

Fall is now wrapping up and winter is almost here! The weather is changing, the time is changing and soon the year will be changing! While here in Florida we don't have many changing colors with each passing season, we do have something else that signifies the changing seasons — Muhly grass is blooming! These grasses start blooming every fall and their pink and white color varieties really make our landscape beds pop. Speaking of making the landscape beds pop, its that time of year for the first pine straw applications of the season. Not only does it make the landscape look great, it also feeds the plants and trees as it slowly breaks down.

FUN FACT

Fun fact: this year we will be applying 50+ thousand bales of pine straw on our 36 golf courses!

You should start to notice in a month or so that the overseed on the tee boxes will be germinating. This year the overseed will be a little lighter than normal only seeing one or two tee boxes per hole if any at all. While the overseed is great for holding up to traffic it also takes additional water and fertilizer to manage, which is ideal for grass that is meant to only be seasonal.

Churchill Greens is finally open! The renovation went smoothly and we were able to open on Wednesday, November 1st. Be on the lookout for further information on Belmont, Hilltop and Briarwood as they will not be far behind!



We are continuing our rest and rehab closures to give some of our more played courses, giving them a much needed break as well as giving our teams some time to do additional maintenance. 

The following items can be placed in your regular household waste pick-up:

- Lamps
- Plastic Chairs
- Ceiling fans (blades must be removed)
- Brooms
- Pallets
- Carpeting and/or padding (No larger than 4' x 4' & less than 40 lbs.)

A Bulk Item Pick-Up will need to be scheduled for larger items such as:

- Microwaves and small kitchen appliances
- Office chairs/desk chairs/kitchen chairs
- 2-burner grills
- Flat-screen TVs
- Ironing boards
- Electronics (computers, stereo

equipment, monitors etc.)

- Furniture (oversized chairs, mattresses, box springs, etc.)
- Appliances (washer, dryer, dishwasher, refrigerator)
- Lawn Mowers
- Exercise Equipment
- Remodeling debris generated by the homeowner <u>ONLY</u> (sinks, toilets, carpeting, lumber etc.)
 <u>All Contractors are required</u> to remove all debris from their jobs. This includes lawn maintenance, tree trimmers, builders, carpet installers, roofers, etc.



Lithium-ion batteries supply power to many kinds of devices including smart phones, laptops, e-scooters and e-bikes, e-cigarettes, smoke alarms, toys, and even cars. If not used correctly, or if damaged, these batteries can catch on fire or explode.

The problem

- These batteries store a large amount of energy in a small amount of space.
- Sometimes batteries are not used the right way; batteries not designed for a specific use can be dangerous.
- Like any product, a small number of these batteries are defective. They can overheat, catch fire, or explode.

Safety Tips

- Purchase and use devices that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory.
- Always follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- Only use the battery that is designed for the device.
- Put batteries in the device the right way.
- Only use the charging cord that came with the device.
- Do not charge a device under your pillow, on your bed, or on a couch.
- Do not keep charging the device or device battery after it is fully charged.
- Keep batteries at room temperature when possible. Do not charge them at temperatures below 32°F (0°C) or above 105°F (40°C).
- Store batteries away from anything that can catch fire.

Signs of a Problem

Stop using the battery if you notice these problems: odor, change in color, too much heat, change in shape, leaking, or odd noises. If it is safe to do so, move the device away from anything that can catch fire. Call **9-1-1**.

Battery Disposal

- Do not put lithium-ion batteries in the trash.
- Recycling is always the best option.
- Take them to a battery recycling location or contact your community for disposal instructions.
- Do not put discarded batteries in piles.

Charging an E-bike

Charge your battery in a flat, dry area away from children, direct sunlight, liquids, tripping hazards, and in a location where the e-bike is not at risk of falling.

Wildwood Police Offer Holiday Crime Prevention Tips

With holiday festivities in full swing, Wildwood officials are reminding residents to be alert and reduce risks related to seasonal crime trends.

"We typically see a spike in property and auto theft at this time of year, consistent with other jurisdictions across the state and country," said Police Chief Randy Parmer. "It's an unfortunate truth that increases in shopping, traveling, and socializing present abundant opportunities for criminals to take advantage of citizens. Fortunately, there are some simple steps everyone can take to deter crime."

