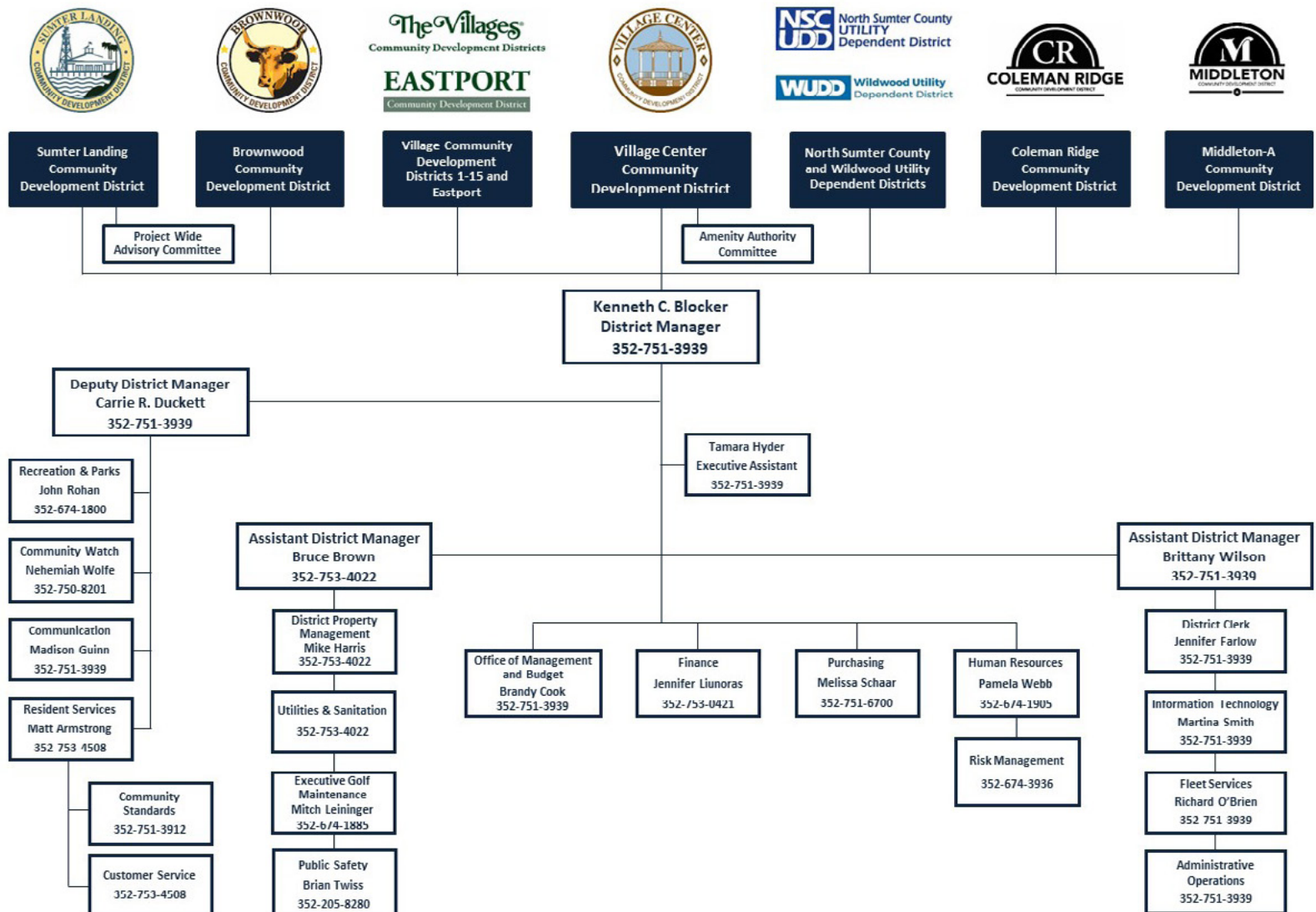

Spring is finally here, but in The Villages, the spring weather came early! While our golf courses have been busy with play all winter, it is now time to start waking up the grass for the warmer weather ahead.

This is the time of year that we call "transition season", where we are not only transitioning from one season to the next, but also from one turf type to another. It's starting to get a little too warm for the ryegrass that we put on the tee boxes, however it's still a little too cool for the bermudagrass to take back over.

