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TUNNEL MIRROR REPLACEMENTS

District Property Management



Golf Car Tunnel Mirror Replacements

District Property Management conducts continuous inspections to implement better safety on our multi-modal paths. One of the improvements DPM initiated is the installation of 36-inch round traffic-grade mirrors at blind spots in our tunnels to help residents see oncoming traffic and provide additional safety for our pedestrians and bicyclists.

This project began by exchanging the existing mirrors in our blind spots and 90-degree turns. DPM is also inspecting T-junctions and will exchange those that don't meet proper reflectivity levels with the new half-dome mirrors.

We have replaced the half-dome mirrors with 36-inch 180-degree angled mirrors. We also changed the round mirrors from 24" to 36" for better visibility at turns.

District Property Management will continue to strive and take every precaution to ensure the safety of our Village residents.

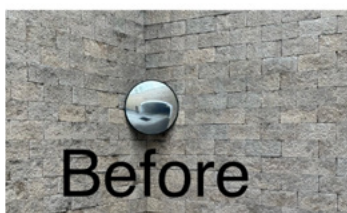
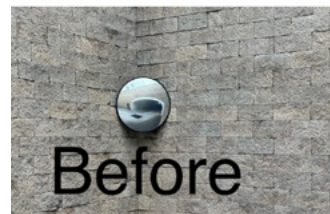

The Eisenhower Recreation Center Sports Pool was closed on February 15, 2023 to receive a complete renovation. During the renovation, new pool Marcite, waterline tile, lane tile, depth markers and deck channel drains were installed.

In addition, two coats of a water-based sealer were applied to the

deck pavers to protect them from staining. Newly designed sports pool hardware was installed, which will allow for the easy installation and removal of water volleyball equipment.

The renovation was a success and the end result is spectacular. The pool is scheduled to reopen on Monday, March 13, 2023.

External and Internal Deed Compliance

What is an external deed restriction and who can enforce them?

Deed restrictions are declarations between the Declarant (Developer named in your individual Declaration of Restrictions) and the Property Owner. Who can enforce the external deed restrictions?

- Any property owner of any lot may seek to enforce external restrictions against another property owner.
- The Declarant may seek to enforce external and internal restrictions.
- The Villages Community Development Districts through adopted Rule may enforce certain EXTERNAL restrictions that have been adopted by each Board to enforce as authorized by Chapter 190 of Florida Statutes.
- External deed restriction violations include, but are not limited to, external modifications made without ARC approval, overgrown or dead grass and weeds, and inoperable vehicles.

What is an internal deed restriction and who can enforce them?

Deed restrictions are declarations between the Declarant (Developer named in your individual Declaration of Restrictions) and the Property Owner. Who can enforce the internal deed restrictions?

- Any property owner of any lot may seek to enforce internal restrictions against another property owner.
- The Declarant may seek to enforce internal restrictions.
- Examples of internal deed restriction violations include, but are not limited to, underage children living in the home or running a business from the home.

External and Internal Deed Compliance

Why can't the Districts enforce internal deed restrictions?

The Villages Community Development Districts through adopted Rule may enforce certain EXTERNAL restrictions that have been adopted by each Board to enforce as authorized by Chapter 190 of Florida Statutes.

How do I know what my deed restrictions are?

How can I submit a concern?

You can report potential violations by contacting the

Community Standards Department by phone at 352-751-3912, by email at DeedCompliance@districtgov.org or by visiting our office at 984 Old Mill Run.

Once I submit a concern, what happens next?

Once Community Standards receives a complaint about an external violation, the Staff verifies the complaint.

If the complaint is verified, the Staff works with the property owner in an attempt to bring the property into compliance. If contact is not made with the Owner, Staff begins the process as adopted by each District Board.

If a complaint is received for an internal violation, the complaint is provided to the Declarant.

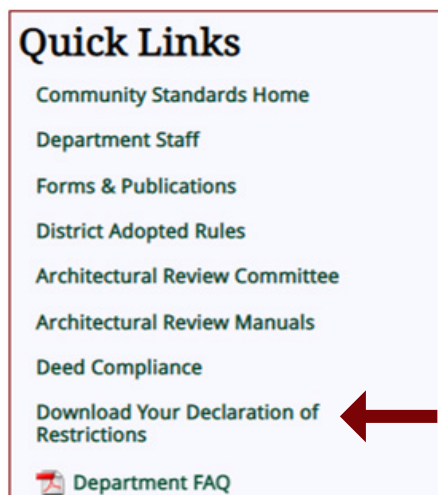

Solid Waste - Bulk Pickup

Information Provided By...



Residents living in Village Community Development Districts 1-11, located in Sumter County, Marion County and The Villages of Fruitland Park

The following items can be placed in your regular household waste pick-up:

- Lamps
- Plastic Chairs
- Ceiling fans (blades must be removed)
- Brooms
- Pallets
- Carpeting and/or padding (No larger than 4' x 4' & less than 40 lbs.)

A Bulk Item Pick-Up will need to be scheduled for larger items such as:

- Microwaves and small kitchen appliances
- Office chairs/desk chairs/kitchen chairs
- 2-burner grills

- Flat-screen TVs
- Ironing boards
- Electronics (computers, stereo equipment, monitors etc.)
- Furniture (oversized chairs, mattresses, box springs, etc.)
- Appliances (washer, dryer, dishwasher, refrigerator)
- Lawn Mowers
- Exercise Equipment
- Remodeling debris generated by the homeowner ONLY (sinks, toilets, carpeting, lumber etc.)
All Contractors are required to remove all debris from their jobs. This includes lawn maintenance, tree trimmers, builders, carpet installers, roofers, etc.

