Wednesday, June 14, 2023 is National Flag Day

"That the flag of the United States shall be of thirteen stripes of alternate red and white, with a union of thirteen stars of white in a blue field, representing the new constellation."

This resolution was adopted by the Continental Congress on June 14, 1777. The resolution was made following the report of a special committee which had been assigned to suggest the flag's design.

A flag of this design was first carried into battle on September 11, 1777, in the Battle of the Brandywine. The American flag was first saluted by foreign naval vessels on February 14, 1778, when the Ranger, bearing the Stars and Stripes and under the command of Captain Paul Jones, arrived in a French port. The flag first flew over a foreign territory in early 1778 at Nassau, Bahama Islands, where Americans captured a British fort.

Observance of the adoption of the flag was not soon in coming, however. Although there are



many claims to the first official observance of Flag Day, all but one took place more than an entire century after the flag's adoption in 1777.

Both President Wilson, in 1916, and President Coolidge, in 1927, issued proclamations asking for June 14 to be observed as National Flag Day. But it wasn't until August 3, 1949, that Congress approved the national observance, and President Harry Truman signed it into law.

Life-saving services provided by Community Watch

One of the many programs that Community Watch is proud to provide is what we call our "Two Newspapers in the Driveway Well-Being Check." If a Patrol Driver spots two or more newspapers in a resident's driveway, they will stop and knock on their door to make sure all is well in the home. Taking action on something as simple as this is all that's needed to save a life, and Community Watch has seen this first-hand time and again. An incident that occurred recently highlights the effectiveness of this program and the vigilance of our Community Watch staff.

On May 27, 2023, when Patrol Driver Frank Fauci noticed two newspapers in a driveway on Carnegie Court in the Village of Ashland, he followed the proper protocol and took them to the front door. Upon doing so, he heard a gentleman calling for help inside the home. The resident stated that he was on the floor and in need of immediate assistance. Frank acted swiftly to notify Dispatch to call 911 and informed his Patrol Supervisor, Billy Easton, who arrived shortly after.

During the critical moments before help arrived, Frank provided comfort and support to the resident by engaging in conversation and offering reassurance. Once the paramedics arrived, Frank stepped aside and allowed them to take over the medical care. His presence and initial response were instrumental in ensuring that the resident received the necessary medical attention and that the situation did not escalate.

This incident serves as a powerful testament to the importance of Community Watch's programs and the dedication of Patrol Drivers like Frank Fauci. By being vigilant and responsive to signs of distress, Community Watch plays a vital role in preventing potential emergencies and ensuring the safety and well-being of members of the community.

ID Checking at Swimming Pools

The Recreation & Parks Department has set standards for checking ID Cards at The Villages swimming pools that fall under its purview.

Individuals are not asked to get out of the swimming pools or stop play in order to check IDs, unless they do not meet the age requirements or are reported by a resident for not meeting the Resident/Guest Eligibility Standards.

 Sports Pool classes/programs: Each activity or program will be checked a minimum of once a week (ex. water volleyball, exercise class, combo swim and lap swim). > Neighborhood Recreation Centers (Adult Pools): Recreation

Staff check these pools upon opening each morning and closing each evening, then at various times each day or more if staff is available. This is a minimum of three times daily: once between 7 AM to 12 PM, 12 PM to 5 PM and 5 PM to close. Community Watch checks at least 2 Neighborhood Pools every afternoon and rotates the pools they check so they're all checked at least once every 4 days.

 Family Pools: Checked a minimum of Three (3) times daily: once each between the hours of 7 AM to 12 PM, 12 to 5 PM and 5 PM to close. Ongoing ID checks.

Smoking & Vaping Free Zone Policy

The Smoking & Vaping Free Zone Policy establishes a Smoke & Vape Free Zone that prohibits smoking within a minimum of 25 feet from any entrance to recreation center buildings. Smoking refers to the use of traditional tobacco products. Vaping refers to the use of electronic nicotine delivery systems or electronic smoking devices. These are often called e-cigarettes, e-hookahs or e-cigars. *Smoking is permitted only in designated areas where ash cans are located.



