Independence Day Recreation Information


All recreation centers, outdoor facilities and swimming pools will remain open for your enjoyment on Independence Day — Monday, July 4, 2022.

With the upcoming Fourth of July weekend, Risk Management hopes that you will take a moment to review the following safety reminders to help ensure you and your loved ones have a happy and safe holiday.



Fireworks Safety

- The safest way to enjoy fireworks is to attend a public fireworks show put on by professionals.
- Never give fireworks to small children, and never throw or point a firework toward people, animals, vehicles, structures or flammable materials. Always follow the instructions on the packaging.
- Keep a supply of water close by as a precaution.
- Use eye protection when handling.
- Light only one firework at a time and never attempt to relight "a dud."
- Store fireworks in a cool, dry place away from children and pets.

Food Safety

- Wash your hands before preparing food or before eating.
- Don't leave food out in the hot sun. Keep perishable foods in a cooler with plenty of ice or freezer gel packs.
- Keep the grill out in the open, away from the house, the deck, tree branches or anything that could catch fire.
- Always supervise the grill when in use. Don't add charcoal starter fluid when coals have already been ignited. Use the long-handled tools especially made for cooking on the grill to keep the chef safe.
- Make sure everyone, including pets, stays away from the grill.



Outdoor safety

- Watch the weather and go indoors at the first sight of lightning or rumble of thunder. Stay inside for 30 minutes after the last lightning flash or thunder roar.
- Stay away from water after the last lightning flashes or thunder roars.
- Drink plenty of fluids even if you don't feel thirsty.
- Wear and reapply sunscreen as indicated on the package.
- Wear light, loose-fitting clothes to keep cool.

Swimming Safety

- Provide close and constant attention to children you are supervising in or near water.
- Always enter water feet first.
- Swim only at a beach with a lifeguard, within the designated swimming area. Obey all instructions and orders from lifeguards and ask them about local conditions.



- Make sure you swim sober and that you always swim with a buddy. Know your limitations and make sure you have enough energy to swim back to shore.
- If you are caught in a rip current, try not to panic. Signal to those on shore that you need assistance. Swim parallel to the shore until you are out of the current. Once you are free, swim toward shore.

Driving Safety

- Do not drink and drive, even when you think you don't have too far to go!
- Buckle up, it saves lives, and it is the law.
- Avoid fatigue driving when traveling.
- Do not text and drive, minimize all cell phone use.
- Watch your speed and keep safe following distances.

Why is July 15, 2022 an important date?

This year's Bond cut-off date is July 15, 2022 which is an important date for any resident who would like to pay off their Bond in full. If the Bond is paid off in full by 5:00 PM on July 15, 2022, the bond assessment will no longer appear on your annual County Property tax bill. This option allows residents to save on future interest payments. Payments must be received in our office by 5:00 PM on July 15, 2022 in order for timely processing. Payments can be made in person by scheduling an appointment at the District Customer Service Center or by mail to District Customer Service at 984 Old Mill Run, The Villages, FL.

If mailing in your payment, please mail it early to allow extra time for your payment to reach our office.

If you opt not to pay off your Bond in full, you will continue to pay in annual installments. If you have any questions, please contact the Bond Team by email at bonds@districtgov.org or by phone at 352-751-3900.





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Online Utility Billing - Troubleshooting

We have made a few adjustments to our Utility Billing Online Inquiry. Please see updates below:

- You can now search by the original criteria of service address, account number or name.
- We have used our billing software to show past history usage, including charts.
- As we are working on the PDF bills, via Invoice Cloud, please know we are working our best to get this feature updated.

New Payment Processing rates – Invoice Cloud:

- E-Check went from \$1 with Point and Pay to \$.95 with Invoice Cloud.
- Credit/Debit Card went from 2.3% with Point and Pay to 2.75% with Invoice Cloud.
- The changes with autopay have not changed. If you pay with your banking account (checking or savings) there is no fee. Same thing with BillPay services.

Accounts can be accessed either by Name, Address, or Account Number

Name – Enter the last name associated with the account.

Address – Enter the street address (beginning numbers only).

Account Number - Enter the Complete Account Number including letter at the beginning - X000-000-00.

- You DO put the beginning letter that appears in front of the account number (it will be either a L, V, N, C, or S). This is used to identify the utility company.
- If you are having difficulty check your web browser security settings, sometimes
 these have been set at a higher level and dropping it down allows the access to
 occur.
- Sign In Not required at this time.
- Register Not required at this time.

Wildlife Precaution: Alligators

As you enjoy life in The Villages, you are surrounded by beautiful wetlands, preserves, and water retention areas. These areas make great recreation areas for walking, fishing, relaxing and enjoying the beauty of native Florida habitats.



