It is the Recreation & Parks Department’s right, as issued by the National Weather Service or Public Safety Department in the event of tornados, hurricanes or other server storm warnings, to close facilities for public safety.

Summer Time in Florida is HOT!

- Tips to protect yourself from heat related stress and illness: Drink cool, nonalcoholic beverages (avoid extremely cold liquids because they can cause cramps); rest; take a cool shower, bath or sponge bath; seek an airconditioned environment; wear lightweight clothing; remain indoors during the heat of the day; do not engage in strenuous activities.
- Tips to help protect elderly (65+) friends and neighbors: Visit older adults at risk at least twice a day to watch them for signs of heat exhaustion; encourage them to increase their fluid intake by drinking cool, nonalcoholic beverages regardless of their activity level; take them to airconditioned locations.
- The Recreation & Parks Department will cancel/postpone outside activities when the temperature with a heat index 104 degrees or higher. This guideline is subject to change depending on the activity as we take into account the health, safety and well-being of all involved.

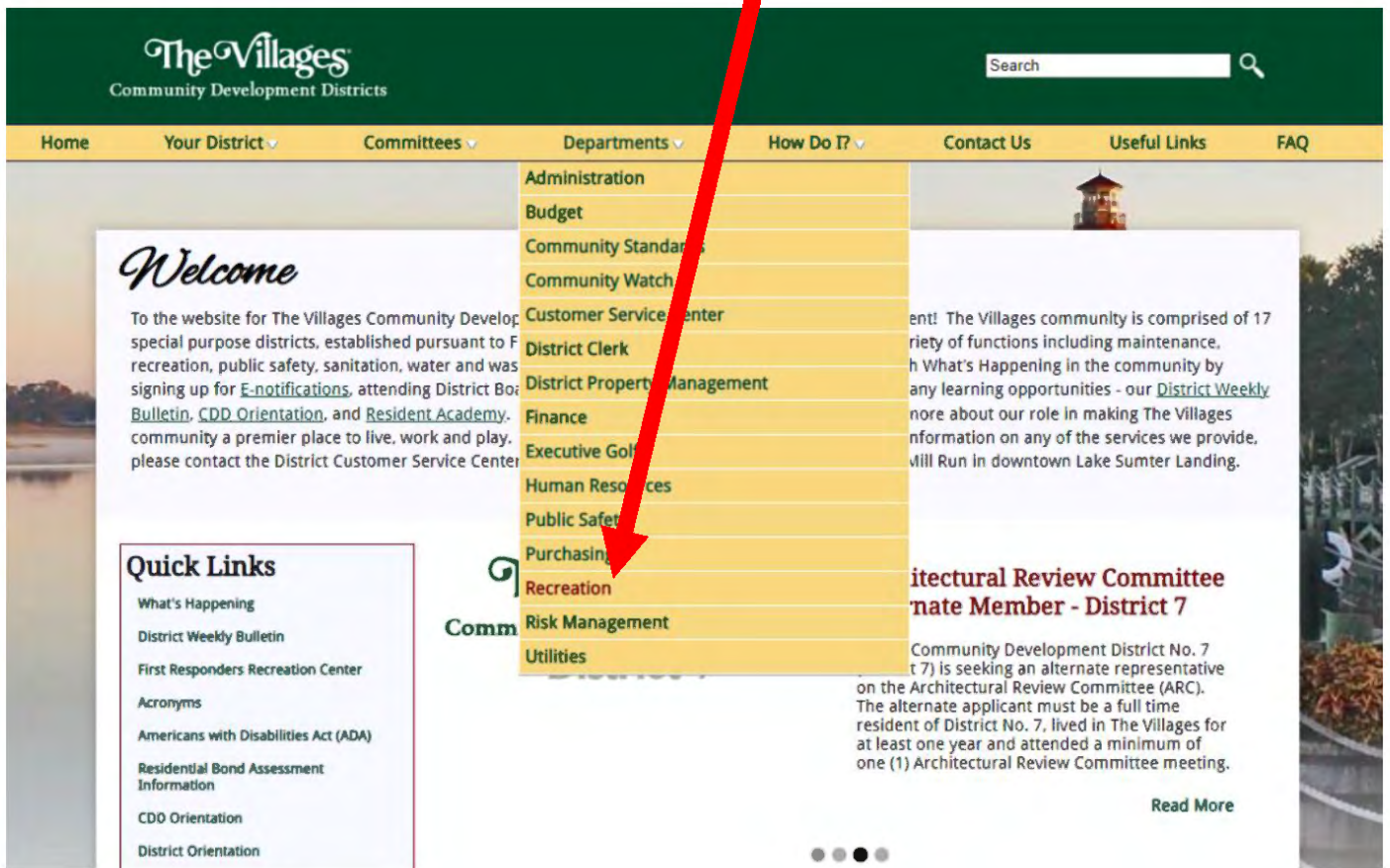


How do I find information about where I can fish in The Villages?

