Heat Illness Prevention and Safety Tips

It is starting to really heat up in Florida! Many residents and guests spend time in the elements; follow these tips to ensure you stay safe as it begins to warm up over the next few months.

In 2021, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration reported 201 people died and 67 were injured in the U.S. from weather-related excessive heat, according to Injury Facts.

We should all take extra precautions in the heat, but those most at risk are:

- People who work in the heat
- Infants and young children, especially in hot cars
- People 65 and older
- People who are ill, on certain medications or have chronic health conditions
- People who are overweight

Heat Illnesses and their Symptoms:

Heat Stroke

- High body temperature (over 103°F)
- Hot, red, dry or damp skin
- Fast, strong pulse
- Headache, dizziness or confusion
- Loss of consciousness (fainting)
- Nausea
- Heat stroke is a medical emergency - call 911 right away

Heat Exhaustion

- Heavy sweating
- Cold, pale, and clammy skin
- Fast, weak pulse
- Nausea or vomiting
- Muscle cramps
- Tiredness or weakness
- Dizziness, fainting or headache

Heat cramps

- Heavy sweating during exercise
- Muscle pain or spasms

Dehydration

- Thirst or less frequent urination
- Dry skin or dry mouth
- Fatigue
- Dizziness or light-headedness
- Confusion
- Increased heart rate and breathing

Sunburn

- Painful, red, and warm skin
- Blisters on the skin

Heat Rash

- Red clusters of small blisters that look like pimples on the skin

Heat Illness Prevention and Safety Tips

Most Florida residents will spend some time in the heat even this summer. It is important to know the proper safety precautions in case you or someone else you know suffers from heat illness.

The best way to avoid a heat-related illness is to limit exposure outdoors on hot days. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention:

- Air conditioning is the best way to cool off
- Drink fluids, even if you don't feel thirsty, and avoid alcohol
- Wear loose, lightweight clothing and a hat
- Replace salt lost from sweating by drinking a sports drink
- Avoid spending time outdoors during the hottest part of the day, from 11 AM to 3 PM
- Wear sunscreen; sunburn affects the body's ability to cool itself
- Pace yourself when you run or otherwise exert your body
- Eat light meals

To avoid heat-related illnesses, the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health recommends:

- Staying hydrated and drinking before you get thirsty
- Watch out for others exhibiting signs

of heat exhaustion or heat stroke

- Take time to rest and cool down - It's important to listen to your body.

If you're involved in physical activity in the heat, changes in how you feel may be an indicator of heat stress. Stop or take a break if you experience:

- Thirst
- Fatigue
- Sore or painful muscles or cramps
Pulse higher than usual for the activity
- Dizziness and/or headache
- Low abdominal pain
- Nausea

Knowing the symptoms and proper response to heat related-illnesses can save a life.

Heat Illness is preventable. Follow heat safety prevention to keep you and your loved ones safe this summer.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

My irrigation usage increased and I didn't touch my timer, how can that be?

The Utilities Department gets asked this question pretty frequently, especially around this time of year when the climate gets hot and dry.

Many people have been surprised to learn that the timer installed at the time of construction of the home, a Hunter Pro-C, is equipped with a feature called Solar Sync. Self-adjusting is exactly what it is designed to do!

An excerpt from

“The Solar Sync Sensor is an advanced weather sensor that calculates evapotranspiration (ET) and adjusts Hunter controllers daily based on onsite weather conditions. Solar Sync measures sunlight



and temperature and uses ET to determine the correct seasonal adjustment percentage value to send to the controller. The controller then uses its programmed run time and adjusts to Solar Sync's seasonal adjustment value to modify the actual irrigation run time for that day.”

Precautionary Water Boil Notices

Information Provided By...



What is a Precautionary Boil Water Notice?

A major component of service provided by the District's Utilities Department is the risk assessment involving waterborne contaminants through natural or man-made means. It is our responsibility to provide guidance and assistance to prevent exposure to drinking water contaminants that could present a threat to our resident's health.

