#### **Did You Know?**

#### The Villages ID Cards:

- Over 1.5 million ID cards were checked over the last 7 months.
- ID cards are checked using two methods:
  - With an electronic ID scanner.
  - Manually by staff.
- Guest ID cards are issued for all guests 1 year & older.
- Guests 19 years of age & older must also have a photo ID when using District amenity facilities.
- All approved facilities are listed on the Guest ID/In-Area Guest ID forms.
- A resident who has a son, daughter, grandchild, or great-grandchild (and their spouses) who reside in Lake, Marion or Sumter counties may apply for an In-Area Guest ID card.
- Guest with In-Area Guest ID cards MUST be accompanied by the sponsoring resident.

#### **The Villages Dog Parks**

For the enjoyment of all residents and their pets, there are eight dog-friendly leash-free parks in The Villages. The dog parks consist of two fenced areas for both large and small dogs to run freely

and socialize with other dogs. Please only utilize the side that best fits your dog. Large Dog Area: Dogs Over 30lbs; Small Dog Area: Dogs up to a max. of 30lbs. For more information and locations of the parks, click here.

#### **Closing of Outdoor Facilities**

The Recreation & Parks Department, in partnership with the Community Watch Department, as stewards of Recreation & Parks facilities within The Villages, are requesting your cooperation when closing outdoor Recreation facilities.

The time of dusk fluctuates throughout the year. Dusk is the window of time usually within a 30 minute timespan after sunset. When closing facilities, staff ensures there is adequate lighting to enter, inspect and allow participants the ability to exit the facilities safely. Safety is of the utmost importance and we appreciate you taking this into consideration as staff closes the facilities.

The Villages Recreation & Parks and Community Watch team appreciates your support and adherence as we aim to be good stewards of the recreation facilities while ensuring the safety and wellbeing of both staff and residents.




#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### **How Do I Travel Around A Roundabout?**

In cooperation with the Sumter County Sheriff's Office, the Sumter County Board of County Commissioners developed a guide to navigating roundabouts. To learn the proper guidelines for navigating roundabouts in Sumter County, see the brochure below and on the following page.

#### Remember:

To avoid conflict, do not use the right-hand lane to make a left turn through the roundabout.



#### Approaching Roundabouts

- Reduce your speed and prepare to YIELD to all traffic in the roundabout.
- Guide signs provide guidance for approach street locations, not lane use orientation.

#### Choose your lane:


Approaching a two lane roundabout, make a lane choice according to the following rules:

- If you intend to exit the roundabout more than halfway around, use the LEFT-HAND lane.
- If you intend to exit the roundabout less than halfway around, use the RIGHT-HAND lane.
- If you intend to continue straight through, use either lane unless signs or markings indicate otherwise.

#### **Navigating Roundabouts**

- Move up to the entrance line and wait for a gap in traffic. DO NOT ENTER next to a vehicle in the roundabout, as that vehicle may be exiting at the next exit.
- Within the roundabout, do not stop except to avoid a collision; you have the right-of-way over entering traffic. Keep moving in a counterclockwise direction.
- · Do not change lanes in a roundabout.
- A striped channelization island is present in several roundabouts, which reduces the circulatory roadway to one lane approaching a single-lane exit.










#### **Driving Roundabouts**



#### **Turning Right**



- APPROACHING: Be in the right-hand lane unless otherwise marked on the roadway, and use a right-turn signal.
- CIRCULATING: Keep to the right-hand (outside) lane of the roundabout and continue to use your right-turn signal through your exit. Do not change lanes.
- EXITING: Stay in the right-hand lane as you exit the roundabout.




**Going Straight Ahead** 



- APPROACHING: You can be in either lane, unless otherwise marked on roadway or posted.
- CIRCULATING: Stay to the inside of the circulatory roadway if you entered from the left-hand approach lane, or stay to the outside if you entered from the right-hand approach lane.

  Do not change lanes.
- When you have passed the last exit before the one you want, use your right-turn signal and continue to use it through your exit.
- EXITING: As you exit the roundabout, be aware of vehicles traveling on the outside of the circulatory roadway that may continue to circulate around the roundabout.



#### Turning Left or Making a U-Turn



 APPROACHING: Be in the left-hand lane unless otherwise marked on the roadway, and use a left-turn signal.



- CIRCULATING: Stay in the left-hand lane of the circulatory roadway until you are ready to exit.
- When you have passed the last exit before the one you want, use your right-turn signal and continue to use it through your exit. Do not change lanes.
- EXITING: As you exit the roundabout, be aware of vehicles traveling on the outside of the circulatory roadway that may continue to circulate around the roundabout.

Travel in a counterclockwise direction only.

# How Much Is Enough?

Have you wondered if your water bill and water consumption could be less, but not sure what it could drop to? The tables to the right are based on guidelines from SWFWMD and the University of Florida showing average monthly consumption based on the typical lot size for the types of homes in The Villages. With active management, your water bill could be significantly less, especially during the winter and the summer wet season.

# Flagpole Guidelines

Did you know there are flagpole guidelines when installing a pole on your property? The flagpole guidelines within the community are as follows:

- Displaying a portable flag mounted on a home does not require architectural approval.
- A flagpole requires prior written approval by the Architectural Review Committee to confirm it is not being installed within any easement area and does not exceed twenty-two (22) feet in height.





Flagpole Installation requires prior Architectural Review Committee approval.

Sumter County, FL – At the September 12, 2023 Tentative Budget Hearing, the Sumter County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) voted to proceed with the development of current Village Center Community Development District service area to be governed by a dependent fire district (Villages Public Safety Department District). The creation of this district will require the initial appointment of individuals by name, with two serving an initial one-year term and three serving three-year terms, so the positions will face the elections in November 2024 and November 2026, respectively.

The BOCC will consider applicants that apply through the current boards and committees application process. Residents that reside within the current Village Center Community Development District fire service area, are Sumter County residents, and interested in serving on The Villages Public Safety Department District can apply online at <a href="https://www.sumtercountyfl.gov/apply">www.sumtercountyfl.gov/apply</a>. Applications will be accepted only through October 31, 2023.

# **IRRIGATION SYSTEM FLUSHING:**DISTRICTS 5-8



In April 2023, our Utilities Operations and Maintenance contractor (Jacobs) began flushing the Villages Water Conservation Authority (VWCA) irrigation system located in Districts 5-8. Flushing prevents the accumulation of small particles and build-up, which can lead to plugging issues in our irrigation system. Due to the size of the VWCA system, the area has been divided into 90 distinct flushing zones. Once started, this project will take approximately 50 weeks to work through all 90 zones.



As the flushing takes place, you will see the Jacobs team opening fire hydrants and flushing irrigation lines only into the roadway. Work hours will be from 8 am to 5 pm. Information will be updated regularly on the District's website on when you can expect to see the Jacobs team in action in your area. Please continue to check the Weekly Bulletin or the What's Happening page on DistrictGov.org for updates.

This maintenance work will not have any effects on your drinking water quality nor pressure. This is a proactive effort to maintain your irrigation system.

The safety of residents and contractor personnel is of the utmost importance. We are requesting everyone to abide by all barricades and warning signs and to avoid the active work area for anything other than access to your property.

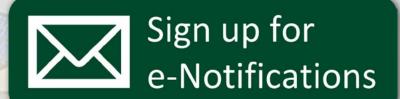
