DPM completed the proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 23-24 and it is currently being reviewed. There are several maintenance projects included in the budget involving facilities that are seen and enjoyed by thousands of residents and quests every day. These projects include pool renovations, exterior painting of Recreation Centers, sport court resurfacing, all landscaping, mill and overlay of roadways and fence replacements to name a few. This is in addition to the regular day-to-day maintenance work that DPM performs.

Preparing the new budget requires us to use the District's Core Values of Stewardship and Hard Work. In an everchanging world, the District is faced with challenges on a daily basis such as limited contractors, weather constraints, material shortages and additional monetary surcharges. District Property Management understands and manages each project to lessen these impacts and continue to maintain the lifestyle that every resident of The Villages has come to love and enjoy.

Each Division within DPM — Landscaping, Infrastructure, Water Resources, Town Centers, Construction, Facilities and Special Projects, reviews their current and upcoming projects to determine if they can be completed in the current Fiscal Year. If a project cannot be completed within that Fiscal Year, it will be re-budgeted for the following Fiscal Year. DPM tracks each project until its completion, but even with the best planning, not everything always goes as projected. DPM staff has to be very reactive to adapt to sudden changes.

Flagpole Guidelines

Did you know there are flagpole guidelines when installing a pole on your property? The flagpole guidelines within the community are as follows:

- Displaying a portable flag mounted on a home does not require architectural approval.
- A flagpole requires prior written approval by the Architectural Review Committee to confirm it is not being installed within any easement area and does not exceed twenty-two (22) feet in height.





Flagpole Installation requires prior Architectural Review Committee approval.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How Do I Travel Around A Roundabout?

In cooperation with the Sumter County Sheriff's Office, the Sumter County Board of County Commissioners developed a guide to navigating roundabouts. To learn the proper guidelines for navigating roundabouts in Sumter County, see the brochure below and on the following page.



Approaching Roundabouts

- Reduce your speed and prepare to YIELD to all traffic in the roundabout.
- Guide signs provide guidance for approach street locations, not lane use orientation.

Choose your lane:

Remember:

Approaching a two lane roundabout, make a lane choice according to the following rules:

- If you intend to exit the roundabout more than halfway around, use the LEFT-HAND lane.
- If you intend to exit the roundabout less than halfway around, use the RIGHT-HAND lane.
- If you intend to continue straight through, use either lane unless signs or markings indicate otherwise.

Navigating Roundabouts

- Move up to the entrance line and wait for a gap in traffic. DO NOT ENTER next to a vehicle in the roundabout, as that vehicle may be exiting at the next exit.
- Within the roundabout, do not stop except to avoid a collision; you have the right-of-way over entering traffic. Keep moving in a counterclockwise direction.
- Do not change lanes in a roundabout.
- A striped channelization island is present in several roundabouts, which reduces the circulatory roadway to one lane approaching a single-lane exit.



Best Practices:

- · Do not change lanes within the roundabout or as you exit
- Do not overtake other vehicles or bicyclists within the roundabout
- · Be aware of other vehicles in the roundabout
- Follow pavement striping and arrows for guidance exit roundabouts with caution
- YIELD to emergency vehicles before or after the roundabout - DO NOT STOP in the roundabout
- Give oversized vehicles extra room because they may need both lanes to manuever
- Indicate your exit using your right-turn signal

What is a Roundabout?

A roundabout is a circular intersection where vehicles yield at entry to traffic already within the circulatory roadway and all vehicles flow in a counter-clockwise direction around a central island.





Turning Left or Making a U-Turn



1. APPROACHING: Be in the left-hand lane unless otherwise marked on the roadway, and use a left-turn signal.

2. CIRCULATING: Stay in the left-hand lane of the circulatory roadway until you are ready to exit.

3. When you have passed the last exit before the one you want, use your right-turn signal and continue to use it through your exit. Do not change lanes.

4. EXITING: As you exit the roundabout, be aware of vehicles traveling on the outside of the circulatory roadway that may continue to circulate around the roundabout.



ONE WAY

Travel in a counterclockwise direction only.





