Fish Kills
In The Villages

Fish kills, characterized by a significant number of fish dying in a specific area, can occur in Florida due to various factors. One of the primary causes of fish kills is oxygen depletion in the water, which is more likely to happen during the hot summer months.

During hot weather conditions with cloudy skies, fish kills are more likely to occur. The combination of these factors can be particularly deadly for fish. Cloud cover reduces the amount of sunlight reaching the water, hampering the process of photosynthesis in aquatic plants. As photosynthesis decreases, the oxygen production in the water column also diminishes. If such conditions persist for several days, oxygen levels can become severely depleted, leading to fish kills.



Heavy thunderstorms, especially when they occur over extended periods or after a long period of dry weather, can also contribute to fish kills. The rainfall washes organic matter, such as dry leaves and grasses, into nearby basins and ponds. As bacteria begin to decompose this organic material, oxygen is consumed at a faster rate than normal. This increased demand for oxygen, coupled with reduced sunlight due to cloud cover, can create an imbalance and result in oxygen-depleted water, posing a threat to fish populations.

In conclusion, fish kills, while alarming to witness, typically affect only a portion of the fish population, with many fish surviving the event. Fish have evolved mechanisms to adapt to changing water quality, and they can often recover and replenish their numbers over time. However, it is unfortunate that fish kills occur frequently in Florida, and most of them are natural phenomena. Predicting when a fish kill will happen is challenging, and preventive measures are limited, particularly in larger bodies of water.

Summer Time in Florida is HOT!

Tips to protect yourself from heat related stress and illness:

- Drink cool, non-alcoholic beverages (avoid extremely cold liquids as they can cause cramps)
- Rest
- Take a cool shower or bath
- Seek an airconditioned environment
- Wear lightweight clothing
- Remain indoors during the day
- Don't engage in strenuous activities

Tips to help protect elderly (65+) friends and neighbors:

- Visit older adults at risk at least twice a day to watch them for signs of heat exhaustion
- Encourage them to increase their fluid intake by drinking cool, nonalcoholic beverages regardless of activity level
- Take them to airconditioned places

The Recreation & Parks Department will cancel/postpone outside activities when the temperature with a heat index 104 degrees or higher. This guideline is subject to change depending on the activity as we take into account the health, safety and well-being of all involved.

Lightning/Inclement Weather Policy

In the event of inclement weather or lightning, the Recreation & Parks
Department recommends patrons at pools or outdoor recreation areas find shelter and wait at least 30 minutes before resuming activities. The Recreation & Parks Department has the right to close facilities for public safety in the event of any storm warnings issued by the National Weather Service or Public Safety Department for any tornados, hurricanes or severe storms.

Pet-Friendly Guidelines

- Dogs are required to be on a leash at all times - dogs are not allowed off leash on any athletic fields or public areas or to play and walk on common area landscaping.
- Owner is responsible for picking up after pet and taking all waste home for disposal. Don't use storm drains, postal or recreation facilities to dispose of waste or plastic bags.
- Please follow all county ordinances regarding pets.
- Dog owners are responsible for any injuries caused by their dog(s).
- Dogs must wear current license tags and have up to date vaccinations.



Four Tips to Help Conserve Water Indoors

- Turn off faucet while brushing teeth.
- Take shorter showers.
- Fix leaks in faucets, showerheads and toilets.
- Only wash full loads.

deliver 4 gallons of water per minute. Pressures have been adjusted to the lowflow fixtures to deliver as good a shower as the higher flow showerheads.

If you believe you have a potable water

leak, contact Utilities Customer Service at 352-750-0000 and they can review your billing history.

Potable water conservation is a community-wide effort, we all share in the Stewardship of this valuable resource.

Adjust wash cycles for laundry.

Select the minimum volume of water required for each load. Normal and permanent press wash cycles use more water, so use the shortest wash cycle for light loads. Stains can be pretreated to avoid rewashing.

Watch out for silent leaks in toilets. Remove the toilet tank lid and any colored cleaning agents. Flush to clear the water in the bowl. Add dye tablets, leak detector fluid or even a few drops of food coloring to the tank. If there is a leak, color will appear in the bowl within 10 to 15 minutes. Flush when the test is completed.

Take shorter showers and make sure there are no leaks in showerheads. If there is a leak, make sure the showerhead is screwed tightly. Additionally, make sure showerheads are low-flow. Older high-volume showerheads





The best detour for those needing to enter Reagan Road is to go North on Marsh Bend Trail and then take a right onto Corbin Trail.

Nighttime Lane Closures to Occur During C 466A and Buena Vista Blvd. Intersection Improvement

Sumter County, FL – Nighttime lane closures at C 466A and Buena Vista Blvd. will begin Sunday, July 30 from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. while intersection improvements are conducted. The intersection improvement project began July 13, 2023.

The improvements include the addition of a second left turn lane on eastbound C 466A onto Buena Vista Blvd., and extending existing left turn lanes for northbound and southbound Buena Vista Blvd. The project should be completed by the end of September 2023.

IRRIGATION SYSTEM FLUSHING:DISTRICTS 5-8



In April 2023, our Utilities Operations and Maintenance contractor (Jacobs) began flushing the Villages Water Conservation Authority (VWCA) irrigation system located in Districts 5-8. Flushing prevents the accumulation of small particles and build-up, which can lead to plugging issues in our irrigation system. Due to the size of the VWCA system, the area has been divided into 90 distinct flushing zones. Once started, this project will take approximately 50 weeks to work through all 90 zones.



As the flushing takes place, you will see the Jacobs team opening fire hydrants and flushing irrigation lines only into the roadway. Work hours will be from 8 am to 5 pm. Information will be updated regularly on the District's website on when you can expect to see the Jacobs team in action in your area. Please continue to check the Weekly Bulletin or the What's Happening page on DistrictGov.org for updates.

This maintenance work will not have any effects on your drinking water quality nor pressure. This is a proactive effort to maintain your irrigation system.

The safety of residents and contractor personnel is of the utmost importance. We are requesting everyone to abide by all barricades and warning signs and to avoid the active work area for anything other than access to your property.

Thank you for your cooperation and patience as we improve our irrigation system. If you have any questions or would like additional information, please contact District Utilities at 352-753-4022.
