Important Bond Payoff Date

› March 16th



A property owner can payoff their Bond principal balance in full at any time of the year, but March 16th is an important date to remember if you plan to do so.

If a resident pays off their Bond by March 16, 2023, the payoff amount will be adjusted to reflect a credit for half of the interest amount paid on their November 2022 tax bill. This will also eliminate the annual Bond Assessment on the November 2023 tax bill and avoid any future interest payments. The Bond payoff must be received in our office before 5 PM on Thursday, March 16, 2023.

To obtain a Bond payoff amount or to get more information, please contact the Bond Team by phone at 352-751-3900. Please call to schedule an appointment prior to visiting the District Office. Payments can also be placed in the District drop boxes located at each Postal Station

until March 10, 2023 or in the District drop box located outside the District Office until 5 PM on March 16, 2023.

Please remember that even when the Bond is paid in full, there will continue to be an annual maintenance assessment on your County's property tax bill. This pays for ongoing costs to maintain the infrastructure of your District.

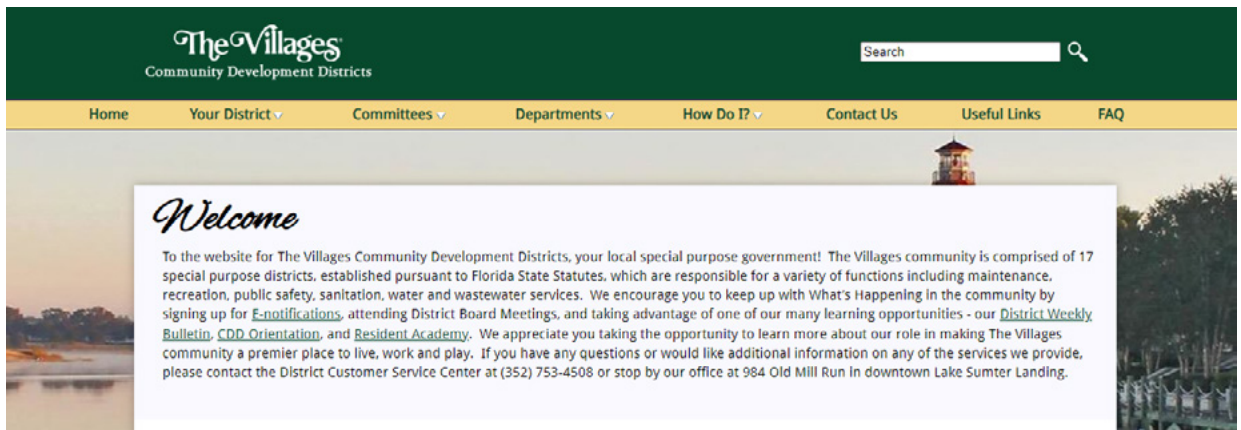
Residents are not required to pay off their Bond in advance. If not paid in full, the Bond will continue to appear on your annual tax bill.