Covanta Waste-to-Energy: The Cost Effective, Eco-Friendly Solution For Waste Collection in The Villages

Last week, the North Sumter County Utility Dependent District (NSCUDD) Board got to tour the impresive Covanta Waste-to-Energy facility.

We are extremely proud of the innovative, earth-friendly, and cost-saving renewable energy solution which has been implemented in The Villages to collect and transport all of our household and commercial waste and convert it into clean energy. The United States produces nearly 300 million tons of waste with a large percentage going into landfills. Less than 5% of plastics, glass and other product collected and shipped to recycling facilities in the United States is actually repurposed into recycled products, the rest is put into landfills, despite largescale recycling programs in many municipalities. The District used to collect household and commercial waste and transport it via tractortrailer to Georgia to be dumped at a landfill. It was costly, inefficient and added to our growing national landfill problem.

In The Villages, nearly 100% of household and commercial waste is recycled into energy through the Waste-to-Energy program. Wasteto-Energy is a sustainable alternative to landfills for waste disposal. Modern Waste-to-Energy facilities divert waste from landfills to generate energy from

the combustion of municipal solid waste. The District has contracted with Covanta as our Waste-to-Energy provider. All waste collected by Sumter Sanitation, with oversight from NSCUDD, is transported to the Lake County Covanta Wasteto-Energy facility in Okahumpka. Covanta's Waste-to-Energy facilities are designed to convert the collected waste into electricity for homes and businesses and/or steam for export to industries.



Waste-to-Energy is a technologically advanced means of waste disposal that is widely recognized for reducing greenhouse gases, particularly methane, by eliminating emissions from landfills. Nasa scientists have identified landfills as super-emitters of methane, a greenhouse gas that is 84x more potent as a climate-warming gas than CO₂.



Waste-to-Energy takes nonhazardous waste, otherwise destined for a landfill, and combusts it, generating steam for electricity production. Ash is processed to recover metal for recycling while all gases are collected, filtered and cleaned to minimize environmental impact. This is a complicated process that requires state-of-the-art technology to do it safely. Our partnership with Covanta has proven to be an environmentally friendly, effecient way to take our waste and convert it to safe, clean energy and avoid landfills.

Benefits of Waste-to-Energy

Waste-to-Energy is widely recognized as a technology that helps mitigate climate change. In fact, Waste-to-Energy facilities are the only form of energy generation that actually reduces greenhouse gases and play an important role in addressing climate change. In The Villages, NSCUDD is entering its third year of partnership with Covanta.

In Fiscal Year 2022, NSCUDD sent 47,682 tons of solid waste to the Covanta facility in Okahumpka. Resulting in:

- Generated 26,225,100
 kwh of renewable energy
 enough to power 28,693
 homes for a month.
- Reduced the need for 11,921 tons of coal or 2,002,644 gallons of fuel oil.
- Recycled 2,384,100 pounds of metal that otherwise would've been landfilled
- Recycled not only glass, plastics, cardboard and other recyclable items, but converted nearly 100% of all household and commercial waste into energy as well.



When should I call 911?

When you have a medical, fire or police emergency.

Who answers my 911 call?

In Florida, all 911 Public Safety Answering Points (PSAP's) must be affiliated with county law enforcement dispatch centers.

But I don't need the police. What if my emergency is medical?

The county law enforcement office call-taker will ask if your call is for **fire, police or medical.** The calltaker will also ask for the location of the emergency. Frequently, the calltaker will ask for the county. For the purposes of 911, it's not The Villages, it's Sumter, Lake or Marion County.

Doesn't the 911 operator know my address when I call? Why does he/ she have to ask?

If you call 911 from your hard-wired (house) phone, the location of that

telephone appears on the call-taker's computer screen. It also gives your phone number as well as information about your primary police service, fire service, EMS service and ambulance service. If you call from your cell phone, none of that information may be available. The call taker will always ask for the location of the emergency either to confirm what he/she already sees on the screen or to learn the location from the cell phone caller. As a result, if you're calling from a cell phone, you need to know the **county**, your address, or closest cross streets to your location.