Golf maintenance teams are having to maintain cold season and warm season turf in the same place at the same time! So when you see a tee that looks like the one below, know that it is not dead or dying, the warm season grass is just trying to wake up.

TURF TIP

Do you know why the green and white stakes on all of the golf courses are there? These stakes indicate areas where we try to reduce traffic to allow turf to heal before driving on the area. They are typically placed along the path where a golfer may park half on the path and half in the grass.

The spring pine straw application is also wrapping up for all of the courses now. Pine straw gives the landscape beds a little pop and helps us with weed control and erosion.



Have you ever seen a green that looks like the one above and wondered what the bright green spots are? These spots are known as "off types" or "contaminated" Bermuda. This means that the physical properties of the hybrid bermudagrass that we use actually changes over time. While it's not very aesthetically pleasing, it is also a sign that the green is aging. A common misconception is that this weed can be sprayed or pulled. Unfortunately, once it starts to take over, it's there until we are able to renovate the greens.

Spanish Springs Flagpole Construction Project

The new flagpole and foundation have now been installed at Spanish Springs Town Square. District Property Management reopened the US 441 and Main Street entrance on the morning of Tuesday, April 4, 2023 once the barricades were removed.



Now that the new foundation is in place, the concrete will need to cure until it reaches 80% of structural strength before installing the new flagpole. When the new flagpole is being installed, one lane of traffic at Main Street and 441 will be closed for the majority of the day.

National Public Safety



Telecommunicators Week: April 9 - 15, 2023

Every year during the second week of April, the telecommunications personnel in the public safety community, are honored. National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week celebrates and thanks those who dedicate their lives to serving the public. It is a week that should be set aside so everyone can be made aware of their hard work and dedication.

Every day and night all across the country, public safety telecommunicators answer emergency and non-emergency calls. They connect callers to emergency care and provide valuable resources to those in need.

An estimated 240 million calls are made to 9-1-1 in the U.S. each year. In many areas, 80% or more are from wireless devices. (<https://www.nena.org/page/911Statistics>).

How to observe Public Safety Telecommunicator Week:

- Review 9-1-1 emergency call advice.
- 9-1-1 is for police, fire, and medical emergencies only. Non-emergency calls should be directed to non-emergency phone numbers.
- Details are critical. Stay on the line with the 9-1-1 operator and answer all questions. Provide an accurate

location. If you do not know the exact address, provide the call taker with all the details that you can. Look for landmarks, streets, signs and buildings. First responders need an accurate location to respond as fast as possible.

- Try to stay calm and speak clearly.
- Don't hang up when calling 9-1-1. If you called by mistake, let the operator know.
- Do not call 9-1-1 as a joke or prank.

National Public Safety Telecommunicator Week History:

Patricia Anderson of Contra Costa County (Calif.) Sheriff's Office conceived the idea for a National Public Safety Telecommunicator Week in 1981. It was quickly adopted in Virginia and North Carolina. By the 1990s, the national association of Public-Safety Communications Officials (APCO) convinced Congress of the need for a formal proclamation.

In 1994, National Public Safety Telecommunicator Week was formally recognized and is celebrated each year during the second full week of April to coincide with National 9-1-1 Education Month.

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Precautionary Water Boil Notices

Information Provided By...



What is a Precautionary Boil Water Notice?

A major component of service provided by the District's Utilities Department is the risk assessment involving waterborne contaminants through natural or man-made means. It is our responsibility to provide guidance and assistance to prevent exposure to drinking water contaminants that could present a threat to our resident's health.

Water suppliers are required by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) to notify customers to boil water when conditions exist that may cause the water supply to be vulnerable to the potential for contamination. A Precautionary Boil Water Notice (PBWN) is a form of notification that advises customers to boil tap water used for drinking, cooking and ice-making until tests verify the water is safe.

The determination that the water is safe is a process through which the Utility Operations and Maintenance Contractor sends water samples to a State Certified Water Testing Lab and receives a report back, usually after 48

hours, stating that the water samples meets all federal and state regulations. The precautionary boil water notice would then be rescinded by notifying all affected residents.

An incident that requires a PBWN may include a water, wastewater or irrigation incident that could develop as a result of, but not limited to, a water line break, a problem at a water plant, a new connection to an existing line, a sewer back up, a Wastewater Treatment Plant incident or shutting off the water and turning it back on.

