Chaplain Gary Kadow retired from Federal Service on September 11, 1998 and volunteered serving as a Government Liaison Officer with the National Red Cross Disaster Services Response Team in Washington, DC. On the morning of September 11, 2001, he was called to respond to The World Trade Center Disaster and was later sent to Ground Zero to assess the magnitude of the damage and determine the immediate needs of first responders by New York State Governor George Pataki. Mr. Kadow also being an ordained Episcopal Hospital Chaplain also volunteered his time to assist in providing communion, comfort, prayer and counseling to the first responders at the World Trade Center. For ten days from the morning of September 11th to September 21st he worked eight hours a day for the American Red Cross in Albany, NY, and then traveled to The World Trade Center, where he worked for an additional ten hours as Chaplain to the first responders at Ground Zero. In 2002 he published "Ten Days of Hell and Heroes an eyewitness account of the first days after September 11th" and raised over a quarter million dollars for the construction of the 9-11 Memorial and Museum in New York City.

Meet JAIME DENTON

Infrastructure Assistant Manager, District Property Management (DPM)

What is your position/role with the District?

I am the Infrastructure Assistant Manager for District Property Management (Infrastructure Division). My time is largely dedicated to unusual projects that routinely emerge from day-to-day operations. My entire department readily addresses any problems or minor concerns that arise and everything in between. If District Property Management is not able to assist someone we will readily connect them to the appropriate point of contact to properly address the issue.

What does your position entail?

In my position, it's immensely rewarding to be able to assure people face-to-face that challenging circumstances will be addressed promptly and knowing that I have a great team of staff supporting me. From coordinating with other Divisions within District Property Management and various District Departments to communicating with contractors and vendors to ensure that reasonable requests are satisfied by any means necessary, teamwork is truly what makes the dream work here in the District.

How does your work with DPM serve the residents of The Villages?

Despite any obstacles we face, we will always prioritize the "resort lifestyle" of The Villages that residents have come to expect. With customer service alone, we are

very unique from other Public Works departments in that we individually contact anyone who reports an issue to explain what actions may or may not be taken and why. This is a personal source of satisfaction as my work background has always been in direct service to the community and ensuring premier customer service.

What is one of your best or most memorable achievements/projects with DPM and why?

A recent highlight of my career with District Property Management has been painting the multi-modal path tunnel interiors. This project has been very successful and my team regularly receives positive comments on the results. The feedback speaks for itself — a new precedent is being set in The Villages for comfort, convenience, safety and aesthetics.

What is a fun fact about your work that residents may not know?

District Property Management functions similarly to Public Works departments in other counties or municipalities, but we are unique in that our team of less than 50 relies on contractors to execute work rather than having a large internal staff. This ensures services are being completed at the highest quality for competitive costs.

What is the most common request or question you are asked?

One of the most common questions received by the Infrastructure Division is whether or not a resident is responsible for the maintenance of a wall or fence. This information is available by visiting the District website at <u>DistrictGov.org</u>. Under the Departments tab, select 'Community Standards' in the drop-down menu and then click on Download Your Declaration of Restrictions from the Quick Links menu on the left-hand side of the page. Select the county you reside in and then click on your unit. If you are unsure of your unit number, it is located on your Villages ID card. The U/L number is the first letter of the county in which you live, the unit number and the lot number. Annual Plantings

Annual plants or "Seasonal Color" are plants that grow from seed to flower, produce seeds, and die within a single growing season.

On District property within The Villages, landscape contractors install around 2 million (and counting) annuals every year, replanting by hand every quarter to coordinate with Florida weather and seasons for a full color appearance throughout the year.

These annuals are contract grown in nurseries around the state of Florida. Once the plants are ready, it is crucial that they be installed quickly to avoid becoming root bound in the container and shortening their life expectancy.

We do not specify the species as long as they are plants proven to work in our area and adhere to the design intent within The Villages. This provides a change of color as you move through The Villages.



