District 2 - Q&A Meeting Tuesday, September 27, 2022


This month's Question & Answer meeting will be hosted by Tom Swiers, District 2 Supervisor.

How much is enough?

Have you wondered if your water bill and water consumption could be less, but not sure what it could drop to? The below tables are based on guidelines from SWFWMD and the University of Florida showing average monthly consumption based on the typical lot size for the types of homes in The Villages. With active management, your water bill could be significantly less, especially during the winter and the summer wet season.

To calculate usage for your home if you do not have a standard size home and lot, use the method as shown on the bottom of the How Much is Enough table.

Falls Prevention Awareness Week

Join us September 18, 2022 through September 24, 2022 for Falls Prevention Awareness Week, a nationwide effort to raise awareness on preventing falls and reducing the risk of falls. Sponsored by the National Council on Aging (NCOA), it is intended to raise awareness about how to prevent fall-related injuries among older adults.

Falls are the leading cause of injury-related emergency room visits and are the leading cause of fatal and non-fatal injuries for older Americans. Falls threaten seniors' safety and independence and generate enormous economic and personal costs. According to the NCOA:

- One-fourth of Americans aged 65+ fall each year.
- Every 11 seconds, an older adult is treated in the emergency room for a fall.
- Every 19 minutes, an older adult dies from a fall.
- Falls result in more than three million injuries treated in emergency rooms annually, including 850,000 hospitalizations and more than 29,000 deaths.

Many falls are preventable

Take control of your health! Follow these steps to prevent falls:

- 1. Find a good balance and exercise program. Look to build balance, strength, and flexibility.
- 2. Talk to your health care provider. Ask for an assessment of your risk of falling.
- 3. Regularly review your medications with your doctor or pharmacist. Make sure side effects aren't increasing your risk of falling.
- 4. Get your vision and hearing checked annually and update your eyeglasses. Your eyes and ears are key to keeping you on your feet.
- 5. Keep your home safe. Remove tripping hazards, increase lighting, make stairs safe, and install grab bars in key areas.
- 6. Talk to your family. Enlist their support in taking simple steps to stay safe.

Do you know the rules of the roundabout?



1 Slow Down.

2 Look Around.

3 Be Ready to Yield.

A roundabout is a circular intersection design where traffic travels at low speed around a central island and entering traffic must yield to circulating traffic. Roundabouts are safer and more efficient than traditional intersections.

The geometry of a roundabout is key to controlling the speed at which traffic enters and maneuvers through the intersection, providing the following benefits:


- Lower severity of collisions that may occur, resulting in significantly fewer severe injuries.
- Increased likelihood of drivers yielding to pedestrians at crosswalks.
- Time for drivers to judge and enter a comfortable gap in circulating traffic.


Modern Roundabouts... as easy as 1, 2, 3.



- Going slower provides more time to make decisions and be better prepared to yield to other road users.
- By entering the roundabout at a slower speed, crashes that do happen are much less severe.
- Slowing down helps drivers do a better job seeing pedestrians and bicycles and sharing the road with them.



- Drivers should choose the lane for where they want to go after the roundabout. Signs and markings help them select a lane.
- Like most other intersections, drivers use the left lane to go left, the right lane to go right, and either lane to go straight through, unless otherwise indicated.
- Drivers should keep looking around and check the crosswalks to see if anyone is waiting to cross or is already crossing. Drivers should be ready to stop and let them safely finish.



- Drivers must yield to traffic in all lanes of the roundabout, not just in the lane closest to them.
- If large vehicles like trucks or buses are in the roundabout, drivers should give them space and avoid driving next to them inside the roundabout.
- Drivers should follow the pavement markings to stay in the correct lane as they leave the roundabout. They should look around one more time for anyone in the crosswalk and be ready to yield as the drivers exit.

The Village Community Development District No. 2 Board of Supervisors is seeking applicants who are interested in filling Seat 3, which was recently vacated due to the resignation of the existing Board Supervisor. The remainder of the existing four (4) year term for the vacated Seat will expire in November 2022.