Water suppliers are required by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) to notify customers to boil water when conditions exist that may cause the water supply to be vulnerable to the potential for contamination. A Precautionary Boil Water Notice (PBWN) is a form of notification that advises customers to boil tap water used for drinking, cooking and ice-making until tests verify the water is safe.

The determination that the water is safe is a process through which the Utility Operations and Maintenance Contractor sends water samples to a State Certified Water Testing Lab and receives a report back, usually after 48

hours, stating that the water samples meet all federal and state regulations. The precautionary boil water notice would then be rescinded by notifying all affected residents.

An incident that requires a PBWN may include a water, wastewater or irrigation incident that could develop as a result of, but not limited to, a water line break, a problem at a water plant, a new connection to an existing line, a sewer back up, a Wastewater Treatment Plant incident or shutting off the water and turning it back on.

If an incident occurs, the District will send an e-notification to residential and commercial customers that have signed up to receive the e-Notifications.

To sign up for e-notifications, simply go to DistrictGov.org and click on "Sign up for e-Notifications" under the Quick Links menu on the left-hand side of the home page. After inserting your name and email information, check the appropriate utility that your property is serviced by beneath the Precautionary Boil Water Notification category. If an incident occurs within your utility, you will be notified of the situation and the property addresses affected. In the event that you don't have access to your email, depending on the number of homes and businesses within the PBWN area, all local media are notified and an alert is posted on the Precautionary Boil Water Notice page of DistrictGov.org.

As a precaution, all water used for handwashing, drinking, making

ice, brushing teeth, cooking, and washing dishes should be boiled briskly for one minute prior to use.



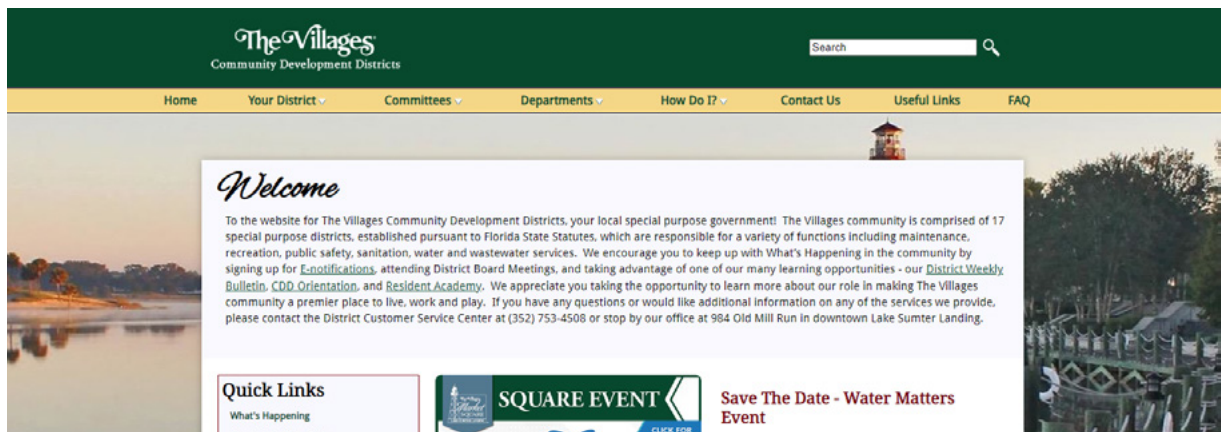
All ice cubes should be discarded and only boiled water should be used for making ice. Bottled water can be used as an alternative.