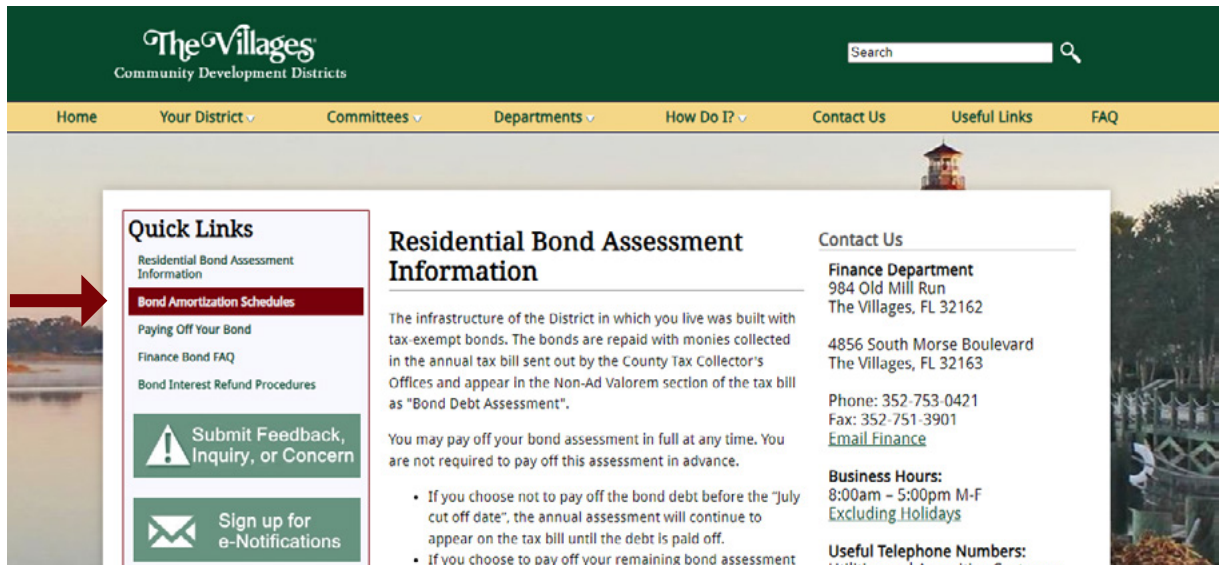

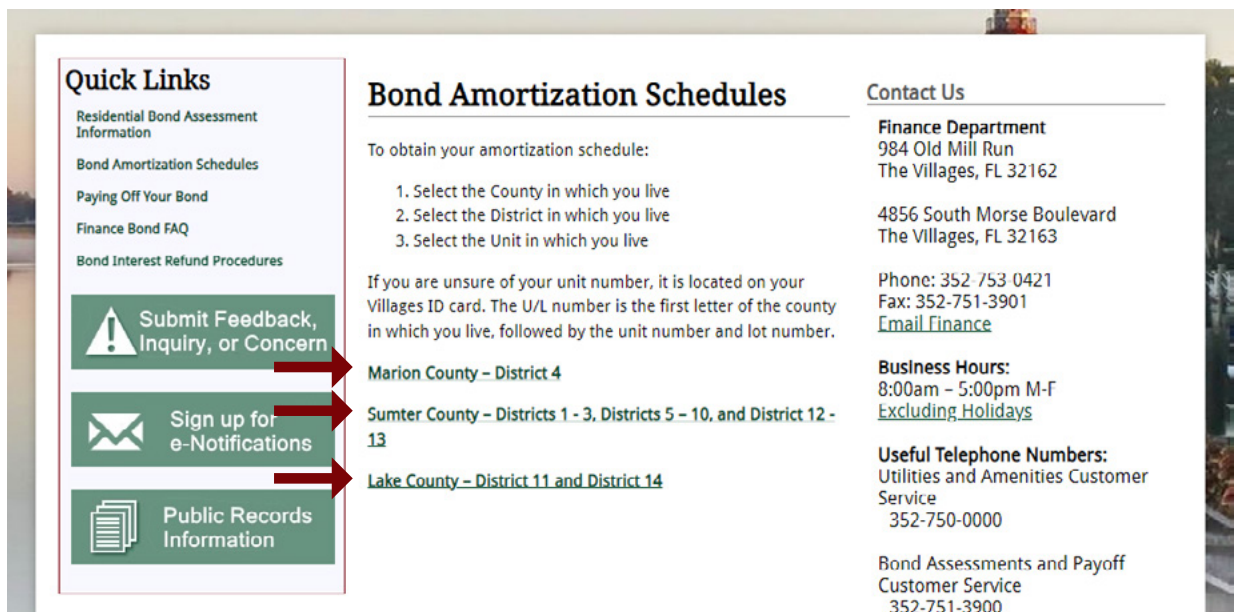

Gate Operations

Safety Guidelines

The Villages has over 100 gate facilities spread throughout the community. While we are not a “gated community” and these gates don't restrict access, they provide the very important functions of safety and traffic control.

Gates require all vehicles to stop before entering a neighborhood and slow down before exiting.

Special situations you may encounter

Inclement Weather – During heavy rains, Gate Attendants at staffed gates will open the gate for you after your vehicle has come to a complete STOP in front of the gate.