As you enjoy these natural areas, please keep in mind that they are the home to many types of wildlife which you should be aware of to ensure your safety, as well as that of children and your pets. The largest and most visible predator is alligators. Here are some facts to help us co-exist with these beautiful animals.

- Dogs and cats are similar in size to the natural prey of alligators. Do not swim or allow pets to swim, exercise or drink in or near waters that may contain alligators. When walking a pet next to the water edge, please keep a safe distance and make sure they are on a leash.
- Observe and photograph alligators only from a distance. Remember, they're an important part of Florida's natural history as well as an integral component of aquatic ecosystems.
- **Never feed alligators** it's dangerous and illegal. When fed, alligators can overcome their natural wariness and fear of humans and will learn to associate people with food, which can be a deadly combination.



- During mating season, which occurs between May and June, you may see these typically lazy creatures become a bit more athletic and become significantly more active. Male alligators can travel over 5 miles in some cases looking for a female.
- Alligators are most active between dusk and dawn — be aware as you move through these areas in the evening and at night.



- Male alligators can grow up to 15 feet, and female alligators can grow up to 9 feet. There are an estimated 1.25 million alligators in the state of Florida alone, and an estimated 200,000 in the Everglades. Alligators are territorial and will fight other alligators to defend their young.
- Nearly every body of water in Florida contains alligators, including our more than 500 water retention areas across The Villages.
- Run *straight* away from an alligator, do not zigzag. Most people say you can escape an alligator if you run in a zigzag pattern, but that's not necessarily accurate. Have you ever noticed how an alligator bites by swinging its mouth left or right? That's because alligators are virtually blind straight in front of their nose, so running zigzag might actually help them spot you quicker.

An alligator's bite is one of the strongest in the animal kingdom. Biology Professor Greg Erickson from Florida State University researched more about the strength of an alligator's bite and said, "If you were in the jaws of an alligator and trying to get out, it would be like trying to lift a pickup truck off of yourself." American alligators rank as having the third strongest bite force in the animal kingdom, following just behind the Salt Water and Nile crocodiles.

An alligator eats mainly fish, turtles, various mammals, birds and other reptiles. An alligator has roughly 80 teeth in its mouth at one time, as the teeth wear down they are replaced with new teeth. An average alligator can go through 2,000 to 3,000 teeth in a lifetime.

Leave alligators alone. State law prohibits feeding, killing, harassing or possessing alligators. Handling even small alligators can result in injury.



Can I park a truck or RV on the street?

The District's adopted rule (Rule) for **home** units state: No trucks over ¾ ton size, boats or recreational vehicles shall be parked, stored or otherwise remain on any lot or street except for service vehicles located thereon on a temporary basis while performing a service for a resident.


What does that mean? If a vehicle is parked in the street and does not meet the aforementioned criteria, there would not be a violation of the Rule. However, if a resident is parking a vehicle in excess of 3/4 ton in size, a boat or recreational vehicle in the street, it would be a violation of the Rule and the Community Standards Department would follow the process of bringing the property into compliance.

What happens if a resident parks a recreational vehicle on the street, moves the vehicle, brings the vehicle back and then moves it again? Each District Board has adopted their Rule to address this type of situation. The Rule states:



The term "Re-Occurring Violations" means a violation of a provision of the Rule by an owner who has been previously notified to have violated the same provision of the Rule within twelve (12) months prior to the current violation. If the Community Standards Department receives a complaint regarding a re-occurring violation, staff is not required to provide the owner a reasonable time to correct the violation. Instead, staff would send a notification of a public hearing to be held before the District Board of Supervisors within the district they reside. The case may be presented to the Board even if the re-occurring violation has been corrected prior to the public hearing. If the re-occurring violation is brought into compliance prior to the public hearing, the Board may make a finding of guilt but shall not impose a fine.

MOSQUITO BITE PREVENTION

HOW TO PROTECT AGAINST MOSQUITO BITES



Mosquitoes bite during the day and night. They live indoors and outdoors. Protect your family from mosquito bites. Use insect repellent, wear long-sleeved shirts and pants, and take steps to control mosquitoes indoors and outdoors.

Use insect repellent


 Use Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)-registered insect repellents with one of the following active ingredients: DEET, picaridin, IR3535,oil of lemon eucalyptus, para-menthane-diol, or 2-undecanone.



- · Always follow product label instructions.
- · Reapply insect repellent as directed.
 - » Do not spray repellent on the skin under clothing.
 - » If you are also using sunscreen, apply sunscreen first and insect repellent second.
- The effectiveness of non-EPA registered insect repellents, including some natural repellents, is not known.

