#### **Village Community Development Districts 1-11**

If you live in Village Community Development Districts 1-11 in the Sumter County, Marion County or Fruitland Park portions of The Villages, there will be no sanitation collection on Thursday, November 24, 2022. Collection will be on Saturday, November 26, 2022.

#### Village Community Development District No. 12 and No. 13

If you live in Districts 12 and 13, there will be no sanitation collection on Thursday, November 24, 2022. Collection will be on Monday, November 28, 2022.

If you live in the **Lake County portion of The Villages** (not including VCDD No. 11), Thursday collection will be moved to Friday, November 25, 2022 and Friday collection will be moved to Saturday, November 26, 2022.

If you live in the **Town of Lady Lake portion of The Villages**, there will be no sanitation or recycling collection on Thursday, November 24, 2022. Trash will be collected on Monday, November 28, 2022.

#### **Thanksgiving Safety**

We are entering the 2022 holiday season, starting with Thanksgiving on November 24th. Like always, Risk Management wants to share ways to ensure you and your loved ones safely enjoy the holidays.

#### **Traveling:**

- Make sure your car is in good condition for a road trip.
- Pack an emergency preparedness kit, supplies and a first aid kit in your vehicle.
- Share travel plans with a family member or friend.
- Be well rested and alert.
- Buckle up, slow down and don't drive impaired.
- Follow the rules of the road and use caution in work zones.
- Give your full attention to the road. Avoid distractions such as cell phones.



- Make frequent stops. During long trips, rotate drivers. If you're too tired to drive, stop and get some rest.
- Be prepared for traffic and delays, avoid road rage and share the road.
- Always drive sober. Thanksgiving (and the day before) has some of the largest totals for holiday alcohol-related accidents. Always designate a sober driver.

#### Preparing the Thanksgiving spread:

- Wash your hands frequently when handling food.
- Keep raw meat and poultry separate from produce and cooked foods. Prepare foods that will not be cooked, such as vegetables and salads, before handling and preparing raw meat and poultry.
- Stay in the kitchen when you are cooking on the stovetop.
- Stay in the home when cooking your turkey, and check on it frequently.
- Keep children away from the stove, hot foods and liquids, and knives.
- Keep matches and utility lighters out of the reach of children up high in a locked cabinet.
- Never leave children alone in a room with a lit candle.
- Keep the floor clear so you don't trip over kids, toys, cords or bags.
- Always use a food thermometer to verify meat is cooked to a safe temperature.
- Never eat food that has been left out unrefrigerated for more than 2 hours.
- Make sure your smoke alarms are working. Test them by pushing the test button.





#### Did you know?

- Thanksgiving is the peak day for home cooking fires with more than three times the daily average for such incidents. Christmas Day and Christmas Eve ranked second and third, with both having nearly twice the daily average.
- Unattended cooking was by far the leading contributing factor in cooking fires and fire deaths.
- Cooking causes half (49 percent) of all reported home fires and more than two of every five (42 percent) home fire injuries, and it is the second leading cause of home fire deaths (20 percent).

#### After the Thanksgiving feast:

- Keep potentially poisonous plants away from children and pets.
- If using an artificial tree, check that it is labeled "fire resistant".
- Place your tree at least 3 feet away from fireplaces, radiators and other heat sources, making certain not to block doorways.
- Only use indoor lights indoors and outdoor lights outdoors, and choose the right ladder for the task when hanging lights.
- Replace light sets that have broken or cracked sockets, frayed or bare wires, or loose connections.
- Follow the package directions on the number of light sets that can be plugged into one socket.
- Never nail, tack or stress wiring when hanging lights and keep plugs off the ground away from puddles and snow.
- Turn off all lights and decorations when you go to bed or leave the house.
- Use flameless, rather than lighted, candles near flammable objects.
- Never leave candles or fireplaces burning unattended or when you are asleep.






#### Lake Okahumpka Recreation



## How can I have the flyer for my neighborhood event posted on the bulletin boards at my postal facility?

The bulletin boards located at the postal facilities provide a communication resource for The Villages neighborhood groups and the District Government to post neighborhood events and information.

- All items must be approved by the District before posting
- Items shall not be posted to exceed two (2) weeks or until the post is no longer valid
- Any type of notice posted to the outside of the bulletin board or posted without prior approval will be removed and discarded

The following items will not be approved for posting at any time:

- Commercial services / activities
- Charitable activities / organizations
- · Religious material
- Club recruitment / membership notices
- Petitions
- Items or services for sale
- Materials that oppose or support political candidates or ballot measures

To submit an item for posting, please:

- Visit the Customer Service Center at 984 Old Mill Run or our Satellite Office at 4856 South Morse Blvd. to drop off the posting
- Email the item to customerservice@districtgov.org
- Place the item in the Utility / Amenity / District Correspondence box located at each postal facility
- Include your name, contact information, post and removal date and posting location

#### How to Get Around a Roundabout



When navigating a roundabout it is important to think of it like a traditional intersection. Just like a traditional intersection, a motorist chooses which lane to be in before approaching the intersection. When approaching a roundabout, drivers will see a sign showing which lanes to use for right turns, straight-through travel, and left turns.