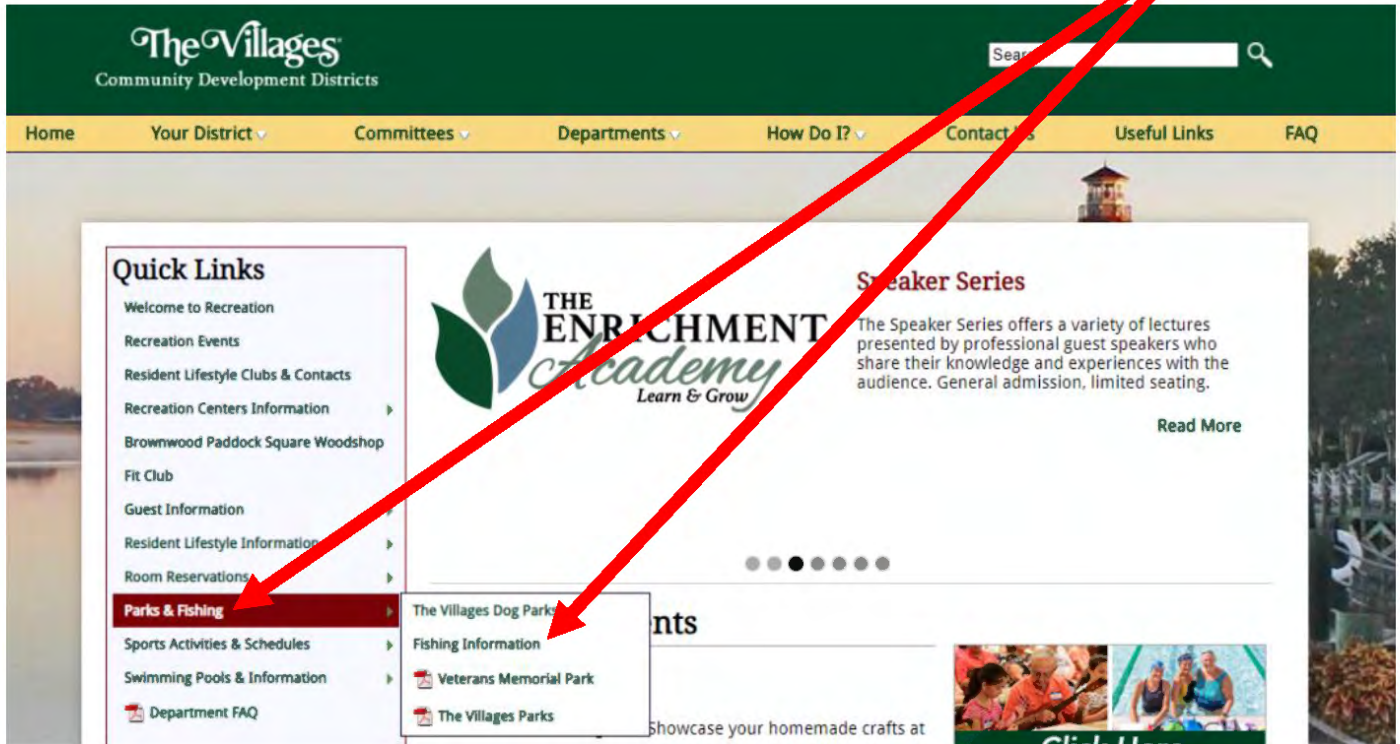

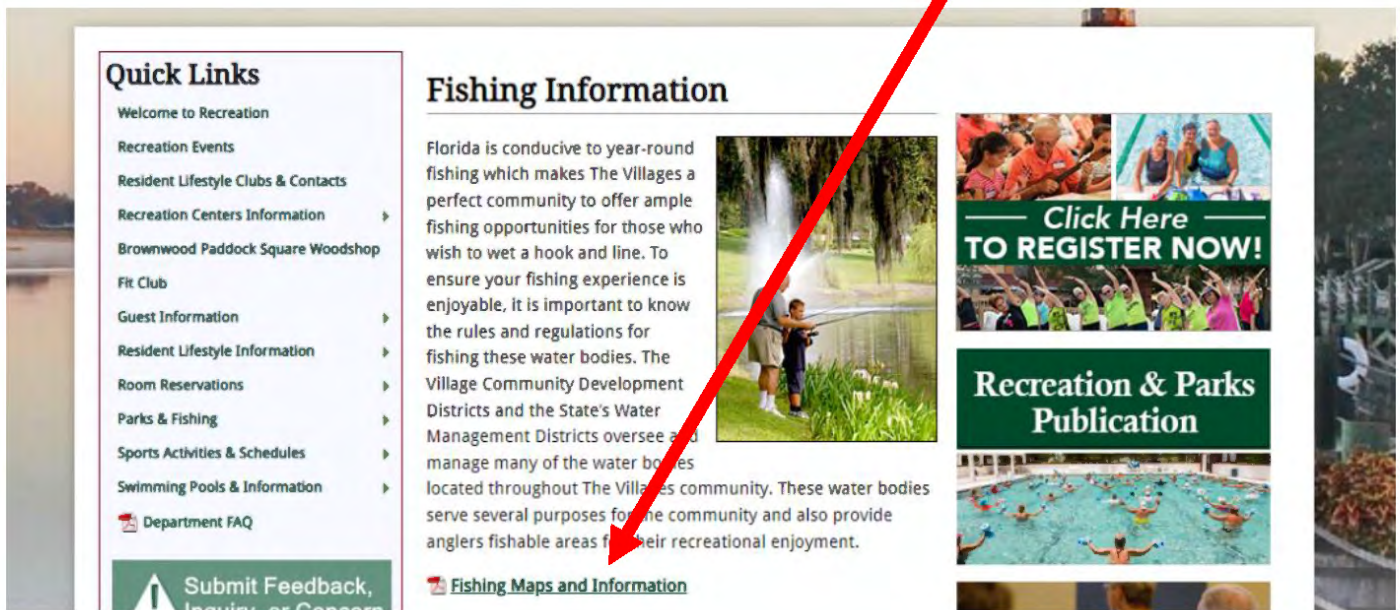

Teamwork makes the dream work in Community Watch!

Sometimes it takes the entire TEAM to get the job done! On July 22, 2022 at 7:33 PM, the Sumter County Sheriff's Office requested Community Watch's assistance in locating a missing person.

After receiving a description of the missing gentlemen's clothing and golf car, Community Watch Dispatcher Christian Traver was able to locate video footage utilizing the Gate Operation cameras of a man and golf car matching that description leaving through the Del Mar gate. This information was then broadcasted to all Community Watch Patrol Drivers. Patrol Supervisor Dave Wilkinson requested that phone notifications be made to the Del Mar and El Cortez gates. Gate Attendant Karen Haley immediately responded over the radio acknowledging the information. Gate Attendant Haley then called into dispatch at 8:05 PM to report that she observed the man coming back through the Del Mar gate. Dispatcher Traver was able to locate the video footage of the man coming back in.

This information was relayed to the Sumter County Sheriff's Office and it was confirmed that the gentleman had made it safely home. Each discipline within the Community Watch Department (Dispatch, Patrol, Gate Attendant and Gate Camera Operation) worked together to resolve the task in approximately 30 minutes. The ability to utilize all resources and personnel to ensure the safety of residents is something that Community Watch takes great pride in.

