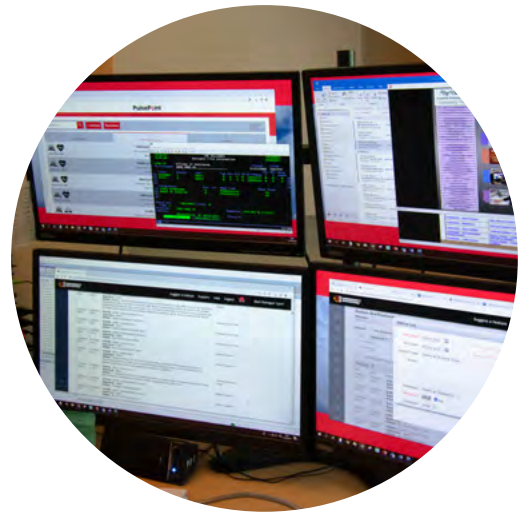

PROTECT YOUR PIPES

BY REDUCING FATS, OILS & GREASE

IN YOUR HOME AND COMMUNITY

GREASE IS A PROBLEM

Many food items contain fat, oil & grease (FOG) that can be harmful to your pipes and sewer system. Pouring FOG materials down your kitchen sink can result in dangerous sewage backups in your home and community. FOG materials include:

- Meat drippings
- Oil
- Butter
- Dressings
- Cooking fats

HOW GREASE AFFECTS YOU

Fat, oil & grease solidify and can build up in your sewer pipes potentially resulting in blockages. Outside of your home, FOG can build up in the collection system and lift stations potentially causing odors and sewage overflows in our neighborhoods. FOG can cause:

- Property damage
- Pipe maintenance requirements
- Health & environmental hazards due to overflows

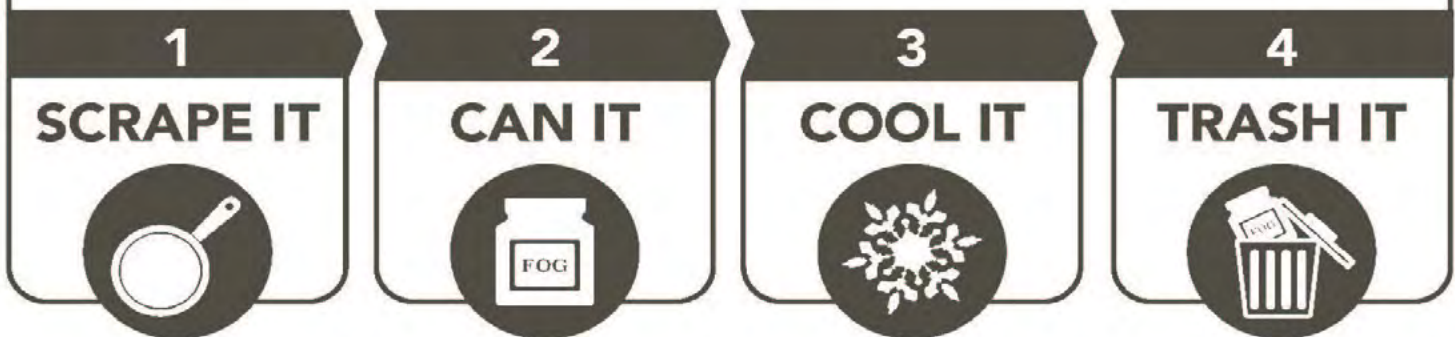

Recreation Code of Conduct

Recreation is an integral part of the lifestyle of The Villages community, providing our residents with outlets for leisure, exercise, socializing and entertainment. To ensure that your programs and activities remain enjoyable for everyone, it's important that we respect our recreation facilities and fellow residents who utilize them. When using the recreation facilities, we share with you the recreation code of conduct. If any issues arise, we ask that you work towards a resolution, taking advantage of the following mechanisms that are in place to help you do so.

The use of obscenity, profanity or vulgarity in any conversations involving participants or department staff will not be tolerated.