Gate Attendant Instruction – In certain situations, the Gate Attendant may raise the gate and instruct more than one vehicle at a

time to pass through. This is done solely at the discretion of the Gate Attendant to prevent specific traffic flow problems.

Inoperative Gates – Look for traffic cones or barrels placed in front of the inoperative gate(s). Please STOP and safely switch to the remaining open lane and use the open gate. If you come upon a gate that is not functioning properly, please notify Community Watch so that repairs can be scheduled as quickly as possible.

24-Hour Dispatch: 352-753-0550

Cameras – All gates are equipped with cameras, allowing Community Watch to continually record and monitor traffic entering and exiting the community.

Gate Operation Guidelines

Resident Lanes

- Resident entrance gates are raised by either the use of your gate access card or by pressing a button on the box where the card reader is located.
- When using your gate access card, please STOP at the card reader and display your card within 12-inches of the card reader.
- When pressing the button, please STOP at the card reader box and press the button.

Visitor Lanes

- Visitor entrance gates are raised by either the use of your gate access card, by pressing a button on the box where the card reader is located or manually by a gate attendant.
- If you are using a gate access card, please STOP at the card reader and display your card

within 12-inches of the card reader.

- If you are pressing the button, please STOP at the card reader box and press the button.
- If you approach a gate with a gate attendant, please STOP and allow the gate attendant to fully open the gate before proceeding.

Exit Gates

- Proceed slowly towards the gate to allow the sensor to recognize your vehicle and the gate to open.
- When the gate opens, proceed carefully, watching for all cross traffic, cyclists, golf cars and pedestrians.
- Only one vehicle at a time should pass through the gate. A second vehicle trying to pass through a raised gate will be damaged by the closing gate.



Smoke Detector Program



Did you know that The Villages Public Safety Department offers smoke detector assistance to residents of The Villages?

- This program is designed for residents who are disabled or unable to climb ladders.
- The Villages Public Safety Department recommends changing batteries once a year.
- Residents must purchase new nine-volt batteries or detectors before calling for assistance.
- On average, a smoke detector lasts around ten years and the combination smoke/carbon monoxide units last five to seven.
- Smoke alarms are designed to signal with a single beep which repeats every few minutes to alert you that the battery needs changing. Three to five beeps at a time is a signal that the detector needs to be replaced.
- On average, a smoke detector lasts around ten years. The smoke/carbon monoxide units last around five to seven years.
- If your detectors are beeping non-stop please leave the home and call 911. It may be signaling a fire or carbon monoxide emergency.
- Homes in The Villages are designed with hardwired smoke detectors. Detectors are located in the bedrooms and in the main living area. A smoke/carbon monoxide combination unit is located outside of the bedrooms.

The smoke detectors that are installed in your home are manufactured by BRK under the name First Alert. The model number for the smoke detector is 9120B and the model number of the combination smoke/carbon monoxide detector is SC9120B.



Smoke Detector Program

For those residents that are hearing impaired, there are several types of detectors that may be right for you such as strobe light detectors or detectors that can shake the bed in the event of a fire. For more information on these detectors, please stop by The Villages Public Safety Administration office at 3035 S. Smoke detector battery changes and/or installations can be arranged by calling 352-205-8280 Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 5:00 AM. If it is after hours or on the weekend and you have a beeping detector, call 352-205-8280 and select option 1 on the recording to be connected to Community Watch Dispatch.

There is no charge for this service. Appointments are for same-day service and first come first serve.

The Villages Public Safety Department employees will arrive at your home in uniform, with a visible name badge. They will also have a ladder with them.

As a reminder, this assistance is strictly for smoke detectors. The employees visiting your home will not be able to assist you with non-related smoke detector issues or concerns such as light bulbs.

Recreation & Parks General Guidelines

- Please be courteous of others regarding cell phones at the pools. Residents that bring music to the neighborhood pools are asked to play the music at a level only they can hear. The use of headphones or earbuds is preferred as to not disrupt other Villagers that are there to enjoy the pool.
- No dogs allowed on the softball or multi-purpose fields. Pets must be leashed at all times unless visiting one of the dog parks.
- Only certified service animals are allowed in the recreation centers.
- AED – Automated External Defibrillators are located at recreation centers, sports pools, softball complexes and the District offices.
- Recreation-sponsored activities will be canceled/postponed for the following reasons: outside temperature 35 degrees or below; outside temperature heat index 104 degrees or higher; rain, wind, lightning and/or severe conditions that compromise the safety of patrons or the condition of the facilities.
- Children must be 13 years of age and accompanied by an adult, at all times, to use the air gun, archery, billiards, croquet, lawn bowling and dog park facilities.