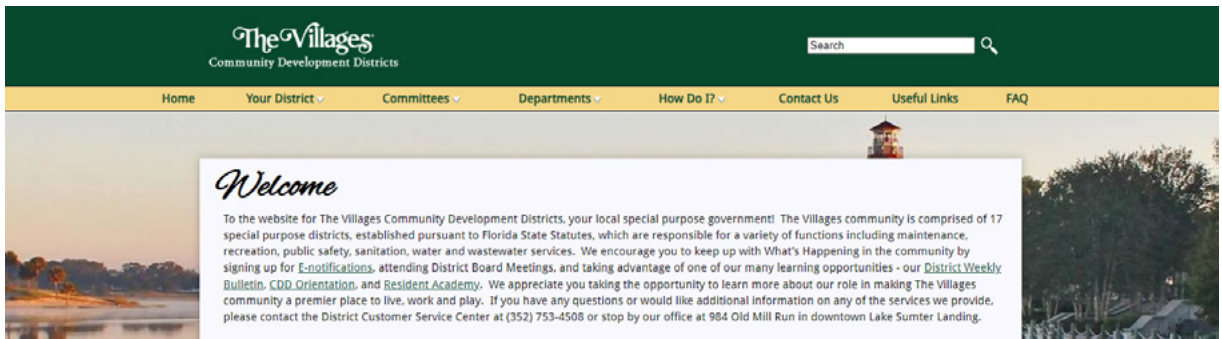

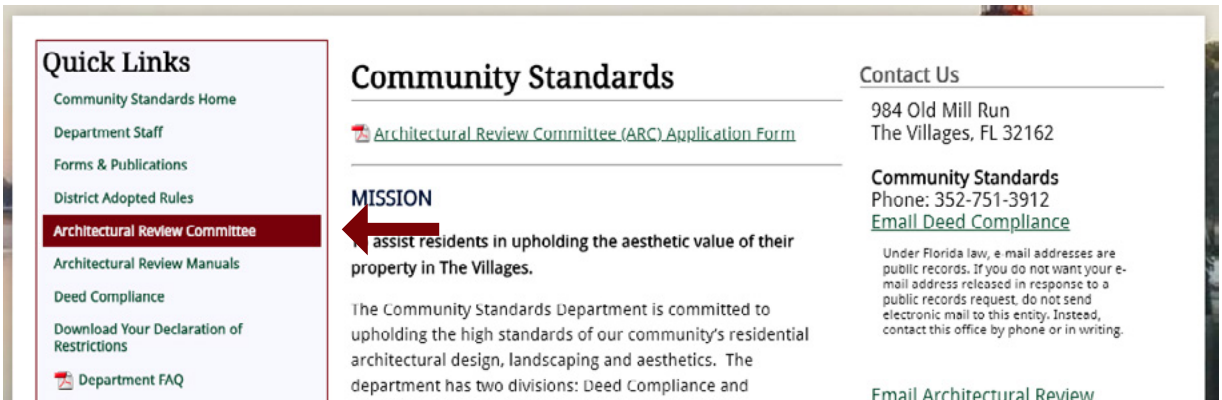

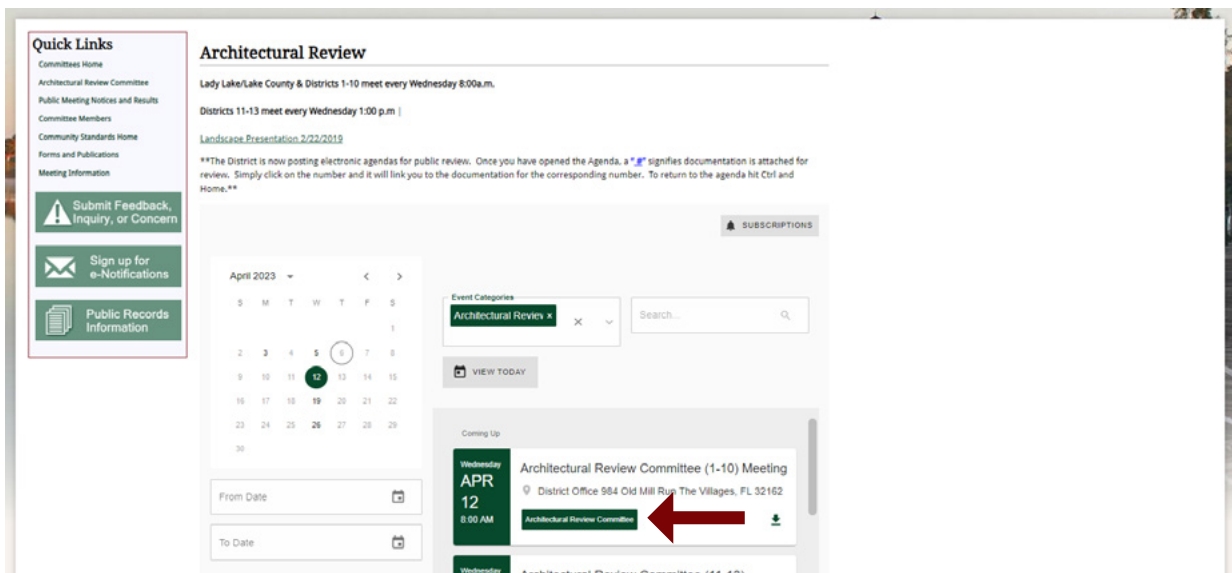

Did you know that many of the water retention areas in our community are connected through various inlets and pipes?

In addition to storm water, everything that enters the storm water pipes can end up in the water retention areas throughout our community. This includes trash, leaves, fertilizer, soap from washing vehicles, animal droppings and more.

Please help us ensure the health and continued maintenance of the water retention basins throughout The Villages by not placing ANYTHING in any of the storm water drains. Our National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit does not allow dumping into these storm drain systems. If you see anything being placed in storm water drains, contact District Property Management at 352-753-4022.


FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How Do I Travel Around A Roundabout?

In cooperation with the Sumter County Sheriff’s Office, the Sumter County Board of County Commissioners developed a guide to navigating roundabouts.

To learn the proper guidelines for navigating roundabouts in Sumter County, see the brochure below and on the following page.

Remember:
To avoid conflict, do not use the right-hand lane to make a left turn through the roundabout.



Approaching Roundabouts


- Reduce your speed and prepare to YIELD to all traffic in the roundabout.
- Guide signs provide guidance for approach street locations, not lane use orientation.

Choose your lane:
