Household sanitation collection processes have been streamlined, both for your convenience and for the preservation of our environment and natural resources. By having more efficient services, we reduce the carbon footprint, reduce wear and tear on roads, use less fuel and minimize traffic in your neighborhood. All waste, both household and yard waste, is collected on your two scheduled pick up days.

HOUSEHOLD WASTE

All household waste should be placed in a sealed tall kitchen trash bag or a 20-30 gallon trash bag (any color). All materials can be placed in the same bag, no need to sort! The trash bags should be placed together at the end of your driveway, no garbage cans/bins are allowed (they will be disposed of with household waste). Each bag should weigh no more than forty (40) pounds. Bags must be placed for collection before 6AM on your collection day or the night before (no sooner than 5PM) Collection times may vary. Deed Restrictions do not permit leaving trash out on undesignated days. Wrap broken glass or other sharp objects in newspaper and place them where they cannot cause injury. For a list of holidays that may affect your normal collection day, please visit DistrictGov.org.

BULK PICK UP

Items that are too large to be collected by the compactor trucks can be scheduled in advance by calling for a bulk pick up.

For those residents north of SR 44, please call 352-748-0109 for scheduling. There will be a \$10 charge added to your utilities and amenities bill each time a bulk pick up is requested. Charges will apply for any scheduled pick up not canceled a minimum of 24 hours in advance of the scheduled date.

For those residents residing south of SR 44, please call 352-750-0000 for scheduling.



HOMEOWNER YARD WASTE

Tree limbs or branches may not exceed 5' in length, 5" in diameter or exceed 40 pounds. Bundle and tie such materials and place them at the end of your driveway. Palm fronds to face the same direction. Lawn clippings and similar yard waste must be placed in bags.



The following WILL NOT be accepted: Dirt, Rocks, Sod, Concrete, Contractor Waste

ENERGY FROM WASTE

All waste is transported to the Lake County Covanta Energy from Waste (EFW) Facility. Household waste or mixed solid waste (MSW) is turned into energy which is then transferred to the energy grid. Every 1 ton of MSW managed at the Covanta EFW facility offsets approximately 1 ton of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. Covanta's EFW facilities typically operate at 60-80% better than Federal and/or State permitted emission limits. The EFW facility has advanced air pollution control and is highly regulated to protect the environment.

For residents of The Villages residing South of State Road 44, sanitation services are provided and delivered to Covanta by Tri-County Sanitation. For residents living in the Town of Lady Lake portion of The Villages, sanitation services are provided and delivered to Covanta by Waste Management.

LAKE COUNTY COVANTA EFW FACILITY FACTS

- Facility processes a total of 528 tons per day
 of MSW
- Generates up to 14.5 megawatts of clean, renewable energy daily.
- Utilizes Air Pollution Control Equipment of semidry flue gas scrubbers injecting lime, fabric filter baghouses, nitrogen oxide control system, mercury control system and continuous emissions monitoring system.
- The EFW system is comprised of two 264 tonper-day waterfall furnaces with Martin reversereciprocating grates and ash handling system.
- Designated a Voluntary Protection Program Star Facility by the U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) for workplace safety.

MATERIALS NOT ACCEPTED

DO NOT PLACE HYPODERMIC NEEDLES, HOSPITAL TYPE MEDICAL WASTE, PAINT, OIL, LAWN OR POOL CHEMICALS, MOTOR OIL OR TIRES IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE.

External and Internal Deed Compliance

What is an external deed restriction and who can enforce them?

Deed restrictions are declarations between the Declarant (Developer named in your individual Declaration of Restrictions) and the Property Owner. Who can enforce the external deed restrictions?

- Any property owner of any lot may seek to enforce external restrictions against another property owner.
- The Declarant may seek to enforce external and internal restrictions.
- The Villages Community
 Development Districts through
 adopted Rule may enforce certain
 EXTERNAL restrictions that have
 been adopted by each Board to
 enforce as authorized by Chapter
 190 of Florida Statutes.
- External deed restriction
 violations include, but are not
 limited to, external modifications
 made without ARC approval,
 overgrown or dead grass and
 weeds, and inoperable vehicles.

What is an internal deed restriction and who can enforce them?

Deed restrictions are declarations between the Declarant (Developer named in your individual Declaration of Restrictions) and the Property Owner. Who can enforce the internal deed restrictions?

 Any property owner of any lot may seek to enforce internal restrictions against another

- property owner.
- The Declarant may seek to enforce internal restrictions.
- Examples of internal deed restriction violations include, but are not limited to, underage children living in or running a business from the home.

Lane Closures Scheduled for Buena Vista Boulevard and C 466A

Sumter County, FL – The Buena Vista Boulevard Northbound right turn lane and a C 466A East Bound through lane at the intersection of Buena Vista Boulevard and C 466A will be closed September 11 and 12, 2023 from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. each day. The contractor will be installing drill shaft for the new mast arm at the southwest corner of the intersection.

Please use caution when traveling Buena Vista Boulevard and C 466A intersection. Follow the traffic signs to protect yourself and construction workers.



IRRIGATION SYSTEM FLUSHING:DISTRICTS 5-8



In April 2023, our Utilities Operations and Maintenance contractor (Jacobs) began flushing the Villages Water Conservation Authority (VWCA) irrigation system located in Districts 5-8. Flushing prevents the accumulation of small particles and build-up, which can lead to plugging issues in our irrigation system. Due to the size of the VWCA system, the area has been divided into 90 distinct flushing zones. Once started, this project will take approximately 50 weeks to work through all 90 zones.



As the flushing takes place, you will see the Jacobs team opening fire hydrants and flushing irrigation lines only into the roadway. Work hours will be from 8 am to 5 pm. Information will be updated regularly on the District's website on when you can expect to see the Jacobs team in action in your area. Please continue to check the Weekly Bulletin or the What's Happening page on DistrictGov.org for updates.

This maintenance work will not have any effects on your drinking water quality nor pressure. This is a proactive effort to maintain your irrigation system.

The safety of residents and contractor personnel is of the utmost importance. We are requesting everyone to abide by all barricades and warning signs and to avoid the active work area for anything other than access to your property.