Sanitation Collection Guidelines

In The Villages



For residents of Village Community Development Districts 1-11 in Sumter County, Marion County and The Villages of Fruitland Park:

- All Household Solid Waste and Yard Waste is picked up twice a week at the same time, in the same truck and all together.
- All household waste should be placed in sealed tall kitchen trash bags or 20-30 gallon trash bags (any color with the exception of red, which is used for medical waste).
- All materials can be placed in the same bag, no need to sort!
- The trash bags should be left at the end of your driveway, no garbage cans are allowed.
- Each bag should weigh no more than forty (40) pounds.
- Bags must be placed for collection before 6 AM on your collection day or the night before (no sooner than 5 PM)
- Wrap broken glass or other sharp objects in newspaper and place

them where they cannot cause injury.

- Limbs and branches should be bundled and tied and may not exceed 5' in length, 5" in diameter or exceed 40 pounds.

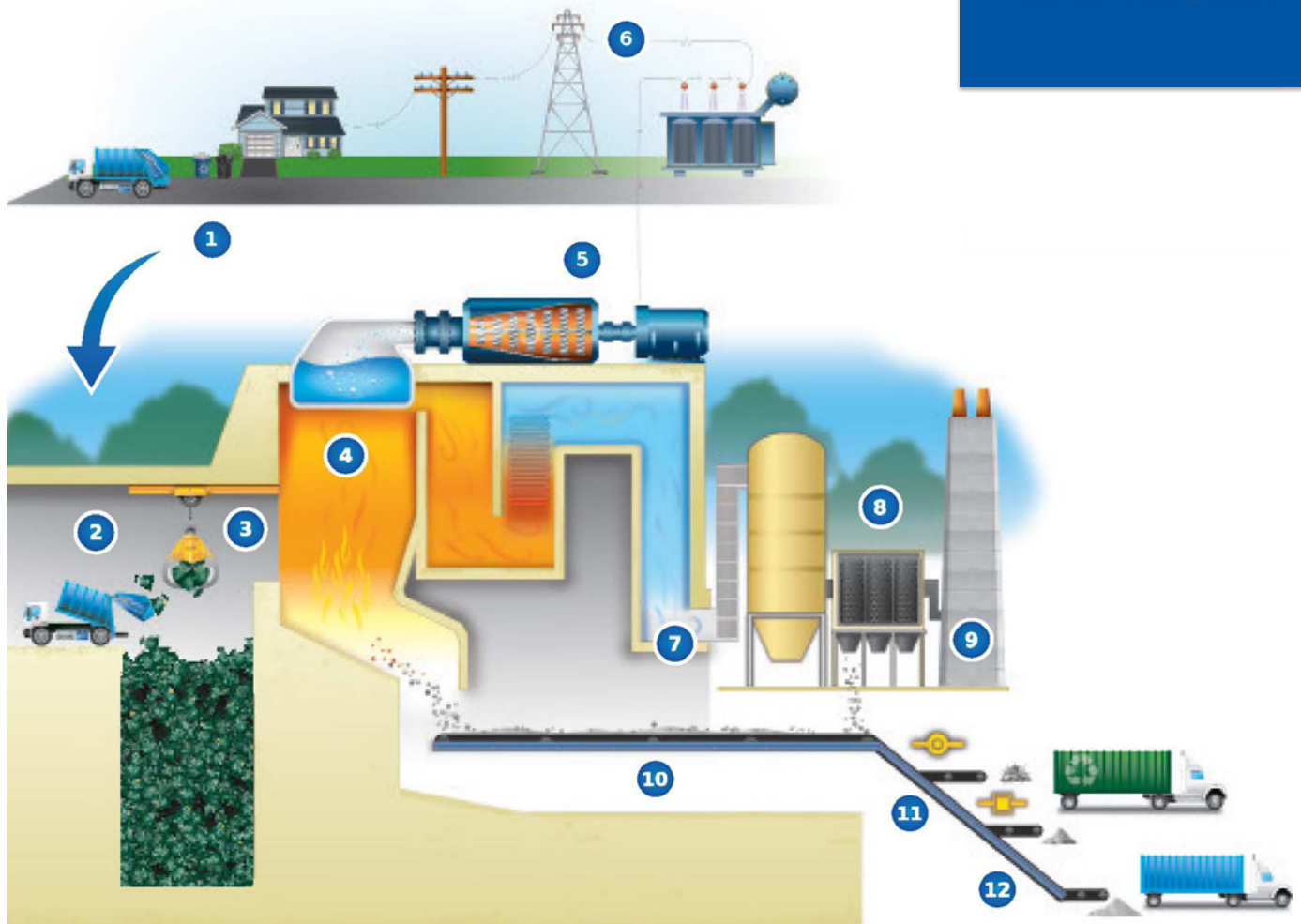

- 1** Post-recycled municipal solid waste is picked up at your home or business.
- 2** Waste is delivered and temporarily stored in a bunker. We maintain the building around the tipping and bunker area under negative pressure and use this air in the combustion process to control odor.
- 3** The waste is fed into a combustion chamber and burned at extremely high temperatures in a self-sustaining process.
- 4** Heat from combustion boils water to create steam.
- 5** The steam turns a turbine-driven generator to produce electricity, or may sometimes be used directly for heating or industrial processes.
- 6** Electricity is distributed to the grid and used to power homes and businesses.
- 7** State-of-the-art air pollution control equipment is used to cool, collect, and clean combustion gases. This equipment operates under stringent state and federal standards.
- 8** We control emissions of particulate matter primarily through a baghouse (fabric filter).
- 9** Emissions and other operating criteria are continuously monitored to ensure compliance with state and federal standards.
- 10** Residual material from the combustion process is collected for processing and metals extraction.
- 11** Ferrous and non-ferrous metals are extracted for recycling.
