Village Community Development District 13 (excluding the Villages of DeLuna and Hammock at Fenney) and District 14

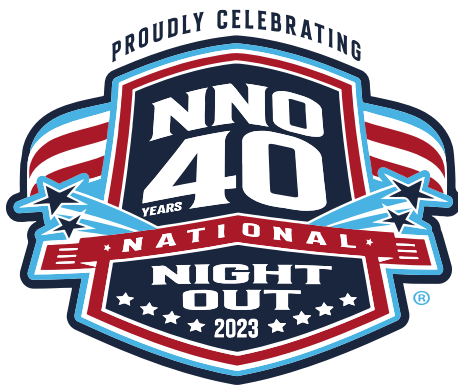

GREASE IS A PROBLEM

Many food items contain fat, oil & grease (**FOG**) that can be harmful to your pipes and sewer system. Pouring FOG materials down your kitchen sink can result in dangerous sewage backups in your home and community. FOG materials include:

- Meat drippings
- Oil
- Butter
- Dressings
- Cooking fats



HOW GREASE AFFECTS YOU

Fat, oil & grease solidify and can build up in your sewer pipes potentially resulting in blockages. Outside of your home, FOG can build up in the collection system and lift stations potentially causing odors and sewage overflows in our neighborhoods. FOG can cause:

- Property damage
- Pipe maintenance requirements
- Health & environmental hazards due to overflows

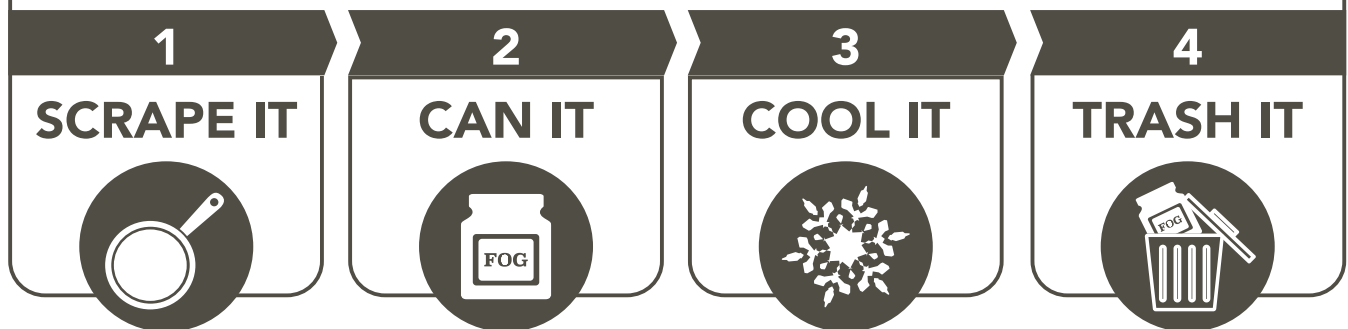

Electronics and Hazardous Waste Drop-off Amnesty Day Set for Saturday in Bushnell

Sumter County, FL – The popular “Amnesty Day” home electronic and hazardous waste drop-off will take place Saturday, August 26 from 8 a.m. until 2 p.m. at the Sumter County Public Works facility at 319 East Anderson Ave in Bushnell. Sumter County residents can drop off the waste free of charge.

Amnesty Days are popular events for Sumter County residents with four events scheduled a year. So far in 2023, more than 40,000 pounds of recycled material and more than 10,000 pounds of hazardous waste has been collected at the first two “Amnesty Day” events.



Items accepted include automotive fluids and batteries, herbicides, propane tanks up to 25 pounds, cleaners, household electronics (TVs, VCRs, computers, etc.), rechargeable household batteries, latex and oil paints, solvents, pool chemicals among others.

Please DO NOT bring:

1. Biological/infectious waste
2. Explosives
3. Radioactive waste
4. Empty paint cans
5. Tires

Wildwood to Begin Subsurface Stabilization of Pavement Depressions *Tests Identify Anomaly; Grouting Work to Start as Soon as Friday*

City of Wildwood officials have received geotechnical testing reports and recommendations for remediation of the surface depressions reported last week at 5980 Scardino Street in The Villages® section of Wildwood, and have issued an emergency authorization to Earth Tech, LLC, to begin work.

“We have given this issue our utmost attention since learning of its existence,” said Public Works Director Jeremy Hockenbury. “We recognize the concern and inconvenience it has created for local residents, and we are working as quickly as we can while taking every possible precaution to ensure their safety while work proceeds.”

The depressions appeared near the middle of the road and at the corner of a driveway in the Village of Monarch Grove. Scardino Street and its accompanying right-of-way are under the jurisdiction of the City of Wildwood, which assumes responsibility for local roads in the Villages® south of SR 44 after construction and an initial maintenance period by the developer.

Crews immediately secured the right-of-way and backfilled the depressions to prepare for geotechnical testing to determine the source and cause. Engineers conducted and analyzed a ground-penetrating radar survey that identified a semi-elliptical anomaly of approximately 350 square feet.

Three standard penetration test borings were then conducted in and around the radar-identified anomaly to assess soil classifications and strata including sand, clay, and weathered limestone. The tests also measured the density of soil to further assess ground strength and stability.

Based on all data collected, engineers recommended deep pressure grouting injected at 15 specific initial locations to depths “sufficient to encounter competent limestone” to stabilize subsurface conditions. That work is to begin as early as Friday, following site preparation work today, and is estimated to take seven 10- to 12-hour working days to complete, weather permitting.

“We are eager to get this work underway and to restore Scardino Street to the condition and quality residents have come to expect,” City Manager Jason McHugh said. “We take pride in our infrastructure and the level of service the city provides its citizens. While some phenomena are beyond human control, we always do everything within our power to provide the best possible response.”

The affected section of roadway remains closed to traffic. Once grouting work is complete, limited access will be provided while additional utility and asphalt repairs are performed.

IRRIGATION SYSTEM FLUSHING: DISTRICTS 5-8

In April 2023, our Utilities Operations and Maintenance contractor (Jacobs) began flushing the Villages Water Conservation Authority (VWCA) irrigation system located in Districts 5-8. Flushing prevents the accumulation of small particles and build-up, which can lead to plugging issues in our irrigation system. Due to the size of the VWCA system, the area has been divided into 90 distinct flushing zones. Once started, this project will take approximately 50 weeks to work through all 90 zones.



As the flushing takes place, you will see the Jacobs team opening fire hydrants and flushing irrigation lines only into the roadway. Work hours will be from 8 am to 5 pm. Information will be updated regularly on the District's website on when you can expect to see the Jacobs team in action in your area. This maintenance work will not have any effects on your drinking water quality nor pressure. This is a proactive effort to maintain your irrigation system.

The safety of residents and contractor personnel is of the utmost importance. We are requesting everyone to abide by all barricades and warning signs and to avoid the active work area for anything other than access to your property.

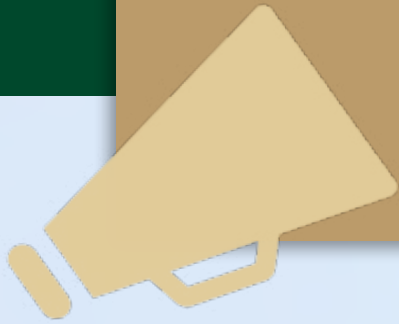
