The Villages Public Safety Department Celebrates National EMS Week 2023





Next week, The Villages Public Safety Department is celebrating National EMS Week 2023 as a way to honor and recognize our amazing front-line personnel and the important job they do in protecting our community and keeping residents safe.





The Villages Public Safety Department is comprised of over 170 full-time staff that service over 140,000 residents of The Villages and surrounding areas.

Last Fiscal Year, The Villages Public Safety Department responded to over 28,000 calls for assistance — 17,937 of them being rescue and emergency medical service calls. For the 28,000+ calls they responded to, their average total response time — from the time the call came in to dispatch to the time they arrived on the scene — was 5 minutes and 45 seconds.

Pool & Spa Saltwater Conversion

The Villages Community Development Districts Property Management

In early 2023, the District Property Management Department (DPM) began the saltwater conversion of all pools and spas maintained by the District (85 Pools and 1 Spa). Saltwater is a less expensive alternative to chlorine that sanitizes and disinfects pool water more naturally.



Saltwater pools aren't actually very salty. To compare, the salt in seawater is concentrated to around 35,000 PPM (parts per million) whereas saltwater pool salinity is about 3,000 PPM, roughly 10 times less than seawater. Saltwater pools utilize salt chlorine generators, also known as salt cells, that convert sodium chloride (ordinary salt) into chlorine when poured into the water. The chlorine generated during the electrolysis process is not the same type commonly used to sanitize chlorinated pools. It's actually a different form, free of chloramines, which are the byproduct of chlorine that can cause skin and eye irritation.

While converting pools and spas to saltwater has an initial startup cost to purchase the salt generators, the lower cost to purchase salt vs chlorine is quite substantial. After the initial set up of the salt generators, maintaining the pools is fairly simple. Unlike chlorine, salt is inexpensive and readily available. Current pool equipment (Pool Filtration Systems and Pool Heaters) can be utilized with saltwater pools, no additional equipment is needed.

The District Property Management Department is pleased to announce that all pools and spas have been converted to saltwater systems as of mid-April 2023. Saltwater pools offer numerous health benefits that range from reducing stress to soothing one's skin. Chlorine can leave skin feeling dry after a swim whereas saltwater is actually beneficial, it acts as a natural moisturizer and increases our skin's ability to retain moisture.

All pools are heated during the cooler months. We strive to keep water temperatures between 81 to 84 degrees. Temperatures may fluctuate depending on the weather.



Tips On Saving Water Indoors

Four Tips to Help Conserve Water Indoors

- Turn off faucet while brushing teeth.
- Take shorter showers.
- Fix leaks in faucets, showerheads and toilets.
- Only wash full loads.

deliver 4 gallons of water per minute. Pressures have been adjusted to the lowflow fixtures to deliver as good a shower as the higher flow showerheads.

If you believe you have a potable water

Watch out for silent leaks in

toilets. Remove the toilet tank lid and any colored cleaning agents. Flush to clear the water in the bowl. Add dye tablets, leak detector fluid or even a few drops of food coloring to the tank. If there is a leak, color will appear in the bowl within 10 to 15 minutes. Flush when the test is completed.

Take shorter showers and make sure there are no leaks in

showerheads. If there is a leak, make sure the showerhead is screwed tightly. Additionally, make sure showerheads are low-flow. Older high-volume showerheads leak, contact Utilities Customer Service at 352-750-0000 and they can review your billing history.

Potable water conservation is a community-wide effort, we all share in the Stewardship of this valuable resource.


Adjust wash cycles for laundry.

Select the minimum volume of water required for each load. Normal and permanent press wash cycles use more water, so use the shortest wash cycle for light loads. Stains can be pretreated to avoid rewashing.

Community Watch consists of 4 divisions — Patrol, Dispatch, Gate Attendants and Gate Operations Attendants. All 4 divisions have specific duties and responsibilities. From time to time we are asked "What does Community Watch really do?" By visiting the pages linked above, you can see all the duties and responsibilities that are taken on by Community Watch. Depending on the division that you are looking at, Community Watch has a wide range of services that we provide every day. We strive to do the best possible job in all the services that we offer.

The Community Watch staff that residents come in contact with the most are the Gate Attendants that you see when you come into The Villages. Their duties include welcoming The Villages Community Development Districts Community Watch

residents and visitors, regulating traffic at the gates, assisting residents and guests with directions and much more.

Community Watch Patrol Drivers are the next most visible as they drive the Community Watch vehicles around each and do security checks at postal stations, pools and District Offices. They also assist local law enforcement with traffic accidents and vehicle breakdowns. They assist with searching for lost residents, respond to service calls for assistance from residents, observe and report all maintenance issues they come across and much more. Dispatchers are online 24 hours a day, every day, and are ready to assist anyone who calls. Dispatchers assist with searching for missing residents, documenting all radio and telephone calls and more. Dispatchers also serve as an after-hours link to all District Offices.

Community Watch always works to provide a safe community for residents of The Villages by keeping a watchful eye around the clock. This is our mission statement that we stand by and work to uphold.

I Lost My Villages ID. How Do I Get A New One?

There are three locations to choose from to repace your Villages ID Card: Our main office location at 984 Old Mill Run in Lake Sumter Landing, our South Satellite Office at 4856 South Morse Blvd or our newly opened North Satellite Office at 1200 Avenida Central in La Hacienda.



There are two options to replace your ID. You can receive a free temporary 30 Day ID which gives you the opportunity to find your original ID. If you prefer not to get a temporary card, we can replace your ID with a new permanent card.