- 12** Remaining residual materials are beneficially reused or disposed of in a landfill.

American Heart Month

FEBRUARY 2023



Heart disease is the leading cause of death in the United States. The term “heart disease” refers to several types of heart conditions. In the United States, the most common type of heart disease is coronary artery disease (CAD), which can lead to a heart attack. You can greatly reduce your risk for heart disease through lifestyle changes and, in some cases, medicine.

What can you do to prevent Heart Disease?

- Choose healthy foods and drinks.
- Eating lots of foods high in saturated fat and trans fat may contribute to heart disease.
- Eating foods high in fiber and low in saturated fats, trans fat, and cholesterol can help prevent high cholesterol.
- Limiting salt (sodium) in your diet can also lower your blood pressure.
- Limiting sugar in your diet can lower your blood sugar level to prevent or help control diabetes.
- Do not drink too much alcohol, which can raise your blood pressure.

Keep a Healthy Weight

People who are overweight or obese have a higher risk for heart disease. Carrying extra weight can put extra stress on the heart and blood vessels.

Get Regular Physical Activity

Physical activity can help you maintain a healthy weight and lower your blood pressure, blood cholesterol, and blood sugar levels. For adults, the Surgeon General recommends two hours and 30 minutes of moderate-intensity exercise like walking or bicycling every week.

Don't Smoke

Cigarette smoking greatly increases your risk for heart disease. If you don't smoke, don't start. If you do smoke, it's never too late to quit — quitting lowers your risk for heart disease. Your doctor can suggest ways to help you.

Take Charge of Your Medical Conditions

If you have high cholesterol, high blood pressure, or diabetes, you can take steps to lower your risk for heart disease.

1. Check your cholesterol

Your healthcare team should test your blood levels of cholesterol at least once every 4 to 6 years. If you have already been diagnosed with high cholesterol or have a family history of the condition, you may need to have your cholesterol checked more often. Talk with your healthcare team about this simple blood test. If you have high cholesterol, medicines and lifestyle changes can help reduce your risk for heart disease.