Frequently Asked Questions and Answers





Why is September 16, 2022 an important date in regard to my Bond?

A property owner can pay off their Bond principal balance in full at any time of the year. However, if you pay off your Bond any time from now until 5 pm on September 16, 2022, the payoff amount will be adjusted for the full interest amount to be paid on the November 2022 tax bill.

If you choose to pay your Bond off in full during this time, you will have one last Bond assessment on your November 2022 Property Tax bill. That tax bill must be paid in full.

To obtain a Bond payoff amount or for other questions regarding your Bond, please contact the Bond Office at 352-751-3900. Please call to schedule an appointment prior to visiting the office.

If you are interested in the breakdown of how your Bond is paid, all Bond amortization schedules are available on the District's website at <u>DistrictGov.org</u>. Click on the quick link to Residential Bond Assessment Information.

Please remember that even when the Bond is paid in full, there will continue to be an annual Maintenance Assessment on your County Property Tax bill. The Maintenance Assessment pays for ongoing costs to maintain the infrastructure of your District.

You are not required to prepay your Bond. If you do not choose to pay it off in full at this time, the Bond will continue to be annually assessed on the County Property Tax bill.



Community Development Districts Utilities

For residents living in Village Community Development Districts 1-11, located in Sumter County, Marion County and The Villages of Fruitland Park:

- All household solid waste and yard waste is picked up twice a week same time, same truck, all together!
- All household waste should be placed in sealed tall kitchen trash bags or 20-30 gallon trash bags (any color with the exception of red, which is used for medical waste).
- All materials can be placed in the same bag, no need to sort!
- The trash bags should be left at the end of your driveway, <u>no garbage cans</u> <u>are allowed</u>.
- Each bag should weigh no more than forty (40) pounds.
- Bags must be placed for collection before 6:00 AM on your collection day or the night before (no sooner than 5:00 PM).
- Wrap broken glass or other sharp objects in newspaper and place them where they cannot cause injury.
- Limbs and branches should be bundled and tied and may not exceed 4" in diameter, 4' in length, or exceed 40 pounds.

Residents living in Village Community Development Districts 12 and 13 may contact Utility Billing and Collection at 352-750-0000 for additional information.

Town of Lady Lake Residents may contact Waste Management at 352-787-4416 with questions.

Unincorporated Lake County Residents (not including District 11) may contact Lake County Solid Waste at 352-343-3776 with questions.

National Preparedness Month is observed each September to raise awareness about the importance of preparing for disasters and emergencies that could happen at any time.

Make a plan today. Your family may not be together if a disaster strikes so it is important to know which types of disasters could affect your area. Know how you'll contact one another and reconnect if separated. Establish a family meeting place that's familiar and easy to find.

Step 1: Put a plan together by discussing the questions below with family, friends and your household to start your emergency plan.

How will I receive emergency alerts and warnings?

- Locations frequented.
- Dietary needs.
- Medical needs including prescriptions and equipment.
- Disabilities or access and functional needs including devices and equipment.
- Pets or service animals.
- Households with school-aged children.

Step 3: Fill out a Family Emergency Plan using the following link — <u>Family</u> <u>Emergency Communication Plan</u>.

Step 4: Practice your plan with your family/household.

Have your kit ready and available, TODAY!

To assemble your kit store items in airtight plastic bags and put your entire disaster supplies kit in one or two easy-to-carry containers such as plastic bins or a duffel bag.

A basic emergency supply kit could include the following recommended items:

- Water 1 gallon per person/per day for several days.
- Food At least several days' supply of non-perishable food and a manual can opener.
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio and NOAA Weather Radio.
- Flashlights and extra batteries.
- First aid kit, whistle (in case of signaling for help) and dust masks.
- Plastic sheeting, duct tape, tarps.
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties (for personal sanitation).
- Wrench, pliers and other tools.
- Maps, cell phones, chargers and backup batteries.