GOLF CAR RULES OF THE ROAD AND SAFETY TIPS

When traveling in a golf car through The Villages Community on a roadway or multi-modal path, we urge you to follow these rules of the road and safety tips to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for everyone. The multi-modal paths are designated for use by non-automotive, non-vehicular traffic such as bicycles, golf cars and pedestrians.

Slow Down and Enjoy The Ride!

BEFORE YOU DRIVE

- Make sure the horn, brakes and lights work.
- Check back-up alarm, tire pressure and applicable gauges.
- Before backing up, look behind and see that all is clear.

RULES OF THE ROAD

- Must be 14 years or older to drive a golf car per Florida State Law, check with your local government jurisdiction for rules
- Drive on neighborhood streets, marked roadside lanes, and multi-modal paths
- Obey all traffic laws, signs and signals
- Golf cars are subject to Florida's open alcoholic container laws
- Speed not to exceed 20mph
- Use hand and turn signals
- Yield to automobiles
- Come to a full stop at stop signs
- Never enter a roundabout in a golf car
- Golf cars are prohibited from roadways with posted speeds of 35mph or more

SAFETY TIPS

- Provide a seat for each person/pet
- Secure all children and pets
- Keep passengers seated in golf car at all times
- Keep arms and legs inside golf car at all times
- Enter traffic lane safely before turning left
- Be aware of vehicles turning right (across the golf car lane)
- Maintain golf car according to manufacturer's recommendations
- Do not text/phone while driving
- Limit passing slower golf cars
- Pull off the path when you need to stop

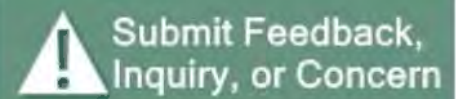

Frequently Asked Questions and Answers



When should I call 911 and what happens when I call 911 in The Villages?

When should I call 911?

When you have a medical, fire or police emergency.

Who answers my 911 call?

In Florida, all 911 Public Safety Answering Points (PSAP's) must be affiliated with county law enforcement dispatch centers.

But I don't need the police. What if my emergency is medical?

The county law enforcement office call-taker will ask if your call is for FIRE, POLICE or MEDICAL. The call-taker will also ask for the location of the emergency. Frequently, the call-taker will ask for the county. For the purposes of 911, it's not The Villages, it's Sumter, Lake or Marion County

Doesn't the 911 operator know my address when I call? Why does he/she have to ask?

If you call 911 from your hard-wired (house) phone, the location of that telephone appears on the call-taker's computer screen.

If you call from your cell phone, that information may not be available. The call-taker will always ask for the location of the emergency either to confirm what he/she already sees on the screen or to learn the location from the cell phone caller. As a result, if you're calling from a cell phone, you need to know where you are! Do not hang up when calling from a cell phone. It may take an extra few seconds for the call to hit the cell phone tower.

Never hang up on 911. Even if you dialed in error, stay on the line to let the call-taker know that.

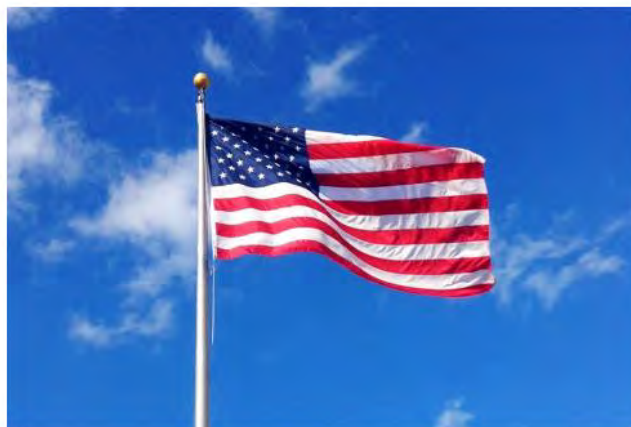

Did you know there are flagpole guidelines when installing a pole on your property?

The flagpole guidelines within the community are as follows:

- Displaying a portable flag mounted on a home does not require architectural approval.
- A flagpole requires prior written approval by the Architectural Review Committee to confirm it is not being installed within any easement area and does not exceed twenty-two (22) feet in height.



Flagpole requires prior Architectural Review Committee approval.

