Independence Day Sanitation Schedules

Village Community Development Districts 1 – 11

If you live in Village Community Development Districts 1 – 11 located in Sumter County, Marion County or Fruitland Park portions of The Villages, there will be normal residential sanitation collection on Tuesday, July 4, 2023.

Village Community Development District 12 and the Villages of DeLuna and Hammock at Fenney

If you live in Village Community Development District 12 and the Villages of DeLuna and Hammock at Fenney, there will be no residential sanitation collection on Tuesday, July 4, 2023. The next collection date will be on Friday, July 7, 2023.

Village Community Development District 13 (excluding the Villages of DeLuna and Hammock at Fenney) and District 14

If you live in Village Community Development District 13 (excluding the Villages of DeLuna and Hammock at Fenney) and District 14, there will be normal residential sanitation collection on Monday, July 3, 2023.

If you live in the **Town of Lady Lake portion of The Villages**, there will be no residential sanitation collection on Tuesday, July 4, 2023. The next collection date will be on Friday, July 7, 2023.

If you live in the **Lake County portion of The Villages** (not including Districts 11 or 14), there will be no sanitation collection on Tuesday, July 4, 2023. Tuesday collection will be on Wednesday, July 5, 2023. All collection days for the week will be moved to the next day.

Smoke Detector Program



Did you know that The Villages Public Safety Department offers smoke detector assistance to residents of The Villages?

- This program is designed for residents who are disabled or unable to climb ladders.
- The Villages Public Safety Department recommends changing batteries once a year.
- Residents must purchase new nine-volt batteries or detectors before calling for assistance.
- On average, a smoke detector lasts around ten years and the combination smoke/carbon monoxide units last five to seven.
- Smoke alarms are designed to signal with a single beep which repeats every few minutes to alert you that the battery needs changing. Three to five beeps at a time is a signal that the detector needs to be replaced.

- On average, a smoke detector lasts around ten years. The smoke/carbon monoxide units last around five to seven years.
- If your detectors are beeping non-stop please leave the home and call 911. It may be signaling a fire or carbon monoxide emergency.
- Homes in The Villages are designed with hardwired smoke detectors. Detectors are located in the bedrooms and in the main living area. A smoke/carbon monoxide combination unit is located outside of the bedrooms.

The smoke detectors that are installed in your home are manufactured by BRK under the name First Alert. The model number for the smoke detector is 9120B and the model number of the combination smoke/carbon monoxide detector is SC9120B.



Smoke Detector Program

For those residents that are hearing impaired, there are several types of detectors that may be right for you such as strobe light detectors or detectors that can shake the bed in the event of a fire. For more information on these detectors, please stop by The Villages Public Safety Administration office at 3035 S. Morse Boulevard Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM to obtain a brochure or visit our website at [DistrictGov.org](https://www.districtgov.org).

Smoke detector battery changes and/or installations can be arranged by calling 352-205-8280 Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 5:00 AM. If it is after hours or on the weekend and you have a beeping detector, call 352-205-8280 and select option 1 on the recording to be connected to Community Watch Dispatch.

There is no charge for this service. Appointments are for same-day service and first come first serve.

The Villages Public Safety Department employees will arrive at your home in uniform, with a visible name badge. They will also have a ladder with them.

As a reminder, this assistance is strictly for smoke detectors. The employees visiting your home will not be able to assist you with non-related smoke detector issues or concerns such as light bulbs.

› July 14th



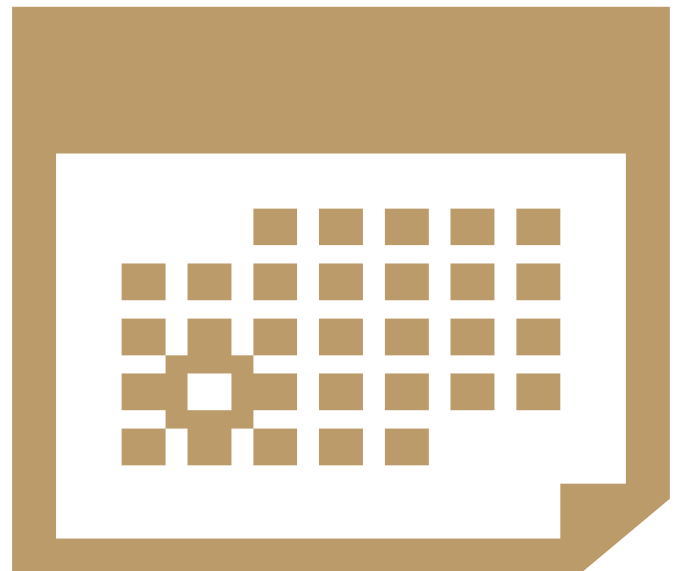
This year's Bond cut-off date is July 14, 2023 which is an important date for any resident who would like to pay off their Bond in full. If the Bond is paid off in full by 5:00 PM on July 14, 2023, the bond assessment will no longer appear on your annual County Property tax bill. This option allows residents to save on future interest payments.