Once you pick a lane, stay in that lane until you exit the roundabout. The following series of diagrams illustrates how to make each movement in a multi-lane roundabout:

#### From Multi-Lane Road



#### From Two-Lane Road



Follow your lane to go straight.

#### TRAFFIC TIP:

Slow down when approaching a roundabout. Roundabouts are designed for speeds between 15 and 25 mph.

Turn Left

Go Straight



Use the left lane and follow the pavement markings to turn left.



Follow the pavement markings to turn left into the outside lane.

#### TRAFFIC TIP:

Yield to pedestrians and bicyclists in marked crosswalks when you enter and exit the roundabout.

Turn Right



Turn right into the outside lane.

#### TRAFFIC TIP:

Before entering a roundabout, look left and yield to all traffic already in the roundabout; they have the right of way.

#### **Anatomy of a Roundabout**

Modern roundabouts have been proven safer and more efficient than other types of circular intersections, such as a neighborhood traffic circle or large rotary. Roundabouts have certain distinguishing features and characteristics, which are labeled in the illustration to the right.


#### ROUNDABOUT FAOS

#### Q. How is a modern roundabout different from a traffic circle or rotary?

- A. Modern roundabouts are typically smaller than the large, high-speed rotaries, which are common in the Northeast. In addition, roundabouts are typically larger than neighborhood traffic circles used to calm traffic. A roundabout has these characteristics:
  - » Counterclockwise Flow Traffic travels counterclockwise around a center island.
  - » Entry Yield Control Vehicles approaching the roundabout yield to traffic already circulating in the roundabout.
  - » Low Speed The design of approaching roadway and the diameter of the roundabout ensures low speeds through the intersection.



A. The illustration to the right shows how traditional intersections have 32 conflict points, which roundabouts reduce to just eight. Roundabouts remove right angle conflicts, which lessens the severity of crashes at these types of intersections. Incidents that do occur in roundabouts are at low speeds and are typically sideswipe, glancing collisions.



#### Q. How should a driver yield to emergency vehicles?

A. If you have not entered the roundabout, pull over to the right and allow the emergency vehicle to pass. If you have already entered the roundabout, continue to the closest exit and pull into it to allow the emergency vehicle to pass.

#### Q. How do large vehicles navigate a roundabout?

A. Roundabouts are designed to accommodate all vehicles, including tractor-trailers, emergency vehicles, recreational vehicles, etc. To accommodate the vehicle turning path as the vehicle makes its way through the roundabout, a truck apron around the inside of the circulating roadway provides the space needed. The apron is slightly elevated and visually different from the circulating roadway. This different color helps make it clear that the truck apron is not a lane for smaller vehicles or a pedestrian walkway.

#### WIPES CLOG PIPES, SO REMEMBER THESE TIPS:

#### **FLUSH IT:**

Biological waste (urine, feces) and toilet paper are the Toilet paper breaks down in water. Other products do not.

#### TRASH IT:

domestic waste and NOT flushed down the toilet.



#### PLACE THESE ITEMS IN THE TRASH, NOT THE TOILET:

- · Paper towels and napkins
- · Disinfecting wipes (even if marked "flushable")
- · Baby wipes
- Diapers
- · Feminine hygiene products





#### Florida Department of Health Addresses Respiratory Syncytial Virus in Florida



**Bushnell, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Health (Department) is monitoring an above-average number of cases of respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) in Florida communities. This common respiratory virus may cause a higher number of pediatric emergency department visits compared to previous years.

Sumter County has been affected by this increase in RSV activity. The number of respiratory samples that have tested positive for RSV in local emergency departments and urgent care centers has increased from 5.7% on September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2022 to 20.4% on October 16<sup>th</sup>, 2022, as shown in the graph below.

Figure 1: Percent positivity of samples that test RSV-positive by week, Sumter County, FL, 9/11/2022 – 10/16/2022



RSV is an infection of the lungs and respiratory tract with symptoms similar to a common cold. Mild case symptoms can include congested or runny nose, dry cough, low-grade fever, sore throat, sneezing, and headache. In severe cases, RSV symptoms may include fever, cough, wheezing, rapid or difficulty breathing, or bluish skin color.

#### **Information Provided By the Florida Department of Health**

Follow these important steps to protect yourself and others from respiratory illness:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- 2. Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces.
- Stay home if you are sick and keep children home if they are sick.
- Cover your mouth and nose when sneezing and coughing. If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve or elbow, not your hands.

Infants are the most severely affected by RSV. Symptoms of severe cases in infants are short, shallow, and rapid breathing, struggling to breathe, cough, poor feeding, unusual tiredness, or irritability.

Most children and adults recover in one to two weeks, although some might have repeated wheezing. Severe or life-threatening infection requiring a hospital stay may occur in premature infants or in anyone who has chronic heart or lung problems.