Preventative maintenance is occurring on the potable water system field valves throughout many areas of The Villages. Those customers serviced by Village Center Service Area (VCSA), Little Sumter Service Area (LSSA), North Sumter Utilities (NSU), Central Sumter Utilities (CSU) and South Sumter Utilities (SSU) that will be impacted will be notified 24 hours in advance of a temporary interruption in service and will receive the following notification:

THE PUBLIC DRINKING WATER MAINS IN YOUR AREA WILL BE SHUT DOWN TEMPORARILY FOR NEEDED MAINTENANCE. AS A PRECAUTION, UPON RETURN OF WATER SERVICE, WE ADVISE THAT <u>ALL WATER USED FOR</u> <u>DRINKING, MAKING ICE, AND COOKING BE BOILED, FOR ALL OTHER</u> <u>HOUSE HOLD USES THE WATER IS ACCEPTABLE</u>. A ROLLING BOIL OF ONE MINUTE IS SUFFICIENT. AS AN ALTERNATIVE, BOTTLED WATER MAY BE USED. THIS "PRECAUTIONARY BOIL WATER NOTICE" WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL THE MAINTENANCE TASK HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND A BACTERIOLOGICAL SURVEY SHOWS THAT THE WATER IS SAFE TO DRINK. THIS USUALLY CONSISTS OF A TWO-DAY SAMPLING PERIOD TO INSURE SAFE DRINKING WATER. IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS, YOU MAY CONTACT DEANNA SIMMONS, FROM THE WATER DEPARTMENT AT 352-259-2802 (NSU WWTP).

A notice with the addresses of the affected area along with this information will be left at the door of all impacted addresses. We appreciate your patience and cooperation in order to maintain the continued integrity and safety of the District infrastructure.

IRRIGATION SYSTEM FLUSHING: DISTRICTS 5-8

The Villages Community Development Districts Utilities

Beginning in April 2023, our Utilities Operations and Maintenance contractor (Jacobs), will begin flushing the Villages Water Conservation Authority (VWCA) irrigation system located in Districts 5-8. Flushing prevents the accumulation of small particles and build-up, which can lead to plugging issues in our irrigation system. Due to the size of the VWCA system, the area has been divided into 90 distinct flushing zones. Once started, this project will take approximately 50 weeks to work through all 90 zones.



As the flushing takes place, you will see the Jacobs team opening fire hydrants and flushing irrigation lines only into the roadway. Work hours will be from 8 am to 5 pm. Information will be updated regularly on the District's website on when you can expect to see the Jacobs team in action in your area. Please check out What's Happening and the Weekly Bulletin for updates at <u>DistrictGov.org</u>.

This maintenance work will not have any effects on your drinking water quality nor pressure. This is a proactive effort to maintain your irrigation system.

The safety of residents and contractor personnel is of the utmost importance. We are requesting everyone to abide by all barricades and warning signs and to avoid the active work area for anything other than access to your property.

- Please be advised that newly paved roadways will take approximately one hour to cure and should not be driven on while hot! Driving before this time could result in tracking asphalt onto your driveway and damaging the new roadway.
- If you must travel through the construction, PLEASE drive slowly and watch for and listen to directions provided by the contract workers.

Our goal is to give you a new road that will endure its maximum life with the least amount of inconvenience. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. If you have any questions during the work, there will be someone on sight to help. For the safety of our crews and all residents, we ask that you reschedule any work or deliveries to your Villa until the paving is complete as they may be denied access. Wildwood Utility System Maintenance to Begin Sunday

Temporary Water Discoloration Possible

Wildwood officials are advising residents that state-mandated maintenance on the city's water system may result in intermittent elevated iron levels over the coming week.

According to City Manager Jason McHugh, the water tower on Huey Street will be taken offline temporarily, starting Sunday, May 14, 2023, for routine cleaning and inspection required by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection. Water from other sources in the city's system will be directed to that area, beginning Friday, so customers will not experience a service interruption.

Changes in water velocity, turbidity, and/or directional flow in sections of the line are likely to dislodge accumulated rust in older pipes, and some intermittent discoloration may result, particularly in the downtown, central, and west-side distribution areas.

Maintenance work is scheduled over five days, with the Huey Street tower projected to be back in operation by the end of next week, barring extenuating circumstances.

The city is systematically replacing older galvanized steel lines with polyethylene pipes that do not rust in an ongoing, multi-year project that is expected to reduce the occurrence of discolored water. Older properties in areas served by new mains may still experience rusty water, however, from other sections of the system or if the original residential pipes into the house from the city's connection at the street have not been replaced by homeowners.

"We are doing everything within our power to minimize any inconvenience to customers," said Assistant Utility Director Jason Martin. "Our crews will be working diligently to complete this maintenance as quickly as possible while ensuring our system meets every regulatory requirement and provides a safe, secure, and dependable supply of potable water."