Payments must be received in our office by 5:00 PM on July 14, 2023 in order for timely processing.

Payments can be made in person by scheduling an appointment at the District Customer Service Center or by mail to District Customer Service at 984 Old Mill Run, The Villages, FL 32162.

If mailing in your payment, please mail it early to allow extra time for your payment to reach our office.

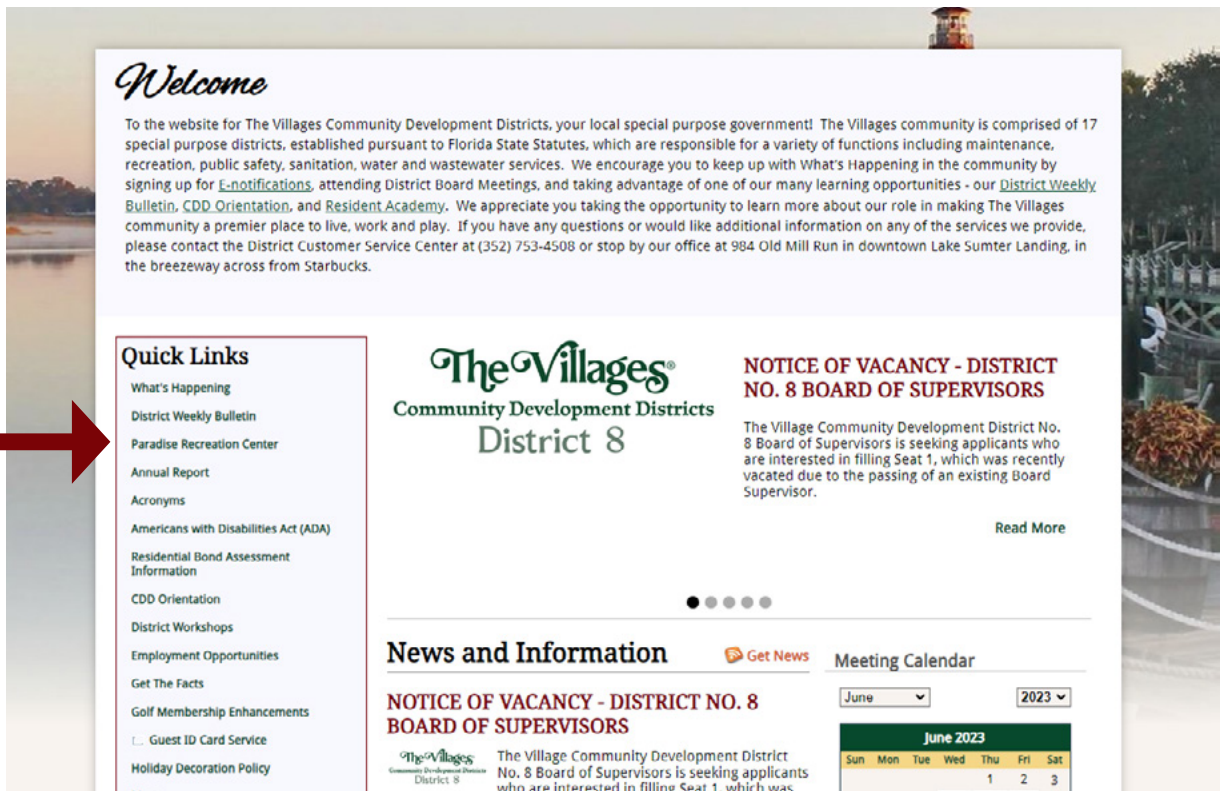

Threats from hurricanes include powerful winds, heavy rainfall, storm surges, coastal and inland flooding, rip currents, tornadoes, and landslides.

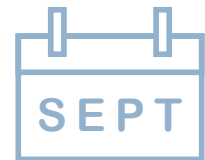
Hurricanes are massive storm systems that form over warm ocean waters and move toward land. The Atlantic hurricane season runs June 1 to November 30. The Pacific hurricane season runs May 15 to November 30.



Can happen along any U.S. coast or territory in the Atlantic or Pacific



Can affect areas more than 100 miles inland



Most active in September

IF YOU ARE UNDER A HURRICANE WARNING, FIND SAFE SHELTER RIGHT AWAY



Determine your best protection for high winds and flooding.