Portable flag mounted on the home does not require prior Architectural Review Committee approval.

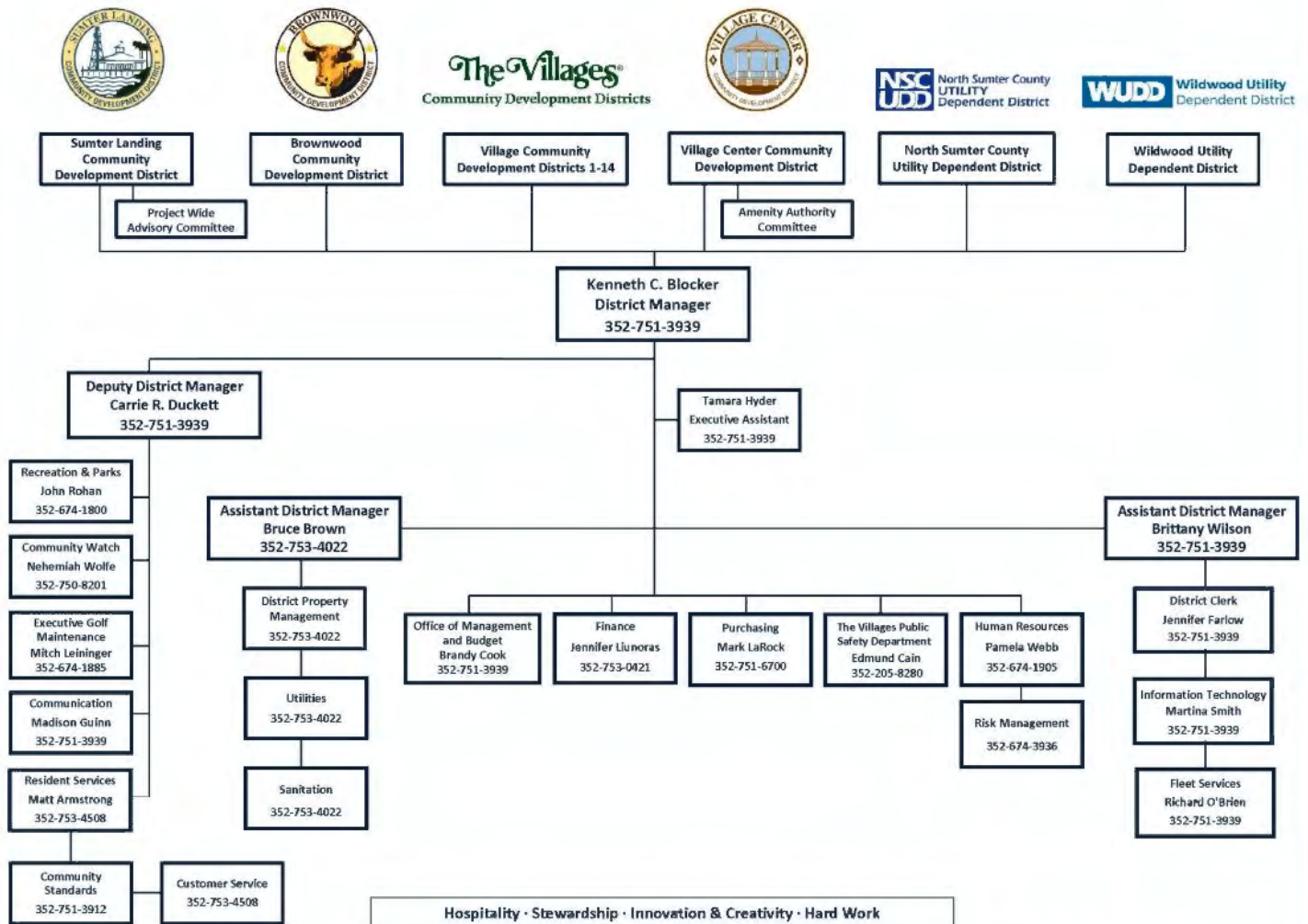

Tips on saving water indoors



- Watch out for silent leaks in toilets. Remove the toilet tank lid and any colored cleaning agents. Flush to clear the water in the bowl. Add dye tablets, leak detector fluid or even a few drops of food coloring to the tank. If there is a leak, color will appear in the bowl within 10 to 15 minutes. Flush when the test is completed.
- Take shorter showers and make sure there are no leaks in showerheads. If there is a leak, make sure the showerhead is screwed tightly. Additionally, make sure showerheads are low-flow. Older high-volume showerheads deliver 4 gallons of water per minute. New low-volume showerheads deliver 2.5 gallons per minute. Pressures have been adjusted to the low-flow fixtures to deliver as good a shower as the higher flow showerheads.
- If you believe that you have a potable water leak, give Utility Customer Service a call at 352-750-0000 and they can review your billing history. Potable water conservation is a nationwide highlight this month as this is a valuable resource. We all share in the stewardship of the valuable resource.
- Adjust wash cycles for laundry. Select the minimum volume of water required for each load. Normal and permanent press wash cycles use more water, so use the shortest wash cycle for lightly soiled loads. Stains can be pretreated to avoid rewashing.

WATER SYSTEM MAINTENANCE

Preventative maintenance is occurring on the potable water system field valves throughout many areas of The Villages. Those customers serviced by Village Center Service Area (VCSA), Little Sumter Service Area (LSSA), North Sumter Utilities (NSU), Central Sumter Utilities (CSU) and South Sumter Utilities (SSU) that will be impacted will be notified 24 hours in advance of a temporary interruption in service and will receive the following notification:

THE PUBLIC DRINKING WATER MAINS IN YOUR AREA WILL BE SHUT DOWN TEMPORARILY FOR NEEDED MAINTENANCE. AS A PRECAUTION, UPON RETURN OF WATER SERVICE, WE ADVISE THAT ALL WATER USED FOR DRINKING, MAKING ICE, AND COOKING BE BOILED, FOR ALL OTHER HOUSE HOLD USES THE WATER IS ACCEPTABLE. A ROLLING BOIL OF ONE MINUTE IS SUFFICIENT. AS AN ALTERNATIVE, BOTTLED WATER MAY BE USED.