As a minimum, Parmer recommends the following:

- Stay alert. Residents should be on the lookout for dubious persons and activity and call 911 if they see something that looks suspicious.
- Never leave packages in plain sight. Lock up purchases in the trunk when shopping and promptly bring in all deliveries. Use the shipper's tracking feature to determine when packages will arrive so they are not left outside in view.
- Always lock vehicles and remove the keys. This applies when parking briefly to run into a building for a few minutes. Criminals generally seek the path of least resistance, particularly unlocked cars with keys left in them.
- Keep all doors locked at home, whether or not inside. This includes closing and locking garage doors, another easy target for perspective thieves.
- Take steps to make the house look occupied when away. Putting various room lights on timers, preventing newspapers from piling up, and having a locked vehicle in the driveway help deter potential property crimes.

"These are good habits all year round," Parmer added. "Many of the calls we respond to could be prevented by simply following these practices."

According to 2022 data, property crimes in Wildwood outweigh crimes against persons by more than ten to one in a city that enjoys an exceptionally low violet crime rate. To learn more, visit https://data.wildwood-fl.gov/.


Project Description

The historic Moving Florida Forward Infrastructure Initiative (fdot.gov/movingfloridaforward) is allowing the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to advance much-needed improvements to Interstate 75 (I-75) in Central Florida, with construction anticipated to begin in spring 2025.

The I-75 Improvements projects are located between State Road (S.R.) 44 in Sumter County and S.R. 326 in Marion County, covering approximately 30 miles. The improvements include the addition of an auxiliary lane in each direction and interchange improvements at S.R. 326 and S.R. 40.

An auxiliary lane is an extra lane connecting the on and off ramps between two consecutive interchanges that reduces congestion by giving drivers more space and time to merge safely.

The I-75 improvements are currently being evaluated under two separate Project Development and Environment (PD&E) studies. I-75 South begins south of S.R. 44 and ends at S.R. 200. I-75 North begins at S.R. 200 and ends at S.R. 326.

Road Closure

Updated 10/9/2023

District Property Management will be performing restoration for a stormwater pipe that will require a closure of the westbound golf cart lane on Bichara Boulevard northwest of the intersection of US 441 and Bichara Blvd near the Wendy's restaurant. Golf carts will be merged temporarily into automobile traffic before returning to the golf cart lane. The closure will begin Friday, October 6, 2023 and will continue indefinitely until stormwater restoration is completed as soon as possible. Irrigation Line Repair

Updated 11/28/2023

Due to a needed repair to our irrigation system, the multi-modal path north of Belvedere Blvd at the Village of Bonnybrook entrance will be closed Monday, December 4, 2023 for up to three days while the work is completed. Residents should use the Laurel Manor and Rainey Trail tunnels to avoid the area during this time. The safety of our residents and construction personnel is of the utmost importance. We are requesting everyone to abide by all barricades and warning signs and to avoid the active construction area. Thank you for your cooperation and patience while the repair is underway. IRRIGATION SYSTEM FLUSHING: DISTRICTS 5-8



In April 2023, our Utilities Operations and Maintenance contractor (Jacobs) began flushing the Villages Water Conservation Authority (VWCA) irrigation system located in Districts 5-8. Flushing prevents the accumulation of small particles and build-up, which can lead to plugging issues in our irrigation system. Due to the size of the VWCA system, the area has been divided into 90 distinct flushing zones. Once started, this project will take approximately 50 weeks to work through all 90 zones.



As the flushing takes place, you will see the Jacobs team opening fire hydrants and flushing irrigation lines only into the roadway. Work hours will be from 8 am to 5 pm. Information will be updated regularly on the District's website on when you can expect to see the Jacobs team in action in your area. Please continue to check the Weekly Bulletin or the What's Happening page on DistrictGov.org for updates.

This maintenance work will not have any effects on your drinking water quality nor pressure. This is a proactive effort to maintain your irrigation system.

The safety of residents and contractor personnel is of the utmost importance. We are requesting everyone to abide by all barricades and warning signs and to avoid the active work area for anything other than access to your property.

county code enforcement, etc.; however, this is not required. The Committee meets weekly, on Wednesdays at 8 AM for approximately 2-4 hours.