Wear long-sleeved shirts, pants Treat clothes and gear

- · Wear long-sleeved shirts and pants.
- Treat items such as boots, pants, socks, and tents with permethrin or buy permethrin-treated clothing and gear.



- » Permethrin-treated clothing will protect you after multiple washings. See product information to find out how long the protection will last.
- » If treating items yourself, follow the product instructions.
- · Do not use permethrin products directly on skin.

MOSQUITO BITE PREVENTION

Protect babies and children

- Always follow instructions when applying insect repellent to children.
- · Do not use insect repellent on babies younger than 2 months old.
 - » Instead dress your child in clothing that covers arms and legs.
 - » Cover strollers and baby carriers with mosquito netting.
- Do not use products containing oil of lemon eucalyptus (OLE) or para-menthane-diol (PMD) on children younger than 3 years old.
- Do not apply insect repellent onto a child's hands, eyes, mouth, cuts or irritated skin.
 - » Adults: spray insect repellent onto your hands and then apply to a child's face.





Control mosquitoes indoors

- · Keep windows and doors shut and use air conditioning if possible.
- Use, install, or repair window and door screens.
- Once a week, empty or throw out any items that hold water like vases and flowerpot saucers.
- Use an indoor insect fogger or indoor insect spray to kill mosquitoes and treat areas where they rest. These products work immediately, but may need to be reapplied. Always follow label instructions.

Control mosquitoes outdoors

- Once a week, empty or throw out any items that hold water like vases and flowerpot saucers.
- · Tightly cover water storage containers (buckets, rain barrels, etc.)
- For containers without lids, use mesh with holes smaller than an adult mosquito.
- Use larvicides to treat large containers of water that will not be used for drinking and cannot be covered or dumped out.
- Use an outdoor insect spray in dark humid areas where mosquitoes rest, like under patio furniture or in the carpet or garage. Always follow label instructions.
- If you have a septic tank, repair cracks or gaps. Cover vent or plumbing pipe openings using mesh with holes smaller than an adult mosquito.

WATER SYSTEM MAINTENANCE

Preventative maintenance is occurring on the potable water system field valves throughout many areas of The Villages. Those customers serviced by Village Center Service Area (VCSA), Little Sumter Service Area (LSSA), North Sumter Utilities (NSU), Central Sumter Utilities (CSU) and South Sumter Utilities (SSU) that will be impacted will be notified 24 hours in advance of a temporary interruption in service and will receive the following notification:

THE PUBLIC DRINKING WATER MAINS IN YOUR AREA WILL BE SHUT DOWN TEMPORARILY FOR NEEDED MAINTENANCE. AS A PRECAUTION, UPON RETURN OF WATER SERVICE, WE ADVISE THAT <u>ALL WATER USED</u> FOR DRINKING, MAKING ICE, AND COOKING BE BOILED, FOR ALL OTHER HOUSE HOLD USES THE WATER IS ACCEPTABLE. A ROLLING BOIL OF ONE MINUTE IS SUFFICIENT. AS AN ALTERNATIVE, BOTTLED WATER MAY BE USED.

THIS "PRECAUTIONARY BOIL WATER NOTICE" WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL THE MAINTENANCE TASK HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND A BACTERIOLOGICAL SURVEY SHOWS THAT THE WATER IS SAFE TO DRINK. THIS USUALLY CONSISTS OF A TWO-DAY SAMPLING PERIOD TO INSURE SAFE DRINKING WATER.

What's Happening in Your District Public Hearings

Districts 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 will be holding Public Hearings to discuss Amending and Restating the Chapter II Rule to Bring about Deed Compliance, specifically for:

- Providing for reimbursement of attorneys' fees incurred by the District in
 enforcing its Rules and the deed restrictions, and for the recording of the Order of
 Enforcement in the Public Records of Sumter County, Florida, once entered by
 the District, so that the Order of Enforcement acts as a lien against the violator's
 real property.
- Pressure Washing and Hedge Trimming If a property is found in non-compliance of the Rule's pressure washing and/or hedge/shrubbery trimming requirement, the Board may at the respective public hearing order maintenance of the property to bring the property into compliance with the District's Rule. Such maintenance may include: (a) pressure washing a home, driveway, walkway, fences, or walls; and/or (b) trimming hedges and shrubbery off the soffit and/or rain gutters of the home, and entry to the front door. The cost of any such maintenance shall be borne by and charged to the property owner and shall include the actual cost of maintenance plus an administrative fee in accordance with the Fine Schedule.