Lost, stolen, or damaged Villages Resident ID cards can be replaced for a \$15 cost. A new resident ID number will be issued and a new photo will be taken each time a new ID is issued.

How Do I Replace My Gate Cards?

Stop by one of our Customer Service locations and bring any remaining gate cards you still have issued to your home, as they are issued in sets of two. We will deactivate the missing card(s). If the missing card is part of a set, the set will be deactivated. We will issue you a new single card or a set of cards. It cost \$15 to replace the missing card.

Lawn Ornaments & Yard Art

DISTRICTS THAT PROHIBIT LAWN ORNAMENTS & YARD ART

- District 3 (with the exception of Units 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 42, 43, 608, 609, 610 & 611)
- Districts 4 through 13

Lawn ornaments & yard art for these Districts may be placed in the following locations:

- Inside the home
- Inside the lanai
- On the concrete slab located underneath the roof of the front porch (NOT under the eaves of the home)





Lawn ornaments or yard art, generally refers to man-made items located anywhere outside the structure or footprint of the home. However, pots and planters designed and constructed for plant use are permitted if they are used for their intended purpose. The inclusion or attachment of flowers or plants to a man-made ornament, not originally constructed for plant use, does not change the item from a lawn ornament to landscaping. The word "lawn" includes areas that are mulched, concreted, sodded, rocked, landscaped, bare earth or any other material outside the structure (footprint) of the home. The following is intended as a partial reference list of lawn ornaments: any





man-made concrete, resin, ceramic statue or figure including windmills, pinwheels, religious symbols, train sets, animal or human figures.

Lawn ornaments may be placed on the concrete slab located underneath the roof of the front porch. Lawn ornaments are permitted in these locations as they are considered internal areas and the District only has authority to enforce certain external deed restrictions.

Preventative maintenance is occurring on the potable water system field valves throughout many areas of The Villages. Those customers serviced by Village Center Service Area (VCSA), Little Sumter Service Area (LSSA), North Sumter Utilities (NSU), Central Sumter Utilities (CSU) and South Sumter Utilities (SSU) that will be impacted will be notified 24 hours in advance of a temporary interruption in service and will receive the following notification:

THE PUBLIC DRINKING WATER MAINS IN YOUR AREA WILL BE SHUT DOWN TEMPORARILY FOR NEEDED MAINTENANCE. AS A PRECAUTION, UPON RETURN OF WATER SERVICE, WE ADVISE THAT <u>ALL WATER USED FOR</u> <u>DRINKING, MAKING ICE, AND COOKING BE BOILED, FOR ALL OTHER</u> <u>HOUSE HOLD USES THE WATER IS ACCEPTABLE</u>. A ROLLING BOIL OF ONE MINUTE IS SUFFICIENT. AS AN ALTERNATIVE, BOTTLED WATER MAY BE USED. THIS "PRECAUTIONARY BOIL WATER NOTICE" WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL THE MAINTENANCE TASK HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND A BACTERIOLOGICAL SURVEY SHOWS THAT THE WATER IS SAFE TO DRINK. THIS USUALLY CONSISTS OF A TWO-DAY SAMPLING PERIOD TO INSURE SAFE DRINKING WATER. IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS, YOU MAY CONTACT DEANNA SIMMONS, FROM THE WATER DEPARTMENT AT 352-259-2802 (NSU WWTP).

A notice with the addresses of the affected area along with this information will be left at the door of all impacted addresses. We appreciate your patience and cooperation in order to maintain the continued integrity and safety of the District infrastructure.

IRRIGATION SYSTEM FLUSHING: DISTRICTS 5-8

The Villages Community Development Districts Utilities

Beginning in April 2023, our Utilities Operations and Maintenance contractor (Jacobs), will begin flushing the Villages Water Conservation Authority (VWCA) irrigation system located in Districts 5-8. Flushing prevents the accumulation of small particles and build-up, which can lead to plugging issues in our irrigation system. Due to the size of the VWCA system, the area has been divided into 90 distinct flushing zones. Once started, this project will take approximately 50 weeks to work through all 90 zones.



As the flushing takes place, you will see the Jacobs team opening fire hydrants and flushing irrigation lines only into the roadway. Work hours will be from 8 am to 5 pm. Information will be updated regularly on the District's website on when you can expect to see the Jacobs team in action in your area. Please check out What's Happening and the Weekly Bulletin for updates at <u>DistrictGov.org</u>.

This maintenance work will not have any effects on your drinking water quality nor pressure. This is a proactive effort to maintain your irrigation system.

The safety of residents and contractor personnel is of the utmost importance. We are requesting everyone to abide by all barricades and warning signs and to avoid the active work area for anything other than access to your property.

- ALL vehicles and trailers must be parked OFF of the roads and the overflow parking areas must be empty, so as to not impede the work.
- Please be advised that newly paved roadways will take approximately one hour to cure and should not be driven on while hot! Driving before this time could result in tracking asphalt onto your driveway and damaging the new roadway.
- If you must travel through the construction, PLEASE drive slowly and watch for and listen to directions provided by the contract workers.

Our goal is to give you a new road that will endure its maximum life with the least amount of inconvenience. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. If you have any questions during the work, there will be someone on sight to help. For the safety of our crews and all residents, we ask that you reschedule any work or deliveries to your Villa until the paving is complete as they may be denied access. Only residents and emergency vehicles will have immediate access during the construction.