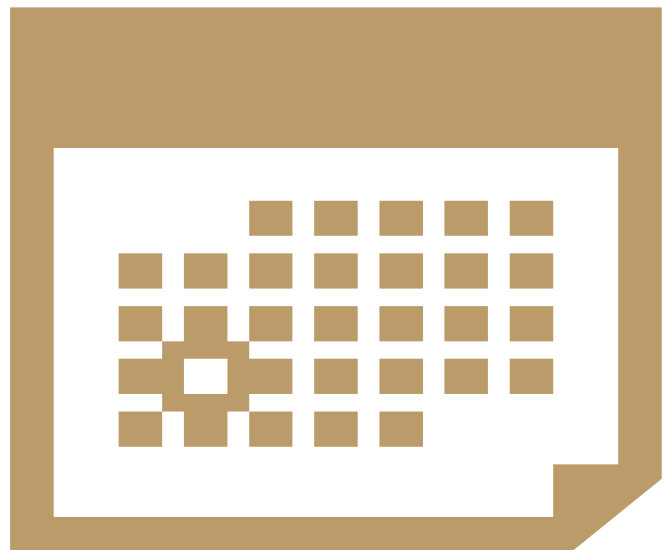
Payments must be received in our office by 5:00 PM on July 14, 2023 in order for timely processing.

WATER SYSTEM MAINTENANCE

Preventative maintenance is occurring on the potable water system field valves throughout many areas of The Villages. Those customers serviced by Village Center Service Area (VCSA), Little Sumter Service Area (LSSA), North Sumter Utilities (NSU), Central Sumter Utilities (CSU) and South Sumter Utilities (SSU) that will be impacted will be notified 24 hours in advance of a temporary interruption in service and will receive the following notification:

THE PUBLIC DRINKING WATER MAINS IN YOUR AREA WILL BE SHUT DOWN TEMPORARILY FOR NEEDED MAINTENANCE. AS A PRECAUTION, UPON RETURN OF WATER SERVICE, WE ADVISE THAT **ALL WATER USED FOR DRINKING, MAKING ICE, AND COOKING BE BOILED, FOR ALL OTHER HOUSE HOLD USES THE WATER IS ACCEPTABLE.** A ROLLING BOIL OF ONE MINUTE IS SUFFICIENT. AS AN ALTERNATIVE, BOTTLED WATER MAY BE USED. THIS "PRECAUTIONARY BOIL WATER NOTICE" WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL THE MAINTENANCE TASK HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND A BACTERIOLOGICAL SURVEY SHOWS THAT THE WATER IS SAFE TO DRINK. THIS USUALLY CONSISTS OF A TWO-DAY SAMPLING PERIOD TO INSURE SAFE DRINKING WATER. IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS, YOU MAY CONTACT DEANNA SIMMONS, FROM THE WATER DEPARTMENT AT 352-259-2802 (NSU WWTP).

A notice with the addresses of the affected area along with this information will be left at the door of all impacted addresses. We appreciate your patience and cooperation in order to maintain the continued integrity and safety of the District infrastructure.

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IRRIGATION SYSTEM FLUSHING: DISTRICTS 5-8

In April 2023, our Utilities Operations and Maintenance contractor (Jacobs) began flushing the Villages Water Conservation Authority (VWCA) irrigation system located in Districts 5-8. Flushing prevents the accumulation of small particles and build-up, which can lead to plugging issues in our irrigation system. Due to the size of the VWCA system, the area has been divided into 90 distinct flushing zones. Once started, this project will take approximately 50 weeks to work through all 90 zones.



As the flushing takes place, you will see the Jacobs team opening fire hydrants and flushing irrigation lines only into the roadway. Work hours will be from 8 am to 5 pm. Information will be updated regularly on the District's website on when you can expect to see the Jacobs team in action in your area. Please continue to check the Weekly Bulletin or the [What's Happening](#) page on [DistrictGov.org](#) for updates.

This maintenance work will not have any effects on your drinking water quality nor pressure. This is a proactive effort to maintain your irrigation system.

The safety of residents and contractor personnel is of the utmost importance. We are requesting everyone to abide by all barricades and warning signs and to avoid the active work area for anything other than access to your property.