To schedule a bulk pick-up, call 352-748-0109. There will be a \$10 charge added to your utilities and amenities bill each time a bulk pick-up is requested.

Trash Collection Reminders



Bags must be placed for collection before 6:00 AM on your collection day or no sooner than 5:00 PM the night before.

The trash bags should be left at the end of your driveway, not in the street.

No garbage cans are allowed, they will be disposed of with the household waste.

Wrap broken glass or other sharp objects in newspaper and place them where they cannot cause injury.

All household waste should be placed in sealed tall kitchen trash bags or 20-30 gallon trash bags (any color but red, which is used for medical waste).

Limbs and branches should be bundled and tied and may not exceed 4" in diameter, 4' in length or exceed 40 pounds.

Each bag should weigh no more than 40 pounds.

For the safety and quality assurance of residents, guests and workers, please adhere to the following requests:

- Reschedule any work or deliveries to your Villa until the paving is complete as they may be denied access. Only residents and emergency vehicles will have immediate access during the construction.
- PLEASE DO NOT run your irrigation, wash your vehicle or empty your pool during the week, as it will increase the work time.
- ALL vehicles and trailers must be parked OFF of the roads and the overflow parking areas must be empty, so as to not impede the work.
- Please be advised that newly paved roadways will take approximately one hour to cure and should not be driven on while hot! Driving before this time could result in tracking asphalt onto your driveway and damaging the new roadway.
- If you must travel through the construction, PLEASE drive slowly and watch for and listen to directions provided by the contract workers.

Our goal is to give you a new road that will endure its maximum life with the least amount of inconvenience. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. If you have any questions during the work, there will be someone on sight to help. For the safety of our crews and all residents, we ask that you reschedule any work or deliveries to your Villa until the paving is complete as they may be denied access. Only residents and emergency vehicles will have immediate access during the construction.

ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

U.S. 441 (S.R. 500/U.S. 27) from Morse Boulevard to north of SE 178th Place

Marion County and Sumter County

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will provide access management and safety improvements on U.S. 441 (State Road (S.R.) 500/U.S. 27) from Morse Boulevard to north of SE 178th Place to extend the life of the existing roadway.

Work will consist of milling and resurfacing the roadway from Morse Boulevard to north of SE 178th Place. The project will construct nearly 1.3 miles of new sidewalk on both sides of the roadway and include pavement widening for shoulders, drainage modifications and traffic signal adjustments. Other improvements consist of pedestrian lighting at various locations along the corridor.

WHAT TO EXPECT

During construction, motorists should expect lane closures and detours on weekdays. Electronic message boards and other signage will be used to direct traffic through the work zone.

Uneven pavement is a common condition with projects that require temporary asphalt pavement or resurfacing, as the contractor must put down different layers of asphalt during various phases of construction. Motorists are asked to exercise caution and reduce their speed while driving through the work zone. The construction schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions.

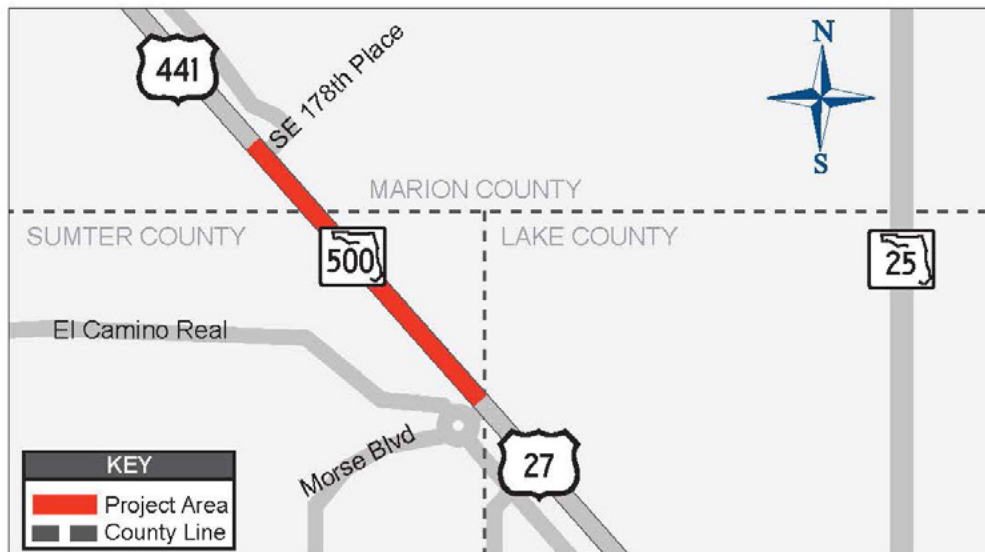

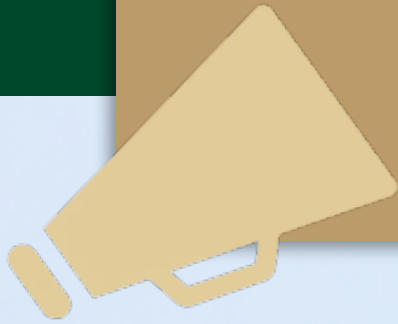