It is everyone's responsibility to maintain a safe, pleasant and comfortable playing atmosphere. Every individual who participates in any program has the right to be treated with respect. The Golden Rule, "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you," prevails.

Closing of Outdoor Facilities

The Villages Recreation & Parks Department, in partnership with the Community Watch Department, as stewards of Recreation Facilities within The Villages, are requesting your cooperation when closing outdoor Recreation Facilities.

The time of dusk fluctuates throughout the year. Dusk is the window of time usually within a 30 minute timespan after sunset. When closing facilities, staff ensures there is adequate

lighting to enter, inspect, and allow participants the ability to exit the facilities in a safe manner. Safety is of the utmost importance and we appreciate you taking this into consideration as staff closes the facilities.

Recreation & Parks and Community Watch teams appreciate your support and adherence as we aim to be good stewards of the recreation facilities while ensuring the safety and wellbeing of both staff and residents.

Annual Plantings

Annual plants or “Seasonal Color” are plants that grow from seed to flower, produce seeds, and die within a single growing season.

On District property within The Villages, landscape contractors install around 2 million (and counting) annuals every year, replanting by hand every quarter to coordinate with Florida weather and seasons for full color appearance throughout the year.

These annuals are contract grown in nurseries around the state of Florida. Once the plants are ready, it is crucial that they be installed quickly to avoid becoming root bound in the container and shortening their life expectancy.

We do not specify the species as long as they are plants proven to work in our area and adhere to the design intent within The Villages. This provides a change of color as you move through The Villages.

Palmetto Executive Golf Course Closure Notice

In our efforts to provide optimum conditions on the Executive Golf Courses, the Palmetto Executive Golf Course will be closed Friday, March 24, 2023 for several weeks to undergo necessary maintenance work. This closure will give the maintenance team time to execute cultural practices on the greens and tees such as aerification and sand topdressing to aid with drainage, relieve compaction and provide oxygen to the root zone. Additionally, the maintenance team will work on eradicating disturbing winter weeds like Poa annua grass. We thank you for your patience during this closure.

Belmont Executive Golf Course Closure Notice

The Belmont Executive Golf Course will be closed Saturday, April 1, 2023 until further notice. This closure is part of the Project Wide Advisory Committee approved Capital Infrastructure Improvement Project. This project will consist of new greens, tees, fairways and new bunker sand. Additional landscaping and cart path improvements will take place as well during the closure. We thank you for your patience and look forward to opening the revitalized course in the fall.

