### Golf Car Rules of The Road Reminder

At our recent Government Day event, a resident from the Village of Richmond inquired about the rules when approaching an intersection and crossing by an Entry Gate Shack. Golf Carts, Bicycles and Pedestrians on Multi-Modal Paths should use extreme caution where the paths intersects and crosses roadways, especially behind Gate Shacks where visibility may be limited to the motor vehicle operator, as well as Golf Cart, Bicyclists and Pedestrians. Traffic at all gates and gate crossings is posted at 5 MPH. Many golf carts lack the safety features and protections that modern cars have, and as a result impacts can cause more severe injuries to include life-altering head, neck, or spine trauma due to the impact and/or ejection.

While driving a golf cart or low-speed vehicle, the safety of yourself and others should be the top priority of the driver. Responsible driving requires concentration, sound judgment, and common sense of the driver. Carts should be operated with the utmost courtesy, care and consideration for the safety and convenience of pedestrians, cyclists, cart occupants and motor vehicles. Carts and low speed vehicles must yield to pedestrians and motor vehicles in crosswalks and intersections and follow posted signage (stop, yield, etc). When approaching intersections at an entry gate in The Villages from the exit lane side of the gate house, you approach slowly, stop the golf cart, and observe the position of the Village gate entry side arms. If

they are in the upright position there is a high probability that a motor vehicle is entering the intersection. Always proceed with caution and maintain awareness of possible motor vehicle traffic. Full view of the entry lanes may be blocked by the gate house.



Lastly, Governor DeSantis signed a new bill tightening restrictions for teens driving golf carts on May 11, 2023. The law went effect on October 1, 2023. Under the new law, a golf cart may not be operated on public roads or streets by a person under 18 years of age unless they possess a valid learner's driver license or valid driver license. This means a 15-year-old with a learner's permit may drive a golf cart. Anyone who is 18 or older unless they possess a valid form of government-issued photographic identification. This violation of the law would include a noncriminal traffic infraction, similar to moving violations.



### **Smoke Detector Program**



Did you know that The Villages Public Safety Department offers smoke detector assistance to residents of The Villages?

- This program is designed for residents who are disabled or unable to climb ladders.
- The Villages Public Safety
   Department recommends
   changing batteries once a year.
- Residents must purchase new nine-volt batteries or detectors before calling for assistance.
- On average, a smoke detector lasts around ten years and the combination smoke/carbon monoxide units last five to seven.
- Smoke alarms are designed to signal with a single beep which repeats every few minutes to alert you that the battery needs changing. Three to five beeps at a time is a signal that the detector needs to be replaced.

- On average, a smoke detector lasts around ten years. The smoke/carbon monoxide units last around five to seven years.
- If your detectors are beeping nonstop please leave the home and call 911. It may be signaling a fire or carbon monoxide emergency.
- Homes in The Villages are designed with hardwired smoke detectors. Detectors are located in the bedrooms and in the main living area. A smoke/carbon monoxide combination unit is located outside of the bedrooms.

The smoke detectors that are installed in your home are manufactured by BRK under the name First Alert. The model number for the smoke detector is 9120B and the model number of the combination smoke/carbon monoxlied etector is SC9120B.



### **Smoke Detector Program**



For those residents that are hearing impaired, there are several types of detectors that may be right for you such as strobe light detectors or detectors that can shake the bed in the event of a fire. For more information on these detectors, please stop by The Villages Public Safety Administration office at 3035 S. Morse Boulevard Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM to obtain a brochure or visit our website at <u>DistrictGov.org</u>.

Smoke detector battery changes and/or installations can be arranged by calling 352-205-8280 Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 5:00 AM. If it is after hours or on the weekend and you have a beeping detector, call 352-205-8280 and select option 1 on the recording to be connected to Community Watch Dispatch.

There is no charge for this service. Appointments are for same-day service and first come first serve.

The Villages Public Safety
Department employees will arrive
at your home in uniform, with a
visible name badge. They will also
have a ladder with them.

As a reminder, this assistance is strictly for smoke detectors. The employees visiting your home will not be able to assist you with non-related smoke detector issues or concerns such as light bulbs.

### Keep wipes and other products from clogging your community's sewer system

With developments surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic, there's lots of change and interruption in our lives. Panic buying has left some people without adequate supplies of toilet paper, and they may have no choice but to use other products in the bathroom. Therefore, it's important that we make sound decisions to prevent clogs and damage to sewer systems.

To keep wastewater systems working properly, please flush only the appropriate waste down the toilet.

### WIPES CLOG PIPES, SO REMEMBER THESE TIPS:

#### FLUSH IT:

Biological waste (urine, feces) and toilet paper are the Toilet paper breaks down in water. Other products do not.

#### TRASH IT:

Anything else-cotton swabs, baby wipes, wet wipes (even if marked "flushable") and paper towels. These items must be disposed of as domestic waste and NOT flushed down the toilet.



#### PLACE THESE ITEMS IN THE TRASH, NOT THE TOILET:

- Paper towels and napkins
- Disinfecting wipes (even if marked "flushable")
- Baby wipes
- Diapers
- Feminine hygiene products



These steps will help us keep collection and treatment systems operating properly. If there's no toilet paper and you must use something else, keep a trash bin in the bathroom to dispose of non-toilet-paper products. Clean the bin and surrounding areas regularly. Businesses should provide similar trash bins and consider posting signs reminding patrons not to flush non-toilet-paper products.