Approaching a two lane roundabout, make a lane choice according to the following rules:

- If you intend to exit the roundabout more than halfway around, use the LEFT-HAND lane.
- If you intend to exit the roundabout less than halfway around, use the RIGHT-HAND lane.
- If you intend to continue straight through, use either lane unless signs or markings indicate otherwise.

Navigating Roundabouts


- Move up to the entrance line and wait for a gap in traffic. DO NOT ENTER next to a vehicle in the roundabout, as that vehicle may be exiting at the next exit.
- Within the roundabout, do not stop except to avoid a collision; you have the right-of-way over entering traffic. Keep moving in a counterclockwise direction.
- Do not change lanes in a roundabout.
- A striped channelization island is present in several roundabouts, which reduces the circulatory roadway to one lane approaching a single-lane exit.




Best Practices:


- Do not change lanes within the roundabout or as you exit
- Do not overtake other vehicles or bicyclists within the roundabout
- Be aware of other vehicles in the roundabout
- Follow pavement striping and arrows for guidance - exit roundabouts with caution
- YIELD to emergency vehicles before or after the roundabout - DO NOT STOP in the roundabout
- Give oversized vehicles extra room because they may need both lanes to maneuver
- Indicate your exit using your right-turn signal

What is a Roundabout?

A roundabout is a circular intersection where vehicles yield at entry to traffic already within the circulatory roadway and all vehicles flow in a counterclockwise direction around a central island.