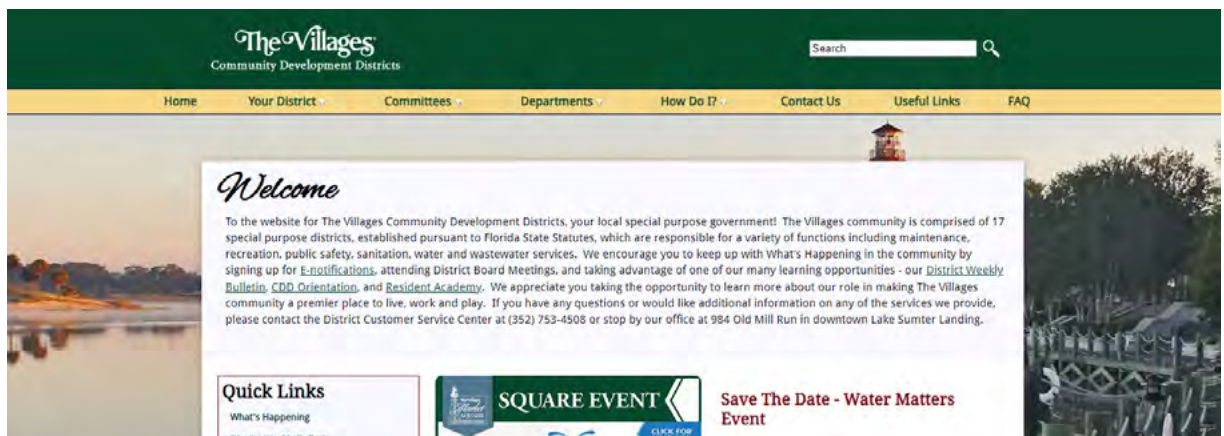




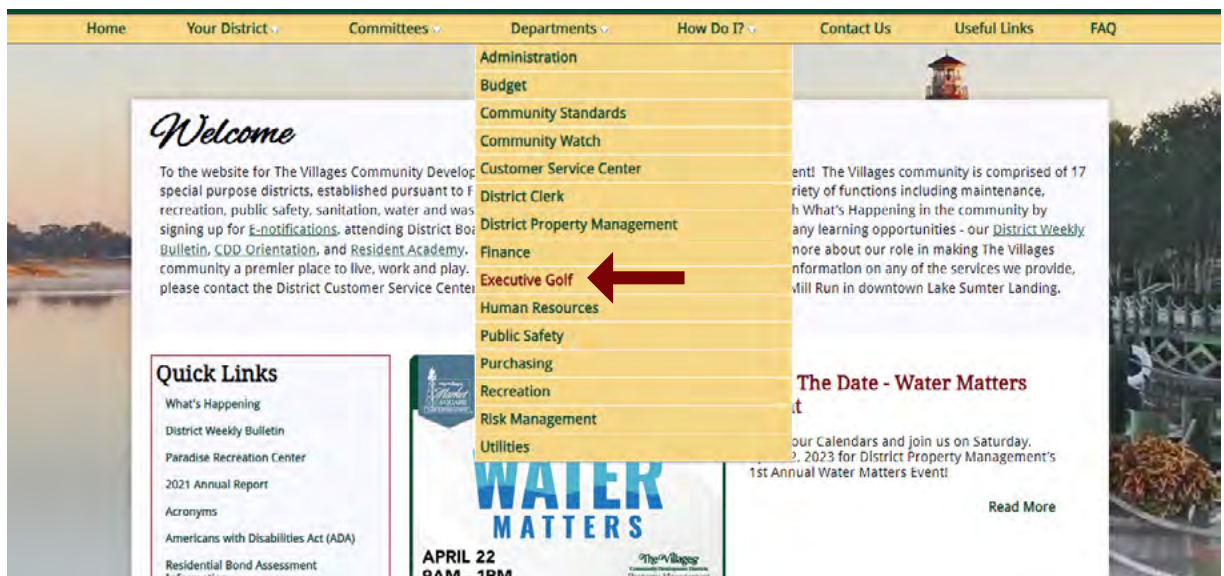

HOW TO PACKAGE AND TRANSPORT CHEMICALS

4. Place leaky container in clear plastic bag and transport in box with newspaper.
5. Put boxes in trunk or in back of vehicle away from passengers.

- PLEASE DO NOT run your irrigation, wash your vehicle or empty your pool during the week, as it will increase the work time.
- ALL vehicles and trailers must be parked OFF of the roads and the overflow parking areas must be empty, so as to not impede the work.
- Please be advised that newly paved roadways will take approximately one hour to cure and should not be driven on while hot! Driving before this time could result in tracking asphalt onto your driveway and damaging the new roadway.
- If you must travel through the construction, PLEASE drive slowly and watch for and listen to directions provided by the contract workers.

Our goal is to give you a new road that will endure its maximum life with the least amount of inconvenience. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. If you have any questions during the work, there will be someone on sight to help. For the safety of our crews and all residents, we ask that you reschedule any work or deliveries to your Villa until the paving is complete as they may be denied access. 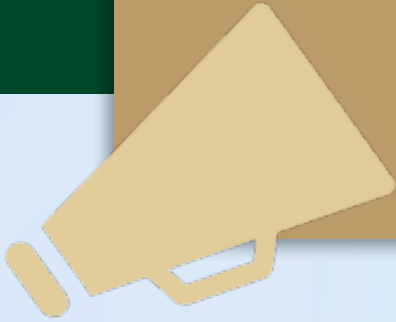
