National Night Out




Community Watch is proud to be participating in National Night Out once again by hosting our annual National Night Out celebration.
National Night Out began in 1984 in the suburbs of Philadelphia as a way for neighbors to come together with one another and strengthen relationships within the community.
Neighbors and law enforcement across the nation supported the initiative and it steadily grew from there.

The event is meant to increase awareness about police and community programs such as drug prevention, town watch, neighborhood watch and other anti-crime efforts. The event has been held annually since 1984 and has gone from a celebration of symbolic efforts amongst neighbors to communities across the nation hosting block parties, festivals, parades, cookouts and various other community events with safety demonstrations, seminars, youth events, visits from emergency personnel, exhibits and more.

The events are typically organized by neighborhood watch groups, nonprofit organizations, local companies, police departments and other law enforcement agencies. They can be as simple as backyard cookouts or as complex as full-blown festivals.



Precautionary Water Boil Notices

Information Provided By...

What is a Precautionary Boil Water Notice?

A major component of service provided by the District's Utilities Department is the risk assessment involving waterborne contaminants through natural or man-made means. It is our responsibility to provide guidance and assistance to prevent exposure to drinking water contaminants that could present a threat to our resident's health.

Water suppliers are required by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) to notify customers to boil water when conditions exist that may cause the water supply to be vulnerable to the potential for contamination. A Precautionary Boil Water Notice (PBWN) is a form of notification that advises customers to boil tap water used for drinking, cooking and ice-making until tests verify the water is safe.

The determination that the water is safe is a process through which the Utility Operations and Maintenance Contractor sends water samples to a State Certified Water Testing Lab and receives a report back, usually after 48



hours, stating that the water samples meet all federal and state regulations. The precautionary boil water notice would then be rescinded by notifying all affected residents.

An incident that requires a PBWN may include a water, wastewater or irrigation incident that could develop as a result of, but not limited to, a water line break, a problem at a water plant, a new connection to an existing line, a sewer back up, a Wastewater Treatment Plant incident or shutting off the water and turning it back on.

Wildwood Completes Stabilization of Scardino Street ROW

Utilities Being Evaluated for Any Necessary Repairs

City of Wildwood officials have received confirmation that the stabilization of the public right-of-way on Scardino Street has been completed according to best engineering practices.

Work was initiated after reports in late August of a surface depression on a city-maintained road in The Villages® section of Wildwood. The city issued an emergency authorization to begin geotechnical testing to determine the exact location and extent of the collapse.

The test report recommended a series of subsurface grout injections. A total of 351.3 cubic yards of concrete was injected at 21 sites to depths ranging from 25 to 55 feet, based on test results.

Injections have cured and been evaluated. Engineers have determined the right-of-way is no longer a public safety concern.

Now that the area has been stabilized, the city is evaluating damage to utilities and any necessary repairs.

"We have been in regular contact with residents of Scardino Street to keep them informed since the first reports came in," said Public Works Director Jeremy Hockenbury. "We appreciate their patience as we work through the next steps of this process to ensure all repair work is done safely and to the specifications demanded by our team of experts."

Access to the affected area of roadway remains restricted to residents and authorized personnel. The street will be reopened to through traffic once utility and final asphalt repairs have been completed.

Sumter County, FL – At the September 12, 2023 Tentative Budget Hearing, the Sumter County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) voted to proceed with the development of current Village Center Community Development District service area to be governed by a dependent fire district (Villages Public Safety Department District). The creation of this district will require the initial appointment of individuals by name, with two serving an initial one-year term and three serving three-year terms, so the positions will face the elections in November 2024 and November 2026, respectively.

The BOCC will consider applicants that apply through the current boards and committees application process. Residents that reside within the current Village Center Community Development District fire service area, are Sumter County residents, and interested in serving on The Villages Public Safety Department District can apply online at www.sumtercountyfl.gov/apply. Applications will be accepted only through October 31, 2023.

IRRIGATION SYSTEM FLUSHING:DISTRICTS 5-8



In April 2023, our Utilities Operations and Maintenance contractor (Jacobs) began flushing the Villages Water Conservation Authority (VWCA) irrigation system located in Districts 5-8. Flushing prevents the accumulation of small particles and build-up, which can lead to plugging issues in our irrigation system. Due to the size of the VWCA system, the area has been divided into 90 distinct flushing zones. Once started, this project will take approximately 50 weeks to work through all 90 zones.



As the flushing takes place, you will see the Jacobs team opening fire hydrants and flushing irrigation lines only into the roadway. Work hours will be from 8 am to 5 pm. Information will be updated regularly on the District's website on when you can expect to see the Jacobs team in action in your area. Please continue to check the Weekly Bulletin or the What's Happening page on DistrictGov.org for updates.

This maintenance work will not have any effects on your drinking water quality nor pressure. This is a proactive effort to maintain your irrigation system.

The safety of residents and contractor personnel is of the utmost importance. We are requesting everyone to abide by all barricades and warning signs and to avoid the active work area for anything other than access to your property.


