Severe Weather Preparations and Closures

In preparation for Tropical Storm Nicole and the potential for severe weather, the District is currently taking the following precautions:

All District Administrative Offices will be closed on Thursday,

November 10, 2022. On Friday, November 11, 2022, District Administrative Offices will resume regular holiday schedule and will remain closed in observance of Veterans Day. On Monday, November 14, 2022, all District Administrative Offices will resume normal business hours. Please note this schedule may change due to unforeseen circumstances or changes in weather predictions.

Executive Golf Courses

All Executive Golf Courses will be closed on Thursday, November 10, 2022. Courses are anticipated to reopen on Friday, November 11, 2022 and resume normal business hours, weather conditions permitting.

Recreation Facilities – Indoor & Outdoor

All indoor and outdoor Recreation Facilities, including swimming pools, will be closed on Thursday, November 10, 2022. All scheduled events on this day will be cancelled. On Friday, November 11, 2022, indoor and outdoor Recreation Facilities, not including pools, will resume regular holiday schedule as listed below. While Recreation Centers will reopen on Friday, November 11, 2022, the pools will remain closed until pool control and District Property Management can assess and deem them safe and ready to open.

<u>Recreation & Parks Veterans Day holiday schedule:</u> All Recreation Offices will be closed on Friday, November 11, 2022 in observance of Veterans Day. Recreation centers, fitness clubs and outdoor facilities will remain open as usual. Outdoor facilities will close at Dusk.

All Recreation Offices and facilities will resume regular business hours on Monday, November 14, 2022. This schedule may change due to unforeseen circumstances or changes in weather predictions.



Severe Weather Preparations and Closures

Gate Operations

- At 12 AM on Wednesday, November 9, 2022, Community Watch removed all gate arms throughout the community. As you approach a gate in which the gate arm has been removed, please use caution and stop before proceeding.
- Conditions permitting, Community Watch staff will begin reinstalling all gate arms at 12 AM on Saturday, November 12, 2022.
- Patrol Drivers may suspend operations if road conditions are deemed unsafe and will resume operations once authorized by staff.

We appreciate your patience and assistance as the District prepares for Tropical Storm Nicole. While emergency management continues to be a function of the county in which you reside, the District works extremely hard in ensuring the safety of District staff, residents of The Villages, and District facilities.

The District has worked throughout this Hurricane Season to prepare for the impact of a potential tropical storm system while maintaining the integrity of our extensive stormwater system, our more than 700+ lakes, basins, and wetland areas. As soon as the potential for a tropical event impacting this area was known, more intense water management activities were started and have continued through today to place our stormwater systems in the best possible position. District Property Management is actively lowering Lake Paradise before the impacts of Tropical Storm Nicole.

Given the relatively dry weather we have had recently, our stormwater system is in an excellent position for the rainfall impacts of Tropical Storm Nicole, however, Irrigation may continue to run along common areas and roadways to lower the water levels in water retention areas. This is done to ensure adequate capacity of the stormwater management system.



Severe Weather Preparations and Closures

Winds may blow down trees, tree limbs, palm fronds, etc. Small debris should be gathered and placed curbside for pickup. Trees and larger limbs on private property should be handled by a local tree removal service. District Property Management will take care of all District-owned trees and tree limbs. All gate arms will be removed to protect the controllers and motors. They will be reinstalled after storm passage.

District Property Management will have crews respond after storm passage to being the cleanup process for any debris from the Town Centers, roadways, and common areas. As with any large-scale event in The Villages, this may take several days to complete. District Property Management is well-positioned to monitor and respond to Tropical Storm Nicole and any impacts on our community.

Tropical Storm Nicole Sanitation Schedule

Village Community Development Districts 1 – 11

If you live in Village Community Development Districts 1 – 11 located in Sumter County, Marion County or Fruitland Park portions of The Villages, Thursday collections have been cancelled and will now be collected on Saturday, November 12th. Residents who normally receive collection on Friday will receive service as normal.

Village Community Development District No. 12 and 13

If you live in Village Community Development District 12 or 13, residents who normally receive collection on Thursday will receive collection on Monday, November 14th. There will be no collection on Thursday. Residents who normally receive collection on Friday will receive service as normal.

If you live in the **Town of Lady Lake portion of The Villages**, residents who normally receive collection on Thursday will receive collection on Monday, November 14th. There will be no collection on Thursday. Residents who normally receive collection on Friday will receive service as normal.

If you live in the **Lake County portion of The Villages** (not including VCDD No. 11), curbside collection services will remain suspended from 6 PM on Wednesday, November 9th through the morning of Friday, November 11th and will continue when road conditions are safe for haulers. Any waste not collected by 6 PM on Wednesday, November 9th needs to be removed from the roadside and secured. Thursday curbside pickup will be shifted to Friday. Residents scheduled for Friday pickup will be shifted to Saturday.