How long does the 911 call take?

The average 911 call only takes about 30 seconds until help is dispatched. Of course, that time is dependent upon you – the caller – knowing where the emergency is.

Never hang up on 911. Even if you dialed in error, stay on the line to let the call-taker know that.

HURRICANE



Watches & Warnings

Listen closely to instructions from local officials on TV, radio, cell phones or other computers for instructions from local officials. Evacuate if told to do so.

WATCHES:

- Hurricane Watch: Hurricane conditions (sustained winds of 74 mph or greater) are possible within your area. Because it may not be safe to prepare for a hurricane once winds reach tropical storm force, the NHC issues hurricane watches 48 hours before it anticipates tropical-storm-force winds.
- Tropical Storm Watch: Tropical storm conditions (sustained winds of 39 to 73 mph) are possible within the specified area within 48 hours.
- Storm Surge Watch: The possibility of lifethreatening inundation from rising water moving inland from the shoreline somewhere within the specified area, generally within 48 hours.

WARNINGS:

- Hurricane Warning: Hurricane conditions (sustained winds of 74 mph or greater) are expected somewhere within the specified area. NHC issues a hurricane warning 36 hours in advance of tropical-storm-force winds to give you time to complete your preparations.
- **Tropical Storm Warning:** Tropical storm conditions (sustained winds of 39 to 73 mph) are expected within your area within 36 hours.
- Storm Surge Warning: The danger of life-threatening inundation from rising water moving inland from the shoreline somewhere within the specified area, generally within 36 hours.
- **Extreme Wind Warning:** Extreme sustained winds of a major hurricane (115 mph or greater), usually associated with the eyewall, are expected to begin within an hour. Take immediate shelter in the interior portion of a well-built structure.

Sanitation Collection Guidelines In The Villages The Villages

For residents of Village Community Development Districts 1-11 in Sumter County, Marion County and The Villages of Fruitland Park:

- All Household Solid Waste and Yard Waste is picked up twice a week at the same time, in the same truck and all together.
- All household waste should be placed in sealed tall kitchen trash bags or 20-30 gallon trash bags (any color with the exception of red, which is used for medical waste).
- All materials can be placed in the same bag, no need to sort!
- The trash bags should be left at the end of your driveway, no garbage cans are allowed.
- Each bag should weigh no more than forty (40) pounds.
- Bags must be placed for collection before 6 AM on your collection day or the night before (no sooner than 5 PM)
- Wrap broken glass or other sharp objects in newspaper and place

them where they cannot cause injury.

• Limbs and branches should be bundled and tied and may not exceed 5' in length, 5" in diameter or exceed 40 pounds.

IRRIGATION SYSTEM FLUSHING: DISTRICTS 5-8

The Villages® Community Development Districts Utilities

In April 2023, our Utilities Operations and Maintenance contractor (Jacobs) began flushing the Villages Water Conservation Authority (VWCA) irrigation system located in Districts 5-8. Flushing prevents the accumulation of small particles and build-up, which can lead to plugging issues in our irrigation system. Due to the size of the VWCA system, the area has been divided into 90 distinct flushing zones. Once started, this project will take approximately 50 weeks to work through all 90 zones.



As the flushing takes place, you will see the Jacobs team opening fire hydrants and flushing irrigation lines only into the roadway. Work hours will be from 8 am to 5 pm. Information will be updated regularly on the District's website on when you can expect to see the Jacobs team in action in your area. Please continue to check the Weekly Bulletin or the <u>What's Happening</u> page on <u>DistrictGov.org</u> for updates.

This maintenance work will not have any effects on your drinking water quality nor pressure. This is a proactive effort to maintain your irrigation system.

The safety of residents and contractor personnel is of the utmost importance. We are requesting everyone to abide by all barricades and warning signs and to avoid the active work area for anything other than access to your property.