2. Control your blood pressure

High blood pressure usually has no symptoms, so have it checked on a regular basis. Your healthcare team should measure your blood pressure at least once every 2 years if you have never had high blood pressure or other risk factors for heart disease. If you have been diagnosed with high blood pressure, also called hypertension, your healthcare team will measure your blood pressure more often to make sure you have the condition under control.

If you have high blood pressure, your healthcare team might recommend some changes in your lifestyle, such as lowering the sodium in your diet; your doctor may also prescribe medicine to help lower your blood pressure.

3. Manage your diabetes

If you have diabetes, monitor your blood sugar levels carefully. Talk with your healthcare team about treatment options. Your doctor may recommend certain lifestyle changes to help keep your blood sugar under control. These actions will help reduce your risk for heart disease.

4. Take your medications as Directed and work with your healthcare team

If you take medicine to treat high blood cholesterol, high blood pressure, or diabetes, follow your doctor's instructions carefully. Always ask questions if you don't understand something. Never stop taking your medicine without first talking to your doctor, nurse, or pharmacist.

You and your healthcare team can work together to prevent or treat the medical conditions that lead to heart disease. Discuss your treatment plan regularly, and bring a list of questions to your appointments. Talk with your healthcare team about how heart disease and mental health disorders are related.

ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

U.S. 441 (S.R. 500/U.S. 27) from Morse Boulevard to north of SE 178th Place

Marion County and Sumter County

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will provide access management and safety improvements on U.S. 441 (State Road (S.R.) 500/U.S. 27) from Morse Boulevard to north of SE 178th Place to extend the life of the existing roadway.

Work will consist of milling and resurfacing the roadway from Morse Boulevard to north of SE 178th Place. The project will construct nearly 1.3 miles of new sidewalk on both sides of the roadway and include pavement widening for shoulders, drainage modifications and traffic signal adjustments. Other improvements consist of pedestrian lighting at various locations along the corridor.

WHAT TO EXPECT

During construction, motorists should expect lane closures and detours on weekdays. Electronic message boards and other signage will be used to direct traffic through the work zone.

Uneven pavement is a common condition with projects that require temporary asphalt pavement or resurfacing, as the contractor must put down different layers of asphalt during various phases of construction. Motorists are asked to exercise caution and reduce their speed while driving through the work zone. The construction schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions.

SANITARY SEWER LINING PROJECT

UPDATED 1/18/2023



As part of the District's continued commitment to providing our residents with efficient and dependable utility service, the Sanitary Sewer Lining Project for Unit 01 located in the Lake County portion of The Villages will commence on Monday, January 30, 2023.

Sewer lining is performed in-place and essentially results in a new pipe being installed inside of the existing pipe with no reduction of capacity. The rehabilitation of the system will improve the sewer system and reduce the potential for leaks.

This project will temporarily impact roughly 87 homes along the following streets:

- **Aloha Way**
- **Vermont Avenue**
- **Paradise Drive**
- **Owen Drive**

All construction is anticipated to be completed within three (3) weeks, ending around February 20, 2023. While a specific section of sewer pipeline is being lined, the affected residents' sewer connections will be out of service. The contractor will perform work during normal business hours. We ask that affected residents minimize their water use during these hours and please **DO NOT** shower, bathe, use dishwashers or washing machines during this time. We also ask that affected residents keep all toilet flushing to an absolute minimum. Service will likely be restored within 4 – 8 hours or by end of each day. All affected residents will receive at least 24-hour notice of their scheduled outage via door hangers.

The safety of our residents and construction personnel is of the utmost importance. Please abide by all barricades and warning signs and to avoid the active construction areas for anything other than access to your property. 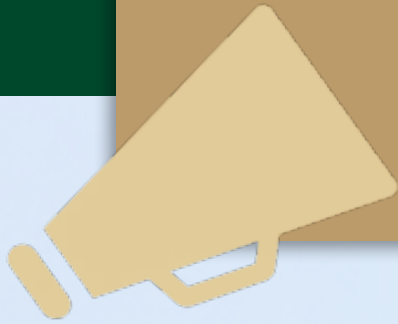