Veterans Day Holiday Information

The District Customer Service Center and all District Administrative Offices will be closed on Friday, November 11, 2022 in observance of Veterans Day. We will resume normal business hours on Monday, November 14, 2022. It is the responsibility of District Property Management (DPM) to maintain and preserve the quality and aesthetics of the community. District Property Management is comprised of six Divisions: Landscape, Water Resources, Infrastructure, Facilities, Town Centers and Construction & Fire Stations.

Back in 2013, The Villages had grown so significantly that District Management saw the need for a Construction Division, which I am proud to lead as the Construction Division Manager for District Property Management. Early on, we began by renovating many existing facilities and soon moved on to raising older facilities and constructing new, updated and larger recreation buildings and amenities.

Learn about the rules and guidelines for each one of our recreation, sports and family pools. Pools and outdoor facilities close at dusk (30 minutes after sunset).


Please follow all posted pool hours, rules and regulations. In the event of an emergency, dial 911. Note: No pets are allowed in the pool area.


If a staff member is on site, please check in with them. Please have your Villages ID Card or Guest ID Card and photo ID with you at all times.





Watches & Warnings

Listen closely to instructions from local officials on TV, radio, cell phones or other computers for instructions from local officials. Evacuate if told to do so.

WATCHES:

- Hurricane Watch: Hurricane conditions (sustained winds of 74 mph or greater) are possible within your area. Because it may not be safe to prepare for a hurricane once winds reach tropical storm force, the NHC issues hurricane watches 48 hours before it anticipates tropical-storm-force winds.
- Tropical Storm Watch: Tropical storm conditions (sustained winds of 39 to 73 mph) are possible within the specified area within 48 hours.
- Storm Surge Watch: The possibility of lifethreatening inundation from rising water moving inland from the shoreline somewhere within the specified area, generally within 48 hours.

WARNINGS:

- Hurricane Warning: Hurricane conditions (sustained winds of 74 mph or greater) are expected somewhere within the specified area. NHC issues a hurricane warning 36 hours in advance of tropical-storm-force winds to give you time to complete your preparations.
- Tropical Storm Warning: Tropical storm conditions (sustained winds of 39 to 73 mph) are expected within your area within 36 hours.
- Storm Surge Warning: The danger of life-threatening inundation from rising water moving inland from the shoreline somewhere within the specified area, generally within 36 hours.
- Extreme Wind Warning: Extreme sustained winds of a major hurricane (115 mph or greater), usually associated with the eyewall, are expected to begin within an hour. Take immediate shelter in the interior portion of a well-built structure.

BEFORE A HURRICANE

- Know your zone: Do you live near the Gulf or Atlantic Coasts? Find out if you live in a hurricane evacuation area by contacting your local government/emergency management office.
- Have a Family Emergency Plan: Before an emergency happens, sit down with your family or close friends and decide how you will get in contact with each other, where you will go and what you will do in an emergency. Keep a copy of this plan in your emergency supplies kit or another safe place where you can access it in the event of a disaster.
- Put Together an Emergency Supplies Kit: Put together a basic disaster supplies kit and consider storage locations for different situations. Check emergency equipment, such as flashlights, generators and storm shutters. For a list of key items for your kit, see www.ready.gov/kit
- Review Your Homeowners Insurance: Review your insurance policy to ensure that you have adequate coverage for your home.
- Understand NWS forecast products, especially the meaning of NWS watches and warnings.

DURING A HURRICANE

- Secure your home: Cover all of your home's windows. Permanent storm shutters offer the best protection for windows. A second option is to board up windows with 5/8 inch exterior grade or marine plywood, built to fit and ready to install. Buy supplies before the hurricane season rather than waiting for the pre-storm rush.
- Stayed tuned in: Check the websites of your local National Weather Service office and local government/emergency management office. Find out what type of emergencies could occur and how you should respond. Listen to NOAA Weather Radio or other radio or TV stations for the latest storm news.
- Follow instructions issued by local officials. Leave immediately if ordered!

IF NOT ORDERED TO EVACUATE:

- Take refuge in a small interior room, closet or hallway on the lowest level during the storm. Put as many walls between you and the outside as you can.
- Stay away from windows, skylights and glass doors.
- If the eye of the storm passes over your area, there will be a short period of calm, but at the other side of the eye, the wind speed rapidly increases to hurricane-force winds coming from the opposite direction.

AFTER A HURRICANE

- Stay Informed: Continue listening to a NOAA Weather Radio or the local news for the latest updates. If you evacuated, return home only when officials say it is safe.
- Stay Alert: Drive only if necessary and avoid flooded roads and washed-out bridges. If you must go out, watch for fallen objects in the road, downed electrical wires, and weakened walls, bridges, roads and sidewalks that might collapse.
- Assess the Damage: Walk carefully around the outside of your home to check for loose power lines, gas leaks and structural damage.