### **Executive Golf Course Renovation Projects**

We currently have three Executive Golf Courses undergoing comprehensive renovations as part of the approved Capital Improvement Projects:

- Hill Top Executive Golf Course
- Briarwood Executive Golf Course
- Belmont Executive Golf Course

Renovations to the Hilltop, Briarwood and Belmont Executive Golf Courses include new greens, tees, fairways and bunkers. Landscape enhancements and cart path repairs will be incorporated as well to revitalize the courses and enhance the overall player experience.

### **Bunker Sand Project**

During our course renovations in addition to new grass for tees, greens, and fairways we are also installing new G-angle bunker sand in all the sand traps. G-angle sand goes through a crushing/grinding process to create angular particles which lock and hold together better. This not only helps the water drain through but also helps keep the sand from washing out as bad when it rains. The finished product will create a more playable and aesthetically pleasing playing area!



The chart below indicates a range of tee time reservations available and the last time reservation points are assigned. Tee Times begin close to sunrise, no earlier than 7:02 a.m. Tee Times end approximately 30 minutes prior to sunset, no later than 7:00 p.m. During the months of May through December, there are no reservation points assigned after 4:00 P.M.

# **Gate Operations**Safety Guidelines

The Villages has over 100 gate facilities spread throughout the community. While we are not a "gated community" and these gates don't restrict access, they provide the very important functions of safety and traffic control.

Gates require all vehicles to stop before entering a neighborhood and slow down before exiting.

### Special situations you may encounter

Inclement Weather – During heavy rains, Gate Attendants at staffed gates will open the gate for you after your vehicle has come to a complete STOP in front of the gate.

### **Gate Attendant Instruction –**

In certain situations, the Gate Attendant may raise the gate and instruct more than one vehicle at a time to pass through. This is done solely at the discretion of the Gate Attendant to prevent specific traffic flow problems.

Inoperative Gates – Look for traffic cones or barrels placed in front of the inoperative gate(s). Please STOP and safely switch to the remaining open lane and use the open gate. If you come upon a gate that is not functioning properly, please notify Community Watch so that repairs can be scheduled as quickly as possible.

24-Hour Dispatch: 352-753-0550

**Cameras** – All gates are equipped with cameras, allowing Community Watch to continually record and monitor traffic entering and exiting the community.



# **Gate Operations**Safety Guidelines

### **Gate Operation Guidelines**

#### **Resident Lanes**

- Resident entrance gates are raised by either the use of your gate access card or by pressing a button on the box where the card reader is located.
- When using your gate access card, please STOP at the card reader and display your card within 12-inches of the card reader.
- When pressing the button, please STOP at the card reader box and press the button.

#### **Visitor Lanes**

- Visitor entrance gates are raised by either the use of your gate access card, by pressing a button on the box where the card reader is located or manually by a gate attendant.
- If you are using a gate access card, please STOP at the card reader and display your card

- within 12-inches of the card reader.
- If you are pressing the button, please STOP at the card reader box and press the button.
- If you approach a gate with a gate attendant, please STOP and allow the gate attendant to fully open the gate before proceeding.

#### **Exit Gates**

- Proceed slowly towards the gate to allow the sensor to recognize your vehicle and the gate to open.
- When the gate opens, proceed carefully, watching for all cross traffic, cyclists, golf cars and pedestrians.
- Only one vehicle at a time should pass through the gate.
   A second vehicle trying to pass through a raised gate will be damaged by the closing gate.

### **Updated 10/9/2023**

District Property Management will be performing restoration for a stormwater pipe that will require a closure of the westbound golf cart lane on Bichara Boulevard northwest of the intersection of US 441 and Bichara Blvd near the Wendy's restaurant. Golf carts will be merged temporarily into automobile traffic before returning to the golf cart lane. The closure will begin Friday, October 6, 2023 and will continue indefinitely until stormwater restoration is completed as soon as possible. Please pay attention to the flow of traffic and use caution when approaching the lane merge. 


#### **How Do I Order a Guest Pass Online?**

### **IRRIGATION SYSTEM FLUSHING:**DISTRICTS 5-8



In April 2023, our Utilities Operations and Maintenance contractor (Jacobs) began flushing the Villages Water Conservation Authority (VWCA) irrigation system located in Districts 5-8. Flushing prevents the accumulation of small particles and build-up, which can lead to plugging issues in our irrigation system. Due to the size of the VWCA system, the area has been divided into 90 distinct flushing zones. Once started, this project will take approximately 50 weeks to work through all 90 zones.



As the flushing takes place, you will see the Jacobs team opening fire hydrants and flushing irrigation lines only into the roadway. Work hours will be from 8 am to 5 pm. Information will be updated regularly on the District's website on when you can expect to see the Jacobs team in action in your area. Please continue to check the Weekly Bulletin or the What's Happening page on DistrictGov.org for updates.

This maintenance work will not have any effects on your drinking water quality nor pressure. This is a proactive effort to maintain your irrigation system.

The safety of residents and contractor personnel is of the utmost importance. We are requesting everyone to abide by all barricades and warning signs and to avoid the active work area for anything other than access to your property.


