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# **Curbside Residential Sanitation Collection Information**



#### The Villages Community Development Districts

Sumter County, Marion County & The Villages of Fruitland Park

Household sanitation collection processes have been streamlined, both for your convenience and for the preservation of our environment and natural resources. By having more efficient services, we reduce the carbon footprint, reduce wear and tear on roads, use less fuel and minimize traffic in your neighborhood. All waste, both household and yard waste, is collected on your two scheduled pick up days.

#### **HOUSEHOLD WASTE**

All household waste should be placed in a sealed tall kitchen trash bag or a 20-30 gallon trash bag (any color). All materials can be placed in the same bag, no need to sort! The trash bags should be placed together at the end of your driveway, no garbage cans/bins are allowed (they will be disposed of with household waste). Each bag should weigh no more than forty (40) pounds. Bags must be placed for collection before 6AM on your collection day or the night before (no sooner than 5PM) Collection times may vary. Deed Restrictions do not permit leaving trash out on undesignated days. Wrap broken glass or other sharp objects in newspaper and place them where they cannot cause injury. For a list of holidays that may affect your normal collection day, please visit DistrictGov.org.

#### **BULK PICK UP**

Items that are too large to be collected by the compactor trucks can be scheduled in advance by calling for a bulk pick up.

For those residents north of SR 44, please call 352-748-0109 for scheduling. There will be a \$10 charge added to your utilities and amenities bill each time a bulk pick up is requested. Charges will apply for any scheduled pick up not canceled a minimum of 24 hours in advance of the scheduled date.

For those residents residing south of SR 44, please call 352-750-0000 for scheduling.



#### **HOMEOWNER YARD WASTE**

Tree limbs or branches may not exceed 5' in length, 5" in diameter or exceed 40 pounds. Bundle and tie such materials and place them at the end of your driveway. Palm fronds to face the same direction. Lawn clippings and similar yard waste must be placed in bags.



The following WILL NOT be accepted: Dirt, Rocks, Sod, Concrete, Contractor Waste

#### **ENERGY FROM WASTE**

All waste is transported to the Lake County Covanta Energy from Waste (EFW) Facility. Household waste or mixed solid waste (MSW) is turned into energy which is then transferred to the energy grid. Every 1 ton of MSW managed at the Covanta EFW facility offsets approximately 1 ton of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. Covanta's EFW facilities typically operate at 60-80% better than Federal and/or State permitted emission limits. The EFW facility has advanced air pollution control and is highly regulated to protect the environment.

For residents of The Villages residing South of State Road 44, sanitation services are provided and delivered to Covanta by Tri-County Sanitation. For residents living in the Town of Lady Lake portion of The Villages, sanitation services are provided and delivered to Covanta by Waste Management.

#### LAKE COUNTY COVANTA EFW FACILITY FACTS

- Facility processes a total of 528 tons per day of MSW.
- Generates up to 14.5 megawatts of clean, renewable energy daily.
- Utilizes Air Pollution Control Equipment of semidry flue gas scrubbers injecting lime, fabric filter baghouses, nitrogen oxide control system, mercury control system and continuous emissions monitoring system.
- The EFW system is comprised of two 264 tonper-day waterfall furnaces with Martin reversereciprocating grates and ash handling system.
- Designated a Voluntary Protection Program Star Facility by the U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) for workplace safety.

#### MATERIALS NOT ACCEPTED

DO NOT PLACE HYPODERMIC NEEDLES, HOSPITAL TYPE MEDICAL WASTE, PAINT, OIL, LAWN OR POOL CHEMICALS, MOTOR OIL OR TIRES IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE.

Amnesty days at designated locations are held several times a year. Contact District Customer Service at 352-753-4508 for scheduled times and locations.

#### WATER SYSTEM MAINTENANCE

Preventative maintenance is occurring on the potable water system field valves throughout many areas of The Villages. Those customers serviced by Village Center Service Area (VCSA), Little Sumter Service Area (LSSA), North Sumter Utilities (NSU), Central Sumter Utilities (CSU) and South Sumter Utilities (SSU) that will be impacted will be notified 24 hours in advance of a temporary interruption in service and will receive the following notification:

THE PUBLIC DRINKING WATER MAINS IN YOUR AREA WILL BE SHUT DOWN TEMPORARILY FOR NEEDED MAINTENANCE. AS A PRECAUTION, UPON RETURN OF WATER SERVICE, WE ADVISE THAT ALL WATER USED FOR DRINKING, MAKING ICE, AND COOKING BE BOILED, FOR ALL OTHER HOUSE HOLD USES THE WATER IS ACCEPTABLE. A ROLLING BOIL OF ONE MINUTE IS SUFFICIENT. AS AN ALTERNATIVE, BOTTLED WATER MAY BE USED.

THIS "PRECAUTIONARY BOIL WATER NOTICE" WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL THE MAINTENANCE TASK HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND A BACTERIOLOGICAL SURVEY SHOWS THAT THE WATER IS SAFE TO DRINK. THIS USUALLY CONSISTS OF A TWO-DAY SAMPLING PERIOD TO INSURE SAFE DRINKING WATER.

One person is killed every 45 minutes in a drunk-driving crash, totaling more than 11,000 lives lost each year. August is "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" month. The goal of the campaign is to crack down on drunk and impaired driving.



One of the deadliest and most often committed crimes (impaired driving), has become a serious safety epidemic in our country.

Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over, which runs from August 17 through September 5, aims to educate people about the dangers and consequences of driving drunk.

### By the numbers:

- **530** traffic crash deaths occurred across the US during Labor Day Weekend in 2020.
- 46% involved drivers who had been drinking.
- 38% involved a Drunk Driver.

Drivers under the influence make riskier decisions when they're behind the wheel. In 2020, 11,654 people died in drunk-driving crashes — a 14% increase from 2019.

## This Labor Day, and every day, drive sober!

During the Labor Day holiday period, we typically see an increase in drunk-driving deaths — and that's why you'll likely see more law enforcement on the roads.

## Have a plan whether you're driving, riding or hosting

- Before drinking, plan a safe and sober ride home.
- Don't let someone get behind the wheel if they've been drinking.
- If you're hosting a gathering, make sure all your guests have a sober ride home.
- If you see an impaired driver, call 911. And always wear your seat belt it's your best defense against impaired drivers.



## The most dangerous holidays:

- New Year's Day 116% higher than average risk
- Independence Day 78% higher than aver risk (most deadly weekend)
- Thanksgiving 56% higher than average risk
- Labor Day 54% higher than average risk (2nd most deadly weekend)
- Memorial Day 50% higher than average risk

## The effects of alcohol on driving

Just one drink before driving can put you and others in danger because alcohol impairs thinking, reasoning and muscle coordination.

Blood Alcohol Concentration	Predictable Effects On Driving
.02	Decline in visual functions, decline in ability to perform two tasks at a time.
.05	Reduced coordination, reduced ability to track moving objects, difficulty steering, reduced response to emergency driving situations.
.08	Reduced concentration, short-term memory loss, lack of speed control, reduced information processing capability, impaired perception.
.10	Reduced ability to maintain lane position and brake appropriately.
.15	Substantial impairment in vehicle control, attention to driving task, and necessary visual and auditory information processing.

Even a small amount of alcohol can affect your driving ability. In addition, interactions between alcohol and other substances in the body such as certain medications or illegal drugs increase impairment and make driving riskier.