STAY SAFE:

- Stay out of any building if you smell gas, if floodwaters remain around the building or if the building or home was damaged by fire and the authorities have not declared it safe.
- Carbon monoxide poisoning is one of the leading causes of death after storms in areas dealing with power outages. Never use a portable generator inside your home or garage.
- Use battery-powered flashlights. Do NOT use candles. Turn on your flashlight before entering a vacated building. The battery could produce a spark that could ignite leaking gas, if present.

Hurricane Season – Be Prepared

The Atlantic hurricane season officially runs from June 1st through November 30th. Living in Florida, it is crucial to have a hurricane preparedness plan, a hurricane kit and know what to expect during hurricane season.



Know the Terms

- **<u>Tropical depressions</u>** are cyclones with winds of 38 mph.
- **<u>Tropical storms</u>** vary in wind speeds of 39-73 mph.
- <u>Hurricanes</u> have winds of 74 mph and greater.

Typically the upper right quadrant of the storm (the center wrapping around the eye) is the most intense portion of the storm. The greatest threats are damaging winds, storm surges and flooding.



Hurricane Season – Be Prepared

Tropical storm watch: Tropical storm conditions are possible in the area.

Tropical storm warning: Tropical storm conditions are expected in the area.

Hurricane watch: Hurricane conditions are possible in the area. Watches are issued 48 hours in advance of the anticipated onset of tropical storm force winds.

Hurricane warning: Hurricane conditions are expected in the area. Warnings are issued 36 hours in advance of tropical storm force winds.

Eyewall: The area immediately surrounding the eye where the destructive force of the storm is the most intense.

Storm surge: An often underestimated and deadly result of ocean water swelling as a result of a landfalling storm, and quickly flooding coastal and sometimes areas further inland.

During a watch: Prepare your home and evacuation plan in case a warning is issued.

During a warning: Carefully follow the directions of officials, and immediately leave the area if they advise it. In the event of an Extreme Wind Warning/Advisory, which means that extreme sustained winds of 115 mph or greater are expected to begin within an hour, immediately take shelter in the interior portion of a well-built structure.

It is advised to have a hurricane kit and plan ready every season! It is important to create a kit of supplies that you could take with you if you are forced to evacuate. This kit will also be useful if you are able to stay in your home but are still affected by the storm, such as through the loss of power.

Hurricanes are not just a coastal problem. The time to prepare for this hurricane season is NOW.

- Declutter drains and gutters, bring in outside furniture (when there is a hurricane watch) and consider installing hurricane shutters.
- Keep your cell phone charged when you know there is a chance of a hurricane and purchase backup charging devices to power electronics.
- Have enough supplies for your household, including medication, disinfectant supplies, cloth face coverings, and pet supplies in your go-bag or car trunk.
- If you or anyone in your household is an individual with a disability identify if you may need additional help during an emergency.
- Make sure your insurance policies and personal documents such as your ID are up to date. Make copies and keep them in a secure password-protected digital space.
- Only use generators outdoors and away from windows.

Residents in the Sumter, Marion and Fruitland Park portions of The Villages must comply with the SWFWMD's year-round conservation measures.

The year-round conservation measures allow for twice-per-week watering, which gives residents additional flexibility in determining when to water. Residents are encouraged to water only if their lawn and landscape needs it and turn off their irrigation system if it has rained or if rain is predicted in the next 24 hours. Some of the signs that a lawn needs water include blades folded in half lengthwise, footprints remaining on the lawn for several minutes after walking on it, and the top few inches of soil being dry.


Florida Department of Health Addresses Respiratory Syncytial Virus in Florida



Bushnell, Fla. – The Florida Department of Health (Department) is monitoring an above-average number of cases of respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) in Florida communities. This common respiratory virus may cause a higher number of pediatric emergency department visits compared to previous years.

Sumter County has been affected by this increase in RSV activity. The number of respiratory samples that have tested positive for RSV in local emergency departments and urgent care centers has increased from 5.7% on September 11th, 2022 to 20.4% on October 16th, 2022, as shown in the graph below.





RSV is an infection of the lungs and respiratory tract with symptoms similar to a common cold. Mild case symptoms can include congested or runny nose, dry cough, low-grade fever, sore throat, sneezing, and headache. In severe cases, RSV symptoms may include fever, cough, wheezing, rapid or difficulty breathing, or bluish skin color.

Follow these important steps to protect yourself and others from respiratory illness:

- 1. Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- 2. Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- 3. Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces.
- 4. Stay home if you are sick and keep children home if they are sick.
- 5. Cover your mouth and nose when sneezing and coughing. If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve or elbow, not your hands.

Infants are the most severely affected by RSV. Symptoms of severe cases in infants are short, shallow, and rapid breathing, struggling to breathe, cough, poor feeding, unusual tiredness, or irritability.

Most children and adults recover in one to two weeks, although some might have repeated wheezing. Severe or life-threatening infection requiring a hospital stay may occur in premature infants or in anyone who has chronic heart or lung problems.