THIS "PRECAUTIONARY BOIL WATER NOTICE" WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL THE MAINTENANCE TASK HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND A BACTERIOLOGICAL SURVEY SHOWS THAT THE WATER IS SAFE TO DRINK. THIS USUALLY CONSISTS OF A TWO-DAY SAMPLING PERIOD TO INSURE SAFE DRINKING WATER.

COVID-19 and High Community Spread

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is reporting high levels of positive COVID-19 cases.

During this time of high community spread, the CDC recommends:

- Wearing a mask indoors in public.
- Staying up to date with COVID-19 vaccines.
- Getting tested if you have symptoms.
- Staying home if you have symptoms.
- Taking additional precautions if you are at high risk for severe illness.

Who is at increased risk for severe illness?

- Older adults.
- People with medical conditions.
- People who are immunocompromised.
- People who are pregnant or were recently pregnant.

COVID-19 is spread in three main ways:

- Breathing in air when close to an infected person who is exhaling small droplets and particles that contain the virus.
- Having these small droplets and particles that contain virus land on the eyes, nose, or mouth, especially through splashes and sprays like a cough or sneeze.
- Touching eyes, nose, or mouth with hands that have the virus on them.

Important ways to slow the spread of COVID-19:

- Get vaccinated and stay up-to-date on your COVID-19 vaccines.
- Wear a well-fitted mask to help protect yourself and others.
- Avoid crowds and poorly ventilated indoor spaces.
- Test to prevent spread to others.
- Stay 6 feet apart from others who don't live with you.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Use hand sanitizer if soap and water aren't available.

Watch for symptoms

People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported, from mild symptoms to severe illness. Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. Anyone can have mild to severe symptoms.

People with these symptoms may have COVID-19:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

This list does not include all possible symptoms. Older adults and people who have severe underlying medical conditions like heart disease, lung disease or diabetes seem to be at higher risk for developing more serious complications from COVID-19 illness.

Protect yourself and others! Stay home and get tested if you have any symptoms. Wear a mask in public. Keep a distance from others while in public places. Wash your hands with soap and water frequently.