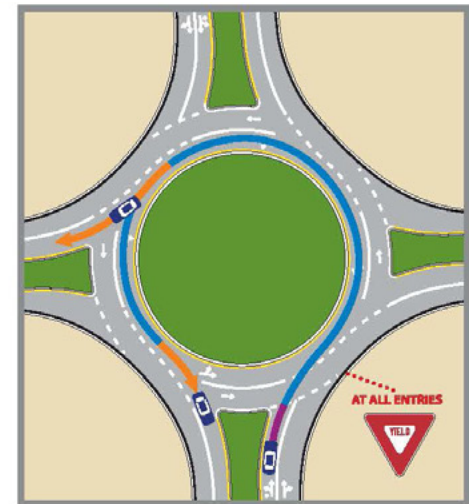
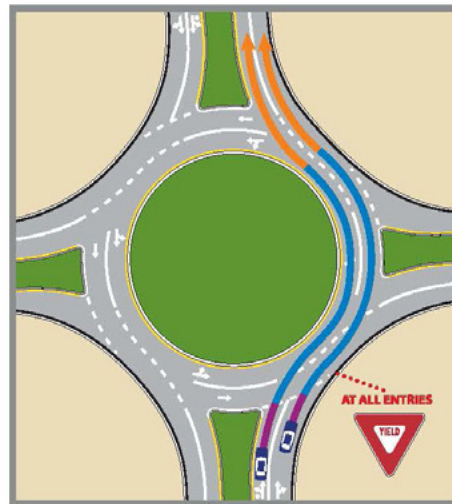
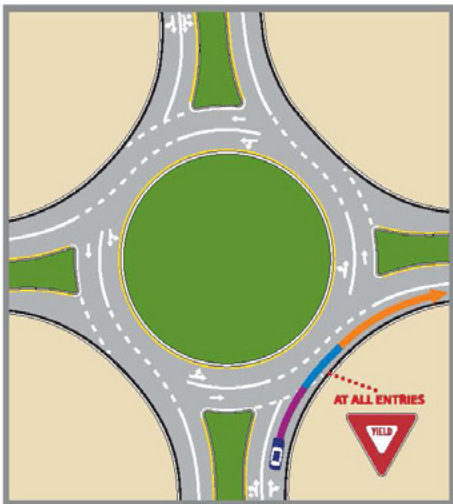

Driving Roundabouts



Turning Right



- 1. APPROACHING:** Be in the right-hand lane unless otherwise marked on the roadway, and use a right-turn signal.
- 2. CIRCULATING:** Keep to the right-hand (outside) lane of the roundabout and continue to use your right-turn signal through your exit. **Do not change lanes.**
- 3. EXITING:** Stay in the right-hand lane as you exit the roundabout.

Going Straight Ahead



- 1. APPROACHING:** You can be in either lane, unless otherwise marked on roadway or posted.
- 2. CIRCULATING:** Stay to the inside of the circulatory roadway if you entered from the left-hand approach lane, or stay to the outside if you entered from the right-hand approach lane. **Do not change lanes.**
- When you have passed the last exit before the one you want, use your right-turn signal and continue to use it through your exit.
- 4. EXITING:** As you exit the roundabout, be aware of vehicles traveling on the outside of the circulatory roadway that may continue to circulate around the roundabout.

Turning Left or Making a U-Turn



- 1. APPROACHING:** Be in the left-hand lane unless otherwise marked on the roadway, and use a left-turn signal.
- 2. CIRCULATING:** Stay in the left-hand lane of the circulatory roadway until you are ready to exit.
- When you have passed the last exit before the one you want, use your right-turn signal and continue to use it through your exit. **Do not change lanes.**
- 4. EXITING:** As you exit the roundabout, be aware of vehicles traveling on the outside of the circulatory roadway that may continue to circulate around the roundabout.

- PLEASE DO NOT run your irrigation, wash your vehicle or empty your pool during the week, as it will increase the work time.
- ALL vehicles and trailers must be parked OFF of the roads and the overflow parking areas must be empty, so as to not impede the work.
- Please be advised that newly paved roadways will take approximately one hour to cure and should not be driven on while hot! Driving before this time could result in tracking asphalt onto your driveway and damaging the new roadway.
- If you must travel through the construction, PLEASE drive slowly and watch for and listen to directions provided by the contract workers.

Our goal is to give you a new road that will endure its maximum life with the least amount of inconvenience. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. 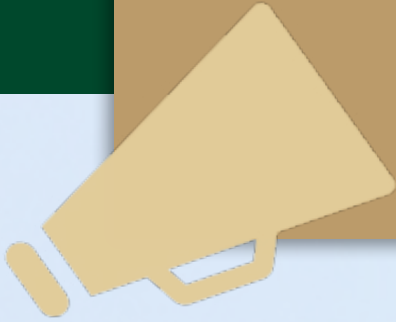