Evacuate if told to do so.



Take shelter in a designated storm shelter or an interior room for high winds.



Listen for emergency information and alerts.



Only use generators outdoors and away from windows.



Do not walk, swim, or drive through flood waters.

HOW TO STAY SAFE WHEN A HURRICANE THREATENS



Know your area's risk of hurricanes.

Sign up for your community's warning system. The Emergency Alert System (EAS) and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Weather Radio also provide emergency alerts.

If you are at risk for flash flooding, watch for signs such as heavy rain.

Practice going to a safe shelter for high winds, such as a FEMA safe room or ICC 500 storm shelter. The next best protection is a small, interior, windowless room in a sturdy building on the lowest level that is not subject to flooding.

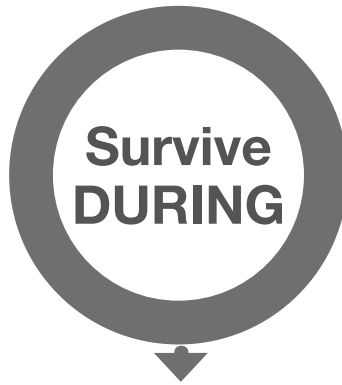
Based on your location and community plans, make your own plans for evacuation or sheltering in place.

Become familiar with your evacuation zone, the evacuation route, and shelter locations.

Gather needed supplies for at least three days. Keep in mind each person's specific needs, including medication. Don't forget the needs of pets.

Keep important documents in a safe place or create password-protected digital copies.

Protect your property. Declutter drains and gutters. Install check valves in plumbing to prevent backups. Consider hurricane shutters. Review insurance policies.



If told to evacuate, do so immediately.

Do not drive around barricades.

If sheltering during high winds, go to a FEMA safe room, ICC 500 storm shelter, or a small, interior, windowless room or hallway on the lowest floor.

If trapped in a building by flooding, go to the highest level of the building. Do not climb into a closed attic. You may become trapped by rising flood water.

Listen for current emergency information and instructions.

Use a generator or other gasoline-powered machinery ONLY outdoors and away from windows.

Do not walk, swim, or drive through flood waters. Turn Around. Don't Drown.® Just six inches of fast-moving water can knock you down, and one foot of moving water can sweep your vehicle away.

Stay off bridges over fast-moving water.



Listen to authorities for information and special instructions.

Be careful during clean-up. Wear protective clothing and work with someone else.

Do not touch electrical equipment if it is wet or if you are standing in water. If it is safe to do so, turn off electricity at the main breaker or fuse box to prevent electric shock.

Avoid wading in flood water, which can contain dangerous debris. Underground or downed power lines can also electrically charge the water.

Save phone calls for emergencies. Phone systems are often down or busy after a disaster. Use text messages or social media to communicate with family and friends.

Document any property damage with photographs. Contact your insurance company for assistance.

IRRIGATION SYSTEM FLUSHING: DISTRICTS 5-8

In April 2023, our Utilities Operations and Maintenance contractor (Jacobs) began flushing the Villages Water Conservation Authority (VWCA) irrigation system located in Districts 5-8. Flushing prevents the accumulation of small particles and build-up, which can lead to plugging issues in our irrigation system. Due to the size of the VWCA system, the area has been divided into 90 distinct flushing zones. Once started, this project will take approximately 50 weeks to work through all 90 zones.



As the flushing takes place, you will see the Jacobs team opening fire hydrants and flushing irrigation lines only into the roadway. Work hours will be from 8 am to 5 pm. Information will be updated regularly on the District's website on when you can expect to see the Jacobs team in action in your area. Please continue to check the Weekly Bulletin or the [What's Happening](#) page on [DistrictGov.org](#) for updates.

This maintenance work will not have any effects on your drinking water quality nor pressure. This is a proactive effort to maintain your irrigation system.

The safety of residents and contractor personnel is of the utmost importance. We are requesting everyone to abide by all barricades and warning signs and to avoid the active work area for anything other than access to your property.

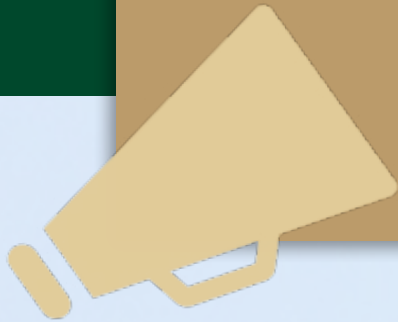
