide units last around five to seven years.
- If your detectors are beeping non-stop please leave the home and call 911. It may be signaling a fire or carbon monoxide emergency.
- The homes in The Villages are designed to have hardwired detectors. Smoke
  detectors are located inside of the bedrooms and in the main living area. A
  smoke carbon monoxide combination unit is installed directly outside of the
  bedrooms.

The model numbers for the detectors that are installed in your home are manufactured by BRK under the name First Alert. The model number for the smoke detector is 9120B and the model number of the combination smoke/carbon detector is SC9120B.



#### **Smoke Detector Program Continued**

- For those residents that are hearing impaired, there are several types of detectors that may be right for you such as strobe light detectors or detectors that can shake the bed in the event of a fire. For more information on these detectors, please stop by The Villages Public Safety Administration office at 3035 S. Morse Boulevard Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM to obtain a brochure or visit our website at <a href="Districtgov.org">Districtgov.org</a>.
- Smoke detector battery changes and/or installations can be arranged by calling 352-205-8280 Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 5:00 AM. If it is after hours or on the weekend and you have a beeping detector, call 352-205-8280 and select option 1 on the recording to be connected to Community Watch Dispatch.
- There is no charge for this service.
- Appointments are for same-day service and are on a first come first serve basis.
- The Villages Public Safety Department employees will arrive at your home in uniform, with a visible name badge. They will also have a ladder with them.
- As a reminder, this assistance is strictly for smoke detectors. The employees visiting your home will not be able to assist you with non-related smoke detector issues or concerns such as light bulbs.

- Please be aware that individuals using mobility devices have equal access to all of our beautiful paths and trails.
- Please slow and ride single file when experiencing heavy traffic on a path.
- When passing someone traveling in the same direction, please slow and allow for oncoming traffic to pass before going around that cart, bicycle or pedestrian.
- Always use caution by controlling the speed of your golf car or bicycle so you
  have time to react to other users who may be stopping or slowing more
  suddenly.






#### **Share the Road**

Again, we are currently in the busy season and so we are seeing some of the highest volumes of vehicles on our roadways. We hope that all will exercise caution on our roadways and share the road with other vehicles.

- Obey the speed limit.
- Keep a safe distance from vehicle ahead of you to allow for stopping, turning, or changing lanes.
- The left lane on our roads is the passing lane until nearing a roundabout.
- Headlights help with visibility even when sunny.
- Please slow to 5 mph when entering gate areas and expect the gate to close after each vehicle.
- Share the road with bicycles. They are a vehicle in the state of Florida and you must allow 3 feet between you and the left handlebar of the bicycle when passing.

#### **Ducks or Frogs in the Storm Drains**

This time of year, Community Watch Dispatch receives many calls from residents who report hearing ducks in the storm drains. From time to time, a family of ducks will find their way into a storm drain, either by going into the discharge end or simply by falling into the storm grate at street level. Most often though, the quacking noises residents are hearing are not actually 'quacking' noises. They are croaking noises from the multitude of frogs that reside in Florida. Florida is home to 27 different native species of frogs, several of which sound just like ducks. With the summer months being our rainy season, frogs are out and about and very populous in The Villages. To learn more about the native species of frogs living in Florida, please click on the following link — <u>UF Florida Wildlife Extension</u>.

If Community Watch does find that there is wildlife other than frogs (such as ducks) in a storm drain, a plan of action begins that may include The Villages Public Safety Department, District Property Management or the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission to assist in removing storm grates or climbing down manholes to make a rescue. We attempt to use all resources at our disposal to make a safe rescue of any wildlife that happens to make its way into the storm system of The Villages.
