Christmas Tree Collection



Residents of Districts 1-11

If you live in Districts 1–11 in the Sumter County, Marion County or Fruitland Park portions of The Villages, discarded live Christmas trees can be placed at the curb and will be collected with your regular household trash on your designated day. The trees must follow the procedures for yard waste. Tree limbs and branches may not exceed five (5) feet in length, five (5) inches in diameter, or exceed 40 pounds.

Artificial trees should be taken apart and placed curbside in sections and will be collected with your regular household trash on your designated day. If you have any questions please contact sanitation at 352-748-0109.

Residents of Districts 12-14 and Middleton-A:

If you live in Districts 12–14 or Middleton-A, live and artificial trees can be placed at the curb and will be collected with your regular household trash on your designated day. If you have any questions, please contact the Utilities Department at 352-750-0000.

Residents of the unincorporated Lake County portion of The Villages:

If you live in the unincorporated Lake County portion of The Villages, live trees can be placed at the curb on your assigned yard waste day and must be in 4' lengths and no more than 6" in diameter. To discard artificial trees, please call Lake County Solid Waste to schedule a bulk pick-up at 352-343-3776.

Residents of the Town of Lady Lake:

If you live in the Town of Lady Lake, live and artificial trees can be placed at the curb and will be collected with your regular household trash on your designated day. If you have any questions, please contact Waste Management at 352-787-4416.

Holiday Decoration Policy

If your Village plans on decorating the Gate House or Village/Villa Entry sign for any of the upcoming holidays, the District Boards have adopted a Holiday Decoration Policy. This excludes postal stations. Prior to installation, residents must submit a design application to District Property Management (DPM) and sign the Activity Release of Liability. Sanitation Collection Guidelines

In The Villages

- All Household Solid Waste and Yard Waste is picked up twice a week—same time, same truck, all together!
- All household waste should be placed in sealed tall kitchen trash bags or 20-30 gallon trash bags (any color with the exception of red, which is used for medical waste).
- All materials can be placed in the same bag, no need to sort!
- The trash bags should be left at the end of your driveway, no garbage cans are allowed (they will be disposed of with the household waste).
- Each bag should weigh no more than forty (40) pounds.
- Bags must be placed for collection before 6 AM on your collection day or the night before (no sooner than 5 PM).
- Wrap broken glass/sharp objects in newspaper and put them where they can't cause injury.
- Limbs & branches should be bundled and tied and may not exceed 5" in diameter, 5' in length or exceed 40 pounds.

From time to time we are asked "What does Community Watch really do?" By visiting the pages linked above, you can see all the duties and responsibilities that are taken on by Community Watch. Depending on the division, Community Watch has a wide range of services that we provide every day. We strive to do the best possible job in all the services that we offer.

The Community Watch staff that residents come in contact with the most are the Gate Attendants that you see when you come into The Villages. Their duties include welcoming residents and visitors, regulating traffic

at the gates, assisting residents and quests with directions and much more.

Community Watch Patrol Drivers are the next most visible as they drive the Community Watch vehicles around each and do security checks at postal stations, pools and District Offices. They also assist local law enforcement with traffic accidents and vehicle breakdowns. They assist with searching for lost residents, respond to service calls for assistance from residents, observe and report all maintenance issues they come across and much more. Dispatchers are online 24 hours a day, every day, and are ready to assist anyone who calls. Dispatchers assist with searching for missing residents, documenting all radio and telephone calls and more. Dispatchers also serve as an after-hours link to all District Offices.

Community Watch always works to provide a safe community for residents of The Villages by keeping a watchful eye around the clock. This is our mission statement that we stand by and work to uphold.

As you deck the halls this holiday season, be fire smart. A small fire that spreads to a Christmas tree can grow large very quickly.



PICKING THE TREE

 Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched.



PLACING THE TREE

- Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" from the base of the trunk.
- Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights.
- Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit.
- Add water to the tree stand. Be sure to add water daily.



LIGHTING THE TREE

- Use lights that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory. Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.
- Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.



Get rid of the tree after Christmas or when it is dry. Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the home or garage, or placed outside against the home.

Check with your local community to find a recycling program.

Bring outdoor electrical lights inside after the holidays to prevent hazards and make them last longer.

FACTS

- ! Almost one third of home Christmas tree fires are caused by electrical problems.
- Although Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur, they are more likely to be serious.
- A heat source too close to the tree causes more than **one in every five** of the fires.

Updated 10/9/2023

District Property Management will be performing restoration for a stormwater pipe that will require a closure of the westbound golf cart lane on Bichara Boulevard northwest of the intersection of US 441 and Bichara Blvd near the Wendy's restaurant. Golf carts will be merged temporarily into automobile traffic before returning to the golf cart lane. The closure will begin Friday, October 6, 2023 and will continue indefinitely until stormwater restoration is completed as soon as possible. IRRIGATION SYSTEM FLUSHING: DISTRICTS 5-8



In April 2023, our Utilities Operations and Maintenance contractor (Jacobs) began flushing the Villages Water Conservation Authority (VWCA) irrigation system located in Districts 5-8. Flushing prevents the accumulation of small particles and build-up, which can lead to plugging issues in our irrigation system. Due to the size of the VWCA system, the area has been divided into 90 distinct flushing zones. Once started, this project will take approximately 50 weeks to work through all 90 zones.



As the flushing takes place, you will see the Jacobs team opening fire hydrants and flushing irrigation lines only into the roadway. Work hours will be from 8 am to 5 pm. Information will be updated regularly on the District's website on when you can expect to see the Jacobs team in action in your area. Please continue to check the Weekly Bulletin or the What's Happening page on DistrictGov.org for updates.

This maintenance work will not have any effects on your drinking water quality nor pressure. This is a proactive effort to maintain your irrigation system.

The safety of residents and contractor personnel is of the utmost importance. We are requesting everyone to abide by all barricades and warning signs and to avoid the active work area for anything other than access to your property.


